Metropolitan | Scoop Dyga

Scheduled 40 minutes after the fillies' Classic, Sunday's G1 Emirates Poule d'Essai des Poulains offered a dramatic contrast with a heavy downpour greatly affecting the aesthetics at ParisLongchamp and to an extent the ground also. In the event, the race was off 40 minutes *de retard* due to the thunderstorm before **Metropolitan (Fr)** (Zarak {Fr}--Alianza {GB}, by Halling) provided another surprise result on the afternoon by overcoming higher-profile peers at 24-1.

Unbeaten in two juvenile starts before finishing fifth in the course-and-distance G3 Prix de Fontainebleau last month, the Mario Baratti trainee who races for Peter R Bradley III and Scuderia Scolari was perfectly positioned by Alexis Pouchin in third having been drawn on the rail. Using the cutaway to get up the inside of **TDN Rising Star Alcantor (Fr)** (New Bay {GB}) with 150 metres remaining, the €78,000 Arqana Deauville October graduate stayed on to deny fellow outsider **Dancing Gemini (Ire)** (Camelot {GB}) by half a length, with Alcantor a short neck away in third. Ballydoyle's 13-10 favourite **Henry Longfellow (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) finished a never-threatening eighth.

Baratti, who had been assistant to Marco Botti before taking up a licence, was enjoying a maiden Classic success in France.

POULICHES GLORY FOR ROUHIYA

Before the storm, the finish to Sunday's G1 Emirates Poule d'Essai des Pouliches had a true 80s throwback feel to it, with the world-famous Aga Khan and Sangster silks involved at the death of the ParisLongchamp Classic. When the photo was taken, it was the former's distinguished livery that was in front sported by the 31-1 outsider Rouhiya (Fr) (Lope De Vega {Ire}--Rondonia {Ire}, by Raven's Pass), with the 45-1 shot Kathmandu (Ire) (Showcasing {GB}) failing by a head to bring the Sangster colours back into the winner's spot after one of Europe's monuments. Entering this with no previous black-type experience, the homebred was also at the considerable disadvantage of having to navigate stall 10 but duly overcame all to continue the fine form of the Francis-Henri Graffard stable in 2024.

"On his seasonal debut, I knew he was short of work so we were ready to accept defeat that day knowing he would improve," Baratti explained. "He finished well after being too far back and so I was encouraged. Not only has he improved fitnesswise, but also mentally and that showed today.

"He had a wonderful trip on the inside, that one draw was a gift from heaven and he was ready to deliver when it mattered. I am convinced he will stay further and he is in the [G1 Prix du] Jockey Club, but I am not certain he will run. My mentor Pascal Bary taught me that when a horse is doing well over a trip, change nothing. So we will discuss the future with the owners and decide.

"I won the German 2000 Guineas last year, but winning a French Classic is a whole different ball game! I work with a very good team of employees who are very passionate about what they do, so the groundwork has been laid down by all concerned."

Flashing talent from the outset when taking a mile maiden at Deauville's August Festival in style, he counted among the beaten that day the recent G3 Prix Noailles winner Calandagan (Ire) (Gleneagles {Ire}) before upstaging another Aga Khan talent in TDN Rising Star Elbaz (Fr) (Siyouni {Fr}) at Chantilly in September. Given the perfect ride on his reintroduction in the

Fontainebleau, he was ready to peak here and it could be that the torrential rain that intervened after the Pouliches played to his strengths. The winning time was nearly two seconds slower than the fillies' version and the first four home were colts who promise to stay further on pedigree.

For Peter Bradley, who bought into the winner following his debut, the result was momentous. "I've been at this a long time and have had some good horses, but a day like today is unimaginable," he said. "You will have to talk to the trainer, but someone mentioned Royal Ascot if he wins--it's possible and we will see how he comes out of this race. We knew we had a very good horse and I think he proved he is a champion."

Dancing Gemini's trainer Roger Teal has his eye on another Classic following the staying-on effort of the runner-up. "He ran a blinder and we've always had confidence in him," he said. "I thought we were going to get there and he's done everything right, the winner just got a few lengths on us turning in and got a good run up the rail. He hasn't had a prep run and will benefit for this race. If he can come forward from this, then you would like to think there is a big day in him. We're going to have to have a chat and he's in both the English and French Derby. He's bred to stay, but he's also got a lot of speed, he's got a good kick."

Edouard de Rothschild said of Alcantor, "I'm delighted with the performance--he has run his race. Everything went wrong in the Craven, he didn't like the straight course there, but he showed his true form today and will improve off that. So the logic is to go now for the Prix du Jockey Club."

