



GOFFS OPEN TO PUBLISHING TIMES BUT MIXED RESPONSE FROM BREEZE-UP FRATERNITY



Brendan Holland: 'Publishing times will be to the detriment of this industry.' | Tattersalls

Henry Beeby has opened the door to Goffs embracing the publication of official times and other data at its newly slated breeze-up sale at Naas racecourse next year but admitted that such a move was unlikely to be met with universal approval from the breeze-up fraternity.

No consignor would be more staunchly against the re-introduction of official times at the breeze-up sales in Europe than Brendan Holland. The Grove Stud operator says official times would create an increased reliance on the clock and would ultimately drive down clearance rates at the breeze-up sales.

"I am and always have been against the publication of official times," Holland explained. "There is a large cohort of people who buy breeze-up horses based on their intuition, experience from buying off certain vendors and ability to interpret a horse's breeze, action and pedigree without the benefit of times or regardless of a horse's time. If times were made public, a lot of those guys' hands would become tied."

ARABIAN CROWN IN COMMAND IN THE CLASSIC TRIAL By Tom Frary

Last seen winning the G3 Zetland S. in commanding fashion at Newmarket in October, Godolphin's **Arabian Crown (Fr)** (Dubawi {Ire}--Dubai Rose {GB}, by Dubai Destination) furthered his Derby claims with a return win in Friday's G3 Sandown Classic Trial. Sent off the 5-6 favourite for the 10-furlong blue riband prep, the €600,000 Arqana Deauville August graduate was quickly to the fore under William Buick and already held a clear advantage at the top of the straight. Never seriously troubled from there, one of the key Derby hopefuls for Charlie Appleby maintained the gallop to score by 3 1/4 lengths from **Macduff (GB)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}).

Appleby's assistant Alex Merriam said, "He has got to be in the Derby mix now and obviously there are a few other irons in the fire, but I suppose he has to be the main one at the minute. We'll see how he comes out of the race and if he goes anywhere, it will probably be Chester—the Dante is a bit close to Epsom. I think experience—wise, as you can see there, he's quite professional already. We've not had a Dubawi win the Derby yet, but fingers crossed we will get there eventually." Cont. p7

Holland added, "A lot of the people that these guys are buying for don't attend the sales in person. If they are looking on and see that their agent has bought them something that has come

101st on the sheet, what's the chance they turn around and ask, 'any chance you can buy me one of the top 50 instead?'

"It would make things very difficult for those people. The publication of official times is one of the main reasons why the clearance rate is significantly lower in America compared to Europe. Everyone acknowledges that you need to breeze well to sell well. But breezing well and breezing fast is not necessarily the same thing.

"If you look at the top 20 times from Donny, there was a

significant variation between how each horse sold. The whole thing is much more nuanced than just breezing fast and, if we make the times public, that then becomes the winning post and it will be to the detriment of this industry."

Of the horses who clocked in the top 20 on the unofficial times sheet at the Goffs Breeze-Up Sale, 17 made six figures, with nine of those selling for £200,000 or more. Only three of the top 20

horses on times failed to break the six-figure mark. For context, there were 28 horses who cleared six figures at Doncaster.


Unlike Holland, experienced breeze-up practitioners Mickey Cleere and Joanna Morgan-whose daughter Katie McGivern sold the £420,000 top lot filly by Havana Grey (GB) at Doncaster-say that they would welcome the publication of times.

But one man who doesn't rely on a stopwatch is Highflyer's Anthony Bromley. Along with Alan King, it was Bromley who signed for the brilliant stayer

Trueshan (Fr) (Planteur {Ire}) for just 31,000gns at the Tattersalls Guineas Breeze-Up Sale in 2018 after the horse posted one of the slowest times. Cont. p4

While Bromley conceded that the crux of a breeze-up sale is how fast a horse breezes, he defied anyone to determine the best horse from each sale on the clock alone, pointing to the unseasonal weather at the Craven and Donny sales as just another example of a different piece to be added to the jigsaw puzzle that is selecting horses.

Bromley said, "What fun we all had at the Craven when we had biblical weather conditions and some of the lasers that were tasked with timing the breeze fell over. I found it immensely amusing. The buyers must be some sort of geniuses to have worked out what the fastest horses at the Craven were because, for four hours, we had a headwind, a tailwind, a furious crosswind about halfway through the breeze where the cameraman couldn't even hold the camera and, to top it all off, there were hailstones. If you are telling me that the fastest time clocked at the Craven is actually the fastest horse, I'd think it's very hard to work that out. There could have been 20 others that, if the conditions had been different, would have clocked fastest on any given day.

"I look at the times--literally to cross off the ones who have clocked. There is no point in me wasting time, effort and vettings on those horses because they do make six figures."

"If I haven't got six figures to spend, which I don't, I don't waste my time looking at them," Bromley added. "I am not decrying times because they are relevant but there are so many other factors involved when buying from the breeze-up sales. But outside of that top 25 per cent, I thought there was a lot of value to be had at the Craven and at Doncaster. My overview of the sales the past two weeks has been feast or famine. We've

had the post-Covid honeymoon period--over jumps and on the Flat--but we are now entering a period of correction. The top 25 per cent is absolutely flying. It has never been healthier, but the rest of it, it's a tough gig. There were a lot of horses who didn't make 10 grand at Donny and we know it costs more than that to get a yearling prepared for the breeze-ups. It's worrying."

Despite the shakiness to the middle market at the Craven and at Doncaster, Beeby says he is convinced that there is a strong demand for another breeze-up sale in Ireland [to go with Tattersalls Ireland] and that the response to his Naas project from many of the top consignors has been positive.

That sale will take place in June 2025 and is likely to be a select offering of back-end types. One thing that is not set in stone, however, is whether or not official times and data will be published but Beeby says he is open to such an idea.

He explained, "It could work. At this stage, I certainly wouldn't dismiss the use of technology in some form or another but we would bow to what the consignors want. If we don't have the key consignors on board and they think it's a bad idea, then it's a waste of time. Various knowledgeable, experienced and respected breeze-up people wouldn't disagree with technology being readily available but, quite how that manifests, it remains to be seen. But I wouldn't dismiss it. Doing something slightly different could be something worth looking at." Cont. p6



Doing something different is exactly what Cleere plans for next year. Despite selling an Ardad (Ire) filly at Doncaster for £100,000, Cleere pointed to the rising costs and lack of a middle market as increasingly difficult hurdles to navigate.

He explained, "To be honest, the fun has gone out of the whole breeze-up game for me. It's less enjoyable, for sure. The costs are so high and you can be left fairly wounded after a sale. I was talking to another breeze-up consignor this morning and he agreed that a lot of good horses are going to get missed with the way it's gone. I'd be all for the publication of times. The more information out there, the more ways you can sell a horse.

"But it's gone very hard. Costs have gone up and there doesn't seem to be a middle market there. I'm going to have to reevaluate things strongly for next year. It's okay if you get into the top bracket but, for some stupid reason that you don't, you miss out. The falls are becoming increasingly hard to avoid. It takes very little for a horse not to breeze like you thought he might but the buyers are becoming less forgiving. I'll definitely have fewer horses to breeze next year."

Morgan agrees. While her daughter recorded her best day in a sale ring by netting £420,000 for her Havana Grey filly to Anthony Stroud, Morgan acknowledged that the lack of a middle market is becoming increasingly worrying.


She said, "I was disappointed by the lack of northern trainers at Donny. Years ago at Donny, you'd have all the northern trainers there. There was none of that sort of activity this year. It was very cut throat. Even go back to the Craven, alright there were big figures there, but a lot of lads lost money there as well. It's become very hard to sell horses at the middle market."

Holland summarised that the breeze-up sphere, which has produced top-notchers like Vandeek (GB), Native Trail (GB) and Eldar Eldarov (GB) in the past couple of years alone, is becoming a victim of its own success with the high concentration of valuable yearlings bought to go down that route.

He said, "The breeze-up game is in many ways becoming a victim of its own success. The consignors who have been successful in the past number of years are having to spend more money on yearlings, so they are becoming more exposed to risk. As a consequence of more money being spent on yearlings to go breezing, it is only natural that there is going to be more success in the sector.

"The one thing I took away from the Craven and from Doncaster was that it was as competitive as ever at the top end. People have seen what quality horses you can buy at the breeze-ups--it is a realistic ambition to go and buy a Royal Ascot or Classic winner from these sales."

Holland added, "However, when you get into the middle and the bottom, that reflects the economic state of the country. The domestic market--for National Hunt and Flat--has been healthier in the past. I don't see a collapse in the market but I'd have a certain realism.

"We'd an 80% clearance rate at Doncaster which, at one stage during the sale, looked as though it would be a miracle to achieve [due to the amount of horses being bought back by the vendors]. But the fact that 50 of the sales at Doncaster were private sales reflected the lack of competition in the sales ring."

Bromley shared that, oftentimes, the stiffest competition he faced for a horse at the Craven or at Doncaster was from the vendor rather than a fellow agent. Beeby concluded that 50 private sales at the Goffs Breeze-Up Sale tells its own story about the middle market but insisted that no stone was left unturned in attracting buyers.

He said, "When you look back on any sale, the first thing you think about is, 'who did we miss?' Of course we'd have liked more people there. We were pleased with the sale. By the same token, we recognise that 50 private sales tells a bit of a story. It was hard work at certain levels of the market. Yes, the top was very strong but we had as broad a buying bench than we have seen at any breeze-up so far. We worked very hard in the Middle East, Scandinavia and Italy with direct market visits there and they paid dividends."

Beeby added, "All sales rely on the vendors but the professionalism of the consignors at the breeze-up sales is a joy to behold. They are an amazing bunch of people who do it. The commitment and the nerve that they have to flip those horses is extraordinary. The good ones make a lot of money but there are plenty who slip through the cracks and the consignors dust themselves off and go again. I am always in awe of them. They have made the breeze-up market what it is."

William Buick was impressed. "He is very straightforward and he showed that last year. He just kept on improving last year, so let's hope he can keep doing the same. Charlie was very keen to go forward today but we were also very happy to sit off the pace if there was a strong pace. As it turns out, he has a big stride and he likes to use it and he changed gear two and a half out and attacked the hill, so it was a very nice performance."

Ralph Beckett said of Macduff, "He's a very straightforward horse and Rossa [Ryan] felt he had enough in the tank to tackle the winner, but the ground just counted against him. He does have a sort of fast-ground pedigree, so that ties in. We'll see how he trains in the next few weeks and Barry [Mahon] is not

keen to rule out Epsom and neither am I. We'll see how he trains in the coming weeks and how the trials go and then see how we feel about it."

Dubai Rose, who captured the Listed Kolner Stuten-Trophy as well as the Swiss Derby over a mile and a half, is also responsible for the dual G2 Prix de Royallieu winner and G1 Prix Vermeille third The Juliet Rose (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}), Dubawi's listed-winning Everest Rose (GB) and the dual listed-placed Pocketfullofdreams (Fr) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}). She is kin to the G2 Pretty Polly S. winner Hanami (GB) (Hernando {Fr}), whose progeny include the G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial and G3 Ballysax S.-placed Regent Street (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

Among Dubai Rose's other half-siblings is another German listed scorer in Hernando's Soho Rose (Ire), who produced the G1 Prix de Royallieu heroine Sea La Rosa (Ire) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) and her G2 Great Voltigeur S. and G3 Bahrain Trophywinning full-brother Deauville Legend (Ire), as well as the group 3-placed Dean Street Doll (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}). CHARYN ON TOP IN THE SANDOWN MILE

Building on his return success in the Listed Doncaster Mile last month, Nurlan Bizakov's **Charyn (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}) continued the momentum in Friday's G2 Sandown Mile. Third in the G1 St James's Palace S. and Sussex S. last term, having annexed the 2022 G2 Criterium de Maisons-Laffitte, the 9-4 favourite was positioned with one behind early by Silvestre De Sousa. Staying on strongly as the smooth-travelling **Poker Face (Ire)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) ran out of steam inside the last 50 yards, the grey had 1 1/4 lengths to spare over that rival at the line, with a neck back to the high-class veteran **Lord North (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) in third.

"He was a good winner on the line and although it took him a while to get there and get on top, it's a tough track and the ground is holding and it's hard work," trainer Roger Varian said. "He's always been a genuine horse and looking back to last year, although he didn't win, he contested the biggest races and wasn't disgraced. He looks to have stepped up a level this year and hopefully he can continue. He carries a lot of condition and I always think he needs a run, but he's got a great constitution and he's finding plenty on the track."

"I think we will really find out how much he has improved when he goes into group one company next time," he added. "He's entered in the Lockinge and that looks the obvious place to go, it's three weeks from now. Winning this race and winning at Doncaster, he deserves to take his chance there. It will be tougher again than today, but Silvestre said we could step up in trip one day as well. He deserves to be in the Lockinge and deserves to be in the Queen Anne."

OKEECHOBEE REGISTERS GAME GORDON RICHARDS WIN By Sean Cronin

Juddmonte's 5-year-old gelding **Okeechobee (GB)** (Time Test {GB}--Scuffle {GB}, by Daylami {Ire}), who was blighted by enough niggles to write off the entirety of last year, returned from a 550-day break to finish second in this month's Listed Magnolia S. at Kempton and stepped forward in game fashion to claim a career high in Friday's G3 bet365 Gordon Richards S. at Sandown.

The 10-3 joint-second favourite, who garnered three from four sophomore starts in 2022, settled off the pace towards the rear in sixth for most of this 10-furlong heat. Coming under pressure to close with three furlongs remaining, Okeechobee bounded into a share of second passing the furlong pole and was driven out to overhaul Israr (GB) (Muhaarar {GB}) inside the final 100 yards and hold the late lunge of Desert Hero (GB) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) by a head. Ryan Moore was at his forceful best in the plate and extended his race-record haul to six, with all five prior wins coming for the Sir Michael Stoute stable.

"I thought he would go very close beforehand, but watching it was less enjoyable," said trainer Harry Charlton. "Turning in, Ryan [Moore] said they really kicked off the front, which we thought might happen, as it was a field full of stamina horses. He had quite a lot of ground to make up and Ryan was impressed with him from the three to the two to the one. He just got there and, like they sometimes do, he just leaned in, but it was impressive. He obviously ran a lovely race at Kempton the other day and was entitled to come on for that. He came here 10 kilos fitter and I think he can probably tighten again. That's only his sixth race and there's scope for more hopefully. Dare I say it, we might have to look at something like the [G1] Prix d'Ispahan or the [G1] Tattersalls Gold Cup next. It will be one of those two I suspect."

Reflecting on the effort of G1 St Leger third Desert Hero, rider Tom Marquand commented, "It was the perfect comeback run for him. I would have loved him to get his head in front, but he's been beaten by a good horse and it was a good reintroduction to racing for him. Everything went to plan and he pulled up well. No doubt we will be back up to a mile-and-a-half next and having some more fun with him."

CITY OF TROY FIRING ON ALL CYLINDERS AHEAD OF CLASSIC BID

City Of Troy, the odds-on favourite for the G1 Qipco 2,000 Guineas, pleased his connections in a gallop on Friday morning ahead of his Classic date at Newmarket on Saturday, May 4.

Unbeaten in three starts as a two-year-old, culminating with a dominant three-and-a-half-length victory in the G1 Dewhurst S. on the Rowley Mile in October, City Of Troy will be having his first run of the season in the 2,000 Guineas having skipped the trials.

It's a tried-and-tested route for Aidan O'Brien--the most successful trainer in the race's history with 10 wins--and City Of Troy is said to be in peak condition ahead of his return to Newmarket, having impressed in one of his final pieces of work at Ballydoyle.

Speaking to ITV Racing, Paul Smith, son of part-owner Derrick Smith, said, "He's in great form. He worked today and we're very happy with him. Dean [Gallagher, work rider] was delighted with him and Aidan was delighted with him. Fingers crossed he gets there in one piece, but it is all systems go.

"He's grown a little bit, you'll see that at Newmarket next week. He's got a beautiful temperament, he had that as a two-year-old and still has it now. He takes his work very well--he's just a joy to be around."

Smith was in no rush to commit to any plans beyond City Of Troy's run in the 2,000 Guineas, though he didn't rule out the possibility of tackling races on dirt with the son of US Triple Crown winner Justify.

"It [dirt racing] is a possibility," Smith added. "It's the old cliche of taking it a race at a time. We'll see how he does next week and go from there, perhaps to the Derby. We're looking forward to it."

Last term's G3 Munster Oaks third Thunder Roll made a stakes breakthrough in September's Listed Oyster S. before closing last term with an unplaced effort in ParisLongchamp's G1 Prix de Royallieu on Arc weekend and bounced back on seasonal return here to double her black-type tally with a battling display. The 3-1 favourite was settled back in fourth after racing on the front end passing the judge first time. Powering forward in the home straight to hit the front approaching the quarter-mile marker, she refused to yield thereafter and stayed on in game fashion to keep all challengers at bay.

"She was a nice filly last year and progressed well, but ran a bit below par in France when the ground was very fast," said Joseph O'Brien. "I thought she did well to win today's tactical race as she went to the front early and fought all the way to the line. It was a very good ride and hopefully she is progressive this year. There is no doubt she will be at her best when she has a bit of juice [in the ground] and I think she'll stick to a mile-and-a-half. There is the Group 3 Munster Oaks back here in June."

Thunder Roll is the fourth of six foals and one of two scorers out of a winning half-sister to stakes-winning G2 Lancashire Oaks and G3 Middleton S. placegetter Under The Rainbow (GB) (Fantastic Light), the dual Group 2-placed Starfala (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) and the dual Group 3-placed Sweeping Up (GB) (Sea The Stars {Ire}). Under The Rainbow is the dam of G3 Tattersalls Cup victor Luncies (GB) (Iffraaj {GB}) while descendants of Starfala include Group 3-winning G1 Pretty Polly S. runner-up Stay Alert (GB) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) and G2 Lillie Langtry S. and G2 Park Hill Fillies' S. victrix Sumo Sam (GB) (Nathaniel {Ire}). Dual Australian Champion Sire **Fastnet Rock (Aus)** (Danehill) has been pensioned from stallion duty, Coolmore Australia announced.

Bred by Linley Investments, the son of Piccadilly Circus (Aus) (Royal Academy) would go on to race for an ownership group and trainer Paul Perry. His best days on the racecourse were in 2005, where he won the G1 Lightning S. and G1 Oakleigh Plate in succession. Cont. p16

Fastnet Rock cont.

Named both Australian Champion Sprinter and Champion 3-Year-Old Colt that year, Fastnet Rock retired to stud with a mark of 19-6-7-2 and \$1,312,623 in earnings.

As a stallion, he was even better, earning Australian titles in 2012 and 2015. Internationally, he has sired 193 stakes winners (122 group). Of those, 43 have been at the highest level in both hemispheres, as he spent many seasons shuttling from his Coolmore Australia base to Coolmore Stud in Ireland.

Some of his best progeny have been fillies Avantage (Aus), an nine-time Group 1 winner in New Zealand, and four-time Group 1 winners Mosheen (Aus) and Atlantic Jewel (Aus). In the Northern Hemisphere, Fastnet Rock has sired the likes of three-time G1 Prix de la Foret heroine One Master (GB), dual hemisphere Group 1 winner Via Sistina (Ire), and G1 Champion S. and G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup victor Fascinating Rock (Ire).

As a broodmare sire, the 22-year-old has left 113 stakes winners (71 group). An even dozen of his daughters' foals are Group 1 winners anchored by decorated sprinter/miler Santa Ana Lane (Aus) (Lope De Vega {Ire}), and fellow top-level winners Zougotcha (Aus) (Zoustar {Aus}), G1 Yorkshire Oaks victress Warm Heart (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), and current Hong Kong star Russian Emperor (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

"Fastnet Rock has been a once-in-a-lifetime horse, and we are immensely grateful for the incredible journey he has taken us on. I hope he will enjoy a long and happy retirement here at Jerrys Plains," said Coolmore's Tom Magnier. "His legacy will endure for generations to come, and we look forward to seeing his influence continue to shape the future of the sport. His son Acrobat (Aus) was the fastest 2-year-old ever at Randwick over 1000m and if his first foals are anything to go by, we'll be hearing a lot more about him in the future."

GOLDEN SIXTY A TRUE GLOBAL SENSATION

HONG KONG, CHINA -- Follow this, if you will.

A filly bred in America and purchased for a very reasonable sum as a yearling is exported to Ireland, punches above her weight at the races and is sold to Australia for her second career. A few years after her arrival, she is covered there by a notable successful Northern Hemisphere shuttle stallion, the resulting foal makes trips through the sales ring in Australia and New Zealand and goes on to become arguably the best animal to ever look through a bridle in Hong Kong.

The bloodstock world really is a small place, isn't it?

Most everyone has followed the career of **Golden Sixty (Aus)** (Medaglia d'Oro), who makes what could be the final start of a history-making career in Sunday's G1 FWD Champions Mile at Sha Tin Racecourse. Fewer would be aware that his dam Gaudeamus (Distorted Humor), bred in Kentucky by Manganaro LLC, was nurtured through the early portion of her career by the legendary Jim Bolger, who acquired the daughter of the stakes-placed Leo's Lucky Lady--herself by 1977 American Triple Crown winner Seattle Slew--for just \$60,000 through the late Richard Galpin's Newmarket International agency at the 2005 Keeneland September Sale in Lexington.

"Well, it was purely pedigree first," Bolger explained earlier this week when asked what attracted him to the filly, whose sire had been represented just two years earlier by GI Kentucky Derby winner Funny Cide from his first crop to race. Cont. p17

Indeed, there was plenty to recommend the filly's catalogue page from a European perspective. Gaudeamus's granddam was Konafa (Damascus), runner-up in the G1 One Thousand Guineas in 1976, who excelled in the breeding shed, accounting for Proskona (Mr. Prospector), winner of group races in France and Italy; Keos (Riverman), a three-time group scorer and thrice placed in Group 1 company in France as well as a Group 2 winner in Germany; and, perhaps most significantly, Korveya

(Riverman), a Group 3 victress in France and later the dam of Group 1 winners Bosra Sham (Woodman, champion), Hector Protector (Woodman, champion) and Shanghai (Procida). Korveya would go on to top the 1998 Keeneland November Sale on a bid of then-record \$7 million while carrying to Woodman.

"I got somebody to look at her and the report was good, so we decided to go ahead with it," Bolger said of Gaudeamus. "As they say, she ticked all the boxes and she was a very good-looking mare. She had just about everything. There's nothing you would want to change about her. And she had a temperament to go with all the physical characteristics. We were happy with the price."

Gaudeamus (Gow-day-AH-mus), which loosely translated means 'let us rejoice,' was a quick study, Bolger said.

"Well, we had her broken when she got home around sometime in October, and by January she was well muscled up and she looked like one that could be early," he explained. "If memory serves, we ran her early in May and she won first time out."

Gaudeamus carried Kevin Manning to a one-length debut win over 19 other rivals going six furlongs in yielding ground at Naas in May 2006 and won a listed stakes over seven at the Curragh at the end of June. A close fourth in the G3 Anglesey S. in her first try at group level, she defeated Dimenticata (Ire) (Danetime {Aus}) for a career high in the G2 Debutante S. at Leopardstown. The latter would go on to finish runner-up to the Bolger-conditioned Finsceal Beo (Ire) (Mr. Greeley) in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas the following spring, with Gaudeamus well down the field in eighth in the penultimate start of her career.

"I never really got her where I wanted to get her to as a 3-year-old," Bolger said. "She didn't manage to win as a 3-year-old, but we felt she'd done plenty as a 2-year-old."

Taking Money Off The Table

As successful a breeder as he is a trainer, Bolger could easily have retained Gaudeamus for his broodmare band, but ultimately decided to let her go for reasons 'purely financial.'

And the second like me has to generate some revenue," he reasoned.

Sheamus Mills, a young bloodstock agent from Australia. Mills said that the mare's appeal was very clear.

"I've always been a big fan of Distorted Humor as a broodmare sire influence--in fact that whole Forty Niner sire line holds interest for me," Mills explained. "He had a good influence on the Australian market from fairly limited exposure [as a shuttle stallion].

"Combine that with Gaudeamus being a Group 2-winning 2-year-old and she was a fairly obvious one for the Australian market who love speed and precocity."

And talk about making your mark. Gaudeamus was Mills's very first purchase after going out on his own.

"I was ahead of the times as there was little interest in importing racing prospects in those days--something that became so commonplace shortly after I returned to Australia," Mills said.

Bolger recollected: "He [Mills] just came looking for her. We eventually agreed on the price. I think it was a little protracted, but it worked out in the end. And certainly worked out for him, and I was delighted for her."

Bolger reported that the deal was done for €500,000, and he had every confidence that Gaudeamus could become a significant broodmare.

He said: "She was the ideal type. As I said, you couldn't find fault with her. Her 2-year-old race record was good enough for any broodmare prospect."

Gaudeamus was bred to Pivotal (GB) to Southern Hemisphere time prior to her export to Australia. Having produced the listed-placed Igitur (Aus) (Helmet {Aus}) from her first few foals, Gaudeamus was purchased by Josh Hutchins Bloodstock for A\$160,000 (US\$123,776) at the 2015 Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale in foal to Medaglia d'Oro.

Gaudeamus was led out unsold on a bid of A\$75,000 at the same auction two years later, a decision that will be judged once and for all by the Australian bloodstock community in a month's time.

That's when Gaudeamus, in foal to dual Group 1 winner Home Affairs (Aus) (I Am Invincible {Aus}) (lot 761), and her yearling filly by Wootton Bassett (GB) (lot 586) go under the hammer as part of the unreserved dispersal of the Hutchins family's Element Hill at the National Broodmare Sale on Australia's Gold Coast.

Golden Sixty has carried the pedigree further afield, as he was hammered down for A\$120,000 at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale before being resold for NZ\$300,000 at the New Zealand Bloodstock Ready To Run Sale in 2017, where he was purchased by his current trainer Francis Lui for owner Stanley Chan. Twenty-six wins, including 10 at Group 1 level, and US\$21 million in prize money later, the end--apparently--is near.

Bolger, Mills Living Vicariously

For his part, Bolger downplays the role he has played in the career of Golden Sixty.

"It wasn't just me," he said. "I'm always conscious when somebody comes up with a good racehorse, that there are probably hundreds of people involved all down the years, and with one of them it might not be, as it turns out, at that particular time. So just about anybody who has a hand in making or causing such an animal to be born in the first place has a huge part in it. That's the nature of the business."

Added Mills: "It's been a lot of fun watching Golden Sixty develop. The main feeling is one of nostalgia, as Jim Bolger made me work hard to get that deal done and I'll always be grateful to my client Bob Scarborough for setting me on my path, as I think I was down to my last 10 or 20 quid when the news came through the deal was done!"

Bolger had the final word.

"Well, I'd like to say well done to everybody involved, both in Australia and Hong Kong. Obviously, they've managed Golden Sixty brilliantly. That's no mean achievement."

GOLDEN SIXTY'S REIGN AT THE MERCY OF THE RAIN by Alan Carasso

HONG KONG, CHINA -- According to the Hong Kong Observatory, the city's weather forecast agency, about 230 millilitres of rain had fallen between the first of the year and Apr. 25. Of that amount, fully 200 mls have been recorded since the first of this month and the vast majority of that has occurred this week, as rain--at times heavy enough to completely obscure the top of the Sha Tin straight course--thunder and lightning have been just this side of relentless.

The considerable precipitation has the connections of Hong Kong's three leading lights for Sunday's FWD Champions Day meeting a little concerned, maybe even more than a little.

Golden Sixty (Aus) (Medaglia d'Oro) is Hong Kong's three-time defending Horse of the Year and will try to win the G1 FWD Champions Mile for a record-extending fourth straight time in what many believe will be the final start of a truly remarkable career. After overcoming the 14 hole and belying a 224-day absence to win the G1 Longines Hong Kong Mile for a third time last December, his lead-up to Sunday's race has been suboptimal, including an injury scare that cast a fair amount of doubt on his very participation. He's been away for 139 days this time and has the underfoot conditions to deal with from gate seven, with Vincent Ho at the controls for the 31st time in his 31 starts.

"The barrier draw isn't a worry, only the weather will be," said trainer Francis Lui. "Now, he's very professional and he looks after himself. I think his condition has come up just in time."

Golden Sixty shows one race on rain-affected ground, a third to the at-home Russian Emperor (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the 2000-metre G1 Citi Hong Kong Gold Cup in 2022 when he was routinely ridden further back in the field. It's an effort that is best taken with a grain of salt.

Middleham Park Racing LX's **Brave Emperor (Ire) (Sioux**Nation) is one who would appear to enjoy easier conditions, as he is a perfect four-from-four on tracks listed as soft or heavy. The four-length winner of the G2 Vittoria di Capua in bottomless ground in Milan last November, the bay gelding showed he handles a sounder surface when holding off Cairo (Ire) (Quality Road) in the \$500,000 Irish Thoroughbred Marketing Cup in Qatar Feb. 17.

Trainer Archie Watson said in the immediate aftermath of that performance that the Champions Mile was the plan, and Arcwinning rider Luke Morris is looking forward to the challenge.

"He's had a nice break since Qatar and once we knew he could perform on a fast surface, the Champions Mile was always on the radar, so he's been prepared perfectly. We've got him exactly where we want him," Morris said.

Other logical challengers are **Voyage Bubble (Aus)** (Deep Field {Aus}), runner-up in the Hong Kong Mile and next-out winner of the G1 Stewards Cup, and **Galaxy Patch (Aus)** (Wandjina {Aus}), who is down in trip after just missing in the BMW Hong Kong Derby over 10 furlongs.

California Spangle In The Same Boat...or Ark

There are a few similarities between Golden Sixty and California Spangle (Ire) (Starspangledbanner {Aus}), who looks to add Sunday's G1 Chairman's Sprint Prize to previous elitelevel conquests in the Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup and the Al Quoz Sprint in Dubai. Each has drawn barrier seven in a field of 11 and like the champ, the underfoot conditions give connections some cause for pause.

"We will have to see, but I am not very confident and I prefer a good track," trainer Tony Cruz said. "You have got to know where you are because (on) a good track, we all know he can perform and we don't want a wet track to gamble on."

Despite heavy rains earlier in the week at Happy Valley, the Wednesday evening meeting was held over 'good' ground and depending on the timing of rain over the weekend, the quickdrying Sha Tin could ride quicker than anticipated.

"This track really is amazing compared to any track in the world," Cruz said. "No matter how much rain there is, it can turn out to be a very good track, still."

Though California Spangle is well clear on ratings, the two horses closest to him have form over easier ground. Moyglare Stud-bred Mad Cool (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}), eighth to the sidelined Lucky Sweynesse (NZ) (Sweynesse {Aus}) in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint in December, makes the short ship after narrowly saluting in the G1 Takamatsunomiya Kinen in yielding ground last month. Victor the Winner (Aus) (Toronado {Ire}) was a pacesetting third in that contest, three lengths adrift, and will be put into play early from gate two by Derek Leung.

Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's **Believing (Ire)** (Mehmas {Ire}) jets in for the ambitious George Boughey, with something to find with the race favourites. Winner of the G3 Prix Texanita at Chantilly last May, the 4-year-old was a close third in the G1 Sprint Cup at Haydock in September. She was last seen finishing in the last third of the field and well beaten in the G1 British Champions Sprint S. Oct. 21.

"She's got some form on softer going but, ideally, we'd have wanted it on the quicker side," her jockey Harry Bentley commented. "Ideally, we'd jump and sit close to the pace, if we can sit in a box-seat position we'd be very happy."

'Honour' Takes Different Path Into QE II

When **Dubai Honour (Ire)** (Pride of Dubai {Aus}) arrived into Hong Kong for last year's G1 FWD QE II Cup, it was on his way back home after a pair of cracking victories in Group 1 company in Australia. While he covered himself in glory when third to **Romantic Warrior (Ire)** (Acclamation {GB}) and **Prognosis (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}), he comes into this event off a visually impressive three-length success in the Listed Magnolia S. over the Kempton all-weather Apr. 1.

Dubai Honour's win in Australia's version of the Queen Elizabeth came over easy ground, and connections wouldn't mind the current weather pattern to hold on through the weekend.

"The rain keeps coming down, so that's kind of the thing we're most excited about," said exercise rider Issy Paul. "He's coming here a lot fresher, which is a big benefit. He feels great."

Romantic Warrior looks for his third straight QE II after once again winning the G1 Longines Hong Kong Cup and G1 Citi Hong Kong Gold Cup. James McDonald is on another hit-and-run mission this weekend for owner Peter Lau.

"We have never raced on yielding or soft before, so we don't know if it will be good or bad," Lau told South China Morning Post. "We are concerned but fingers crossed."

Prognosis has a bad habit of breaking slowly, and he'll want to be as close to perfect on Sunday, as there is little margin for error. That said, when things go his way, he is a top-class individual and his five-length romp in the G2 Kinko Sho at Chukyo six weeks ago makes him a proper threat.

Three of the last 10 runnings of the QE II have been taken by 4-year-olds exiting a win in the BMW Hong Kong Derby-including Romantic Warrior in 2022--as they try to prove their mettle against unrestricted and world-class competition. Massive Sovereign (Ire) (No Nay Never) has a chance to join a list that also features Vengeance of Rain (NZ), Designs on Rome (Ire) and Werther (NZ), and while leading jockey Zac Purton knows it won't be easy, he's also not willing to trade places with anyone.

"Obviously a massive job when he comes out of a Derby, so it's a good test for him to see where he is at and that's the exciting part about this stage of the season," the Australian said.

"Coming through the Derby he has gone against racing against 4-year-olds here in Hong Kong to going against some of the world's best."

T O ROYAL BIDS FOR FIRST TOP-LEVEL **SUCCESS IN TENNO SHO**

A bumper field has been declared for Sunday's G1 Tenno Sho (Spring), with 18 runners set to do battle over the 3,200-metre distance at Kyoto Racecourse. The race is run over a longer trip than any other Group 1 in the JRA calendar and staying was typically the name of the game last year when Justin Palace (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) ground his rivals into submission with a dominant performance under Christophe Lemaire.

Justin Palace is a notable absentee from this year's line-up, but the likes of **Deep Bond (Jpn)** (Kizuna {Jpn}) and **Silver Sonic (Jpn)** (Orfevre {Jpn}) are back for more having finished second and third, respectively, 12 months ago. Stamina certainly won't be an issue for either horse, though both need to bounce back from below-par efforts in the G2 Hanshin Daishoten last time. TO Royal (Jpn) (Leontes {Jpn}), on the other hand, looked better than ever when winning that race by five lengths, identifying himself as a leading contender as he tries to improve on his third-place finish in the 2022 edition of the Tenno Sho (Spring) when it was run at Hanshin.

"He was raring to run in the Hanshin Daishoten and the jockey had a lot of horse under him the whole way," said Atsushi Obayashi, assistant trainer to Inao Okada. "When he urged him on T O Royal responded with some very solid running."

Obayashi added, "Everything about his prep has gone smoothly. The competition will take a step up but there's nowhere this horse comes up short. He has come into his own now. He has ample stamina and with the condition he's in presently I think he has ample chance. I'm really looking forward to the race."

The placed horses from the Hanshin Daishoten, Warp Speed (Jpn) (Drefong) and Blow The Horn (Jpn) (Epiphaneia {Jpn}), are in opposition again, but it's a couple of four-year-olds who appeal as potentially the biggest dangers to TO Royal on Sunday, namely the Classic winners **Durezza (Jpn)** (Duramente {Jpn}) and Tastiera (Jpn) (Satono Crown {Jpn}), both horses owned by Carrot Farm Co Ltd.

Tastiera enjoyed his day in the sun when winning last year's G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) at Tokyo, but he was later no match for Durezza when the pair met in the G1 Kikuka Sho (Japanese St Leger) at this track. Durezza ran on willingly in the closing stages to win by three and a half lengths and trainer Tomohito Ozeki is cautiously optimistic of an improved showing on Sunday following his runner-up finish in the G2 Kinko Sho at Chukyo last time.

"The Kikuka Sho really took a lot out of him, so his second place in the Kinko Sho was in part due to the time needed to get him back to his best," said Ozeki. "He's still immature physically, too soft in places, too tight in others, so we had to prepare him for the race while being careful he doesn't tense up.

"On April 17 he worked under Keita Tosaki and alongside another horse. That horse could move so it was a good hard workout. He should have improved after that--he is definitely improving as he heads toward the Group 1. I can't say the distance is welcome, but with the way he's looking now, I think he'll be able to handle it."

On Tastiera, who finished down the field on his return to action in the G1 Osaka Hai at Hanshin, trainer Noriyuki Hori said, "Looking at his condition and his body, I still can't find a reason for him losing his last race. Looking at his last result, I can't really say how he'll do. I'll just keep my thinking cap on as we head in to this race."

Of the rest, the consistent Chuck Nate (Jpn) (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) isn't one to underestimate following his last-time-out victory in the G2 American Jockey Club Cup at Nakayama, while Savona (Jpn) (Kizuna {Jpn}) was only sixth in the Hanshin Daishoten but has some good efforts at Kyoto to his name, including when pushing Blow The Horn all the way in the G2 Nikkei Shinshun Hei H. here in January.



"I'm very, very happy with the work," trainer Todd Pletcher said.

SHOPPING SPREE CONTINUES: JOHN STEWART'S RESOLUTE BLOODSTOCK BUYS \$450K CO-TOPPERS AT KEENELAND APRIL

Led by matching \$450,000 co-toppers **Dana's Beauty** (Not This Time) and **Cheval de Guerre** (Caravaggio), John Stewart's Resolute Bloodstock purchased four lots for a total of \$1.172 million at Keeneland's April Selected Horses of Racing Age Sale on Friday, held following the final race of the Spring Meet. Resolute was the sale's leading buyer.

For the single-session auction, Keeneland sold 54 horses for \$3,940,000, for an average of \$72,963 and a median of \$38,500. With sales of \$1.544 million for 16 horses, ELiTE was the sale's leading consignor.

Keeneland sold 67 horses through the ring for \$6,743,000, good for an average of \$100,642 and a median of \$70,000, at last year's auction.

"We were specifically looking for some (Royal) Ascot horses and we picked up a couple broodmare prospects that can continue to race," Stewart said. "Keeneland always has great horses here, so it's a lot of good fun."

The 6-year-old mare Dana's Beauty, previously owned by Magic Oaks and trained by Joe Sharp, won Turfway Park's Latonia S. Mar. 23 over Friday's GIII Bewitch S. heroine Chop Chop (City of Light). Cont. p7



"I thought the move was very strong," Cox said. "Tarifa started just behind Gin Gin and they both finished up well together and galloped out strong. A good, solid move. We're looking forward to getting them ready for next Friday."

Other Oaks workers included: **Into Champagne** (Into Mischief), who completed five furlongs in 1:00 (11/25) for Ian Wilkes; **Thorpedo Anna** (Fast Anna) (five furlongs in :59.40 {3/25}); **Where's My Ring** (Twirling Candy) (four furlongs in :46.60 {5/68}); and **Manama Gold** (Star Guitar), who was withdrawn from Oaks consideration by trainer Todd Pletcher following her work.

"She worked OK this morning (half mile in :48.60), but she got real tired at the end of it," Pletcher said. "She looks like she has the makings of a good filly, but we're going to need some more time to work with her before she's ready to go. We won't be putting her in the Oaks."

ALL EYES ON THE CALIFORNIA GRASS FOR SATURDAY'S GRADED ACTION

In the calm before the storm that will be next weekend's GI Kentucky Derby, a lone pair of graded turf races offer opportunities for older horses on the West Coast Saturday.

Golden Gate Fields, whose closure was announced last year, offers the GIII San Francisco Mile S. A full field of 12 is set for the one-mile contest. While the race is open for 3-year-olds and up. the youngest runner in the field is the 4-year-old **Clovisconnection** (Vronsky). The class appears to be deepest amongst the 5-year-olds with the Phil D'Amato-trained Balnikhov (Ire) (Adaay {Ire}), who will be making his 13th straight graded-stakes start dating back to September 2022. The race's defending winner, Banikhov will have to again hold off the longshot third-place finisher from 2023 in II Bellator (Shackleford). Also of note will be the speedy Astronomer (Air Force Blue) who will be making his first start of the year for Simon Callaghan.

Further south at Santa Anita, older fillies and mares will also go one mile in the GIII Royal Heroine S. Reddam Racing homebred Stay and Scam (Square Eddie) will look to play catch me if you can. The 4-year-old has hit the board in nine of 11 starts, including wining two of her last three. Second after relinquishing the lead late in her first try over course and distance in the GIII Wilshire S. last out Apr. 4, the Doug O'Neill trainee will look to last this go round. Breaking just to her inside is the 5-year-old mare Uncorked (Aus) (Pierro {Aus}), an Australian invader making her first start for Phil D'Amato after a consistent career on the East Coast with Brittany Russell. Also entered for D'Amato is GII Megahertz S. winner Bellabel (Ire) (Belardo {Ire}). Continuing to try her hand on the turf for John Shirreffs is 'TDN Rising Star' Justique (Justify), who will be happy to see that Ruby Nell (Bolt d'Oro) is not an entry here after running behind that filly in four of her last five starts.



Comfortably racing in fourth against the fence as the group came down the stretch for the first time, Chop Chop followed a trio of runners, led by 5-2 shot Lovely Princess (Twirling Candy). Concepcion angled his runner out into the second of three turns, but remained in fourth up the backstretch. It wasn't until the field really bunched up into the

far turn through a mile in 1:39.34 that Chop Chop was given the green light, rushing up with an outside move to challenge race favorite and new leader Vergara. The pair turned for home together but Chop Chop got the first jump and opened up a winning advantage that was only challenged briefly by a closing Atomic Blonde (Ger).

"It's been a lot of ups and downs with her," winning trainer Brad Cox said. "We really liked her a lot as a 2-year-old. She was narrowly defeated here on the dirt in the (2022 GI) Darley Alcibiades. We really thought going into the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, she was going to win. I want to congratulate Mr. (Jerry) Bach (owner, Selective LLC) for keeping her in training. He thought about retiring her after last year but kept her in training, and I think today it paid off."

Pedigree Notes:

One of eight stakes winners and the third graded stakes winner for City of Light, Chop Chop is out of the unraced Giant's Causeway mare Grand Sofia, who RNA'd for \$875,000 at FTKNOV last fall. Grand Sofia herself is a half to GISW Rail Trip (Jump Start). Of her five foals, three have made the races and two have won including Chop Chop's 3-year-old half-sister Sweet Miss Maggie (Omaha Beach). Grand Sofia is represented by a 2-year-old Constitution filly, who brought \$400,000 as a

yearling at KEESEP last year and reported a colt from the first crop of Flightline this spring. She is back in foal to Constitution.

Hip 135 Cheval de Guerre brings a co-topping \$450,000 at Keeneland April | Keeneland


She is out of the winning City Zip mare City Siren and from the family of GI Preakness S. winner and sire Cloud Computing and GISW Halo America. Sporting a career record of 37-8-4-8 and earnings of \$428,167, Dana's Beauty was consigned by ELiTE, agent, as Hip 99.

"Her pedigree works really well in our system," said Gavin O'Connor, who signed the ticket. "(Resolute's) John (Stewart) himself loved the horse. She won nicely last time out. The long-range plans are to send her to (trainer) Mike Maker and try to just place her right. We'll probably start her fresh as a broodmare next year."

The 2-year-old colt Cheval de Guerre flashed sharp early speed and just got beat by a neck in his 5 1/2-furlong unveiling over the Keeneland turf Thursday. The first foal out of the winning Declaration of War mare Champagne Diet, he is from the family of GISWs Memories of Silver and Winter Memories. The \$22,000 KEESEP yearling was campaigned by owner/trainer Eddie Kenneally and Richard Seale. The sale's final offering, he was consigned by Kenneally Racing, agent, as Hip 135.

"I'm not really surprised. I was expecting a good number for the horse," said consignor and trainer Eddie Kenneally. "He did everything right, but was a little unlucky not to have won. He ran a good race. We had some good people on him and we're delighted to get it done. We've had a good little run with this horse in a short period of time."

After making a huge splash at the yearling and breeding stock sales in 2023, Stewart purchased the former Shadwell Stud property in Midway, Kentucky to launch Resolute Farm.

Stewart spent \$8.425 million on 13 yearlings at last year's Keeneland September sale and returned to the fall breeding stock sales at Fasig-Tipton and Keeneland where he once again opened his check book, purchasing 11 mares and weanlings for a total of \$17.35 million. The list included the two-time GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint winner Goodnight Olive (Ghostzapper), who brought \$6 million at Fasig-Tipton November.

Save the Trees (Preservationist), who stormed down the Keeneland stretch to win his career debut for the Estate of Brereton C. Jones and trainer Wayne Mackey Apr. 19, sold for \$335,000 to trainer Mike Maker. Consigned by Airdrie Stud, agent, as Hip 131, the 3-year-old gelding is out of the stakes-placed Forestry mare Canopy Lane. He was previously a \$23,000 KEESEP yearling.

"We liked him from day one, so we came here to buy him," Maker said. "We were at the races the day he broke his maiden; we were impressed by that. We tried to pursue him after that, but were unsuccessful, so we came here tonight to get him."

Meah/Loyd Bloodstock, agent, paid \$310,000 for 3-year-old filly **Watchtower** (Demarchelier {GB}), who is unbeaten in two races this year. ELITE, agent for Peter Brant's White Birch Farm, consigned Watchtower (Hip 79), who is out of the stakes-placed Exchange Rate mare Zloty and from the family of GSW & GISP Teeth of the Dog.

"She will go to California to (trainer) Richard Baltas," David Meah said. "We've had a lot of success together buying horses all over the world. She's a filly who will really fit California racing. She is tailor made for the Del Mar Oaks and the American Oaks. We were pleasantly surprised with the price."

KEENELAND CLOSES OUT SUCCESSFUL SPRING MEET

Keeneland's 2024 Spring Meet concluded Friday with all-sources wagering exceeding \$218 million, the third-highest handle in track history. Average daily purse money of \$1.16 million attracted Thoroughbred racing's top stables and jockeys, delivering 16 days of quality racing complemented by community and special events that offered family fun with a philanthropic mission.

"A big thanks to our horsemen and sponsors, the crowds who turned out daily on track and those who watched and wagered on Keeneland across the country," Keeneland President and CEO Shannon Arvin said. "We especially appreciate the cooperation of fans as we navigated the adjustments necessary to hold a race meet during construction of our new Paddock Building. We are proud this Spring Meet continued to offer the exceptional race-day experiences and traditions people know and love about Keeneland."

All-sources wagering (not including whole card simulcasting at Keeneland) for the Spring Meet, held Apr. 5-26, totaled \$218,741,501, a decrease of 2.5% from last spring's record \$224,348,745 for 15 days of racing.

On-track wagering totaled \$15,831,087 compared with \$15,844,092 in Spring 2023.

Wagering was boosted by a number of individual handle records. On Toyota Blue Grass Day, Apr. 6, all-sources handle for the 11-race card that featured five graded stakes totaled \$29,261,346, eclipsing the previous single-day wagering record of \$28,137,728 set in 2022. Single-race win/place/show wagering of \$2,576,663 on the Toyota Blue Grass shattered the 2019 record of \$2,068,406. The All Stakes Pick 5 ending with the Toyota Blue Grass handled \$1,696,981, breaking the 2022 record of \$1,539,098.

The Keeneland Turf Pick 3, a wager on the final three turf races daily, set a handle record of \$280,308 on Apr. 13 to best last Fall's mark of \$248,094. The wager paid a record \$56,593 on April 18.

The Daily Double wager established handle records twice during the Spring Meet: \$329,433 on opening Apr. 5 and \$470,988 on Apr. 13 to surpass the previous record of \$286,255 set Apr. 23, 2022. This Spring, Keeneland reduced the takeout on the Daily Double from 22% to 15%.

CHANNEL MAKER AMONG CLASS OF '24 CANADIAN HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

Eclipse and Sovereign Award winner Channel Maker (English Channel), who now resides at Old Friends Farm in Georgetown, Kentucky, is among the Thoroughbred inductees for the Class of 2024, the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame said in a release late Wednesday.

Across six categories--Male and Female Horse, Builder, Jockey, Trainer and Veteran--a 20-person election committee voted on the list of finalists.

Channel Maker was a stalwart MGISW gelding who amassed almost \$4 million in earnings over 56-career races--46 of which were graded North American ones.

The gelding was retired to Old Friends late last year by owners Adam Wachtel of Wachtel Stable, Gary Barber, R. A. Hill Stable and Reeves Thoroughbred Racing.

Joining the 9-year-old in the Hall of Fame will be Canadian Horse of the Year and MGISW Starship Jubilee (Indy Wind), racehorse owner and breeder Glen Todd, jockey Patrick Husbands, Channel Maker's original trainer Danny Vella and senior steward Richard Grubb.

The induction ceremony will take place Wednesday, Aug. 7. Details concerning ticket information will be released in early May.