Aidan O'Brien was not dissatisfied with the efforts of Diego Velazquez and Henry Longfellow, with the former running perhaps the best Derby trial of all his 3-year-olds so far this term. "My two horses ran well, but the race lacked pace so we're looking to the future now," he said. "The soft ground throughout the spring hasn't helped. I think Diego Velazquez will stay at least 12 furlongs."

Metropolitan is out of the unraced Alianza, a half-sister to the Listed Marygate S. runner-up Boater (Ire) (Helmet {Aus}) and daughter of Cercle D'Amour (Storm Cat). She is in turn a full-sister to the Listed Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial winner Royal Tigress and a half to the G3 Norfolk S. winner and G1 Prix Morny runner-up Warm Heart (Diesis {GB}), as well as Ballydoyle's Listed Doncaster S. scorer Miguel Cervantes (Danzig). Royal Tigress is the dam of the GIII Pin Oak Valley View S. winner and GI Beldame S. runner-up Tiger Ride (Candy Ride {Arg}). Alianza's 2-year-old colt by Elarqam (GB) was a €21,000 purchase by Stephane Cerulis at the Arqana Deauville October Sale.

Sent forward by Maxime Guyon along with Godolphin's Romantic Style (Ire) (Night Of Thunder {Ire}), the winner who had been third in the course-and-distance Prix du Louvre conditions event last month was quickly able to retain energy anchored behind the leading trio throughout the all-important early stages. Needing to work to get to the long-time leader and fellow outsider Kathmandu in the closing stages, she proved game and genuine as she cut down that rival in the shade of the post for a fifth Pouliches for her owner-breeder. There was just a neck separating Kathmandu and Vespertilio (Fr) (Night Of Thunder {Ire}), with Romantic Style probably paying for her early efforts in fourth, another short neck away. The 23-10 favourite Louise Procter (Fr) (Siyouni {Fr}) was disappointing, even allowing for having a troubled passage, and trailed in 13th.

"Francis-Henri Graffard's gut feeling last year was that she was a Poule filly and only this week, we asked ourselves the question, should we run in the Poule d'Essai on Sunday or head to the [Listed] Prix des Lilas at Chantilly on Saturday?" Princess Zahra Aga Khan admitted after the race. "We reasoned in terms of the future and in terms of the filly as a breeding prospect, so

we opted for the Poule d'Essai. For a breeder to produce a filly like her is extraordinary. It's the reward of decades of work."

Speaking before Zarak's son Metropolitan (Fr) captured the Poulains, Princess Zahra added, "Our breeding operation is also experiencing a great moment with the successes of our stallions such as Zarak and Siyouni. Their success is no coincidence, as it's a long-term project and their breeding pages have a lot going for them. It's a game of intellectual chess with nature as my father likes to say. In our quest, we are helped by the fact that we don't need to follow a trend."

Rouhiya, who started her career with a third placing over seven furlongs at Saint-Cloud in October before winning at this trip over 6 1/2 furlongs on Deauville's Polytrack in November, had been third to the re-opposing Rock'n Swing (GB) (Camelot {GB}) and subsequent winner Luiza Bere (Fr) (Territories {Ire}) in the Prix du Louvre on her 3-year-old bow. While that winner was only seventh here, it was Rouhiya who made the biggest step forward to become Graffard's first Classic winner for the operation since taking over Alain de Royer-Dupre's stable.

"We had a perfect run despite a bad draw," he said. "I had told her jockey that she has a sharp turn of foot, but that her burst isn't a lasting one so he waited as long as possible before delivering his challenge."

"She had made a lot of progress since her seasonal debut and she had worked beautifully earlier this week, showing that she had come on a lot from her first run so we said 'why not take a chance'. These races are so difficult to win, but you can't if you don't run and it's great for everyone involved," he added.

Sadly for Brian Meehan, Kathmandu was emulating the narrow defeat of the stable's Isaac Shelby (GB) (Night Of Thunder {Ire}) in the 2023 Poulains. "It's tough, but she has run such an incredible race," he said. "All credit to the team at home and here with her, the owners Ed Babbington and Sam Sangster let me put her in the Guineas in the Spring and she's a wonderful filly and I thought Sean [Levey] gave her an outstanding ride. It's heart-breaking and it's about the seventh Classic-placed horse I've had now--it's becoming annoying."

"She's run beautifully, she's a stunning filly and there's so much to love about her, we're going to have a great time with her for sure," he added. "She definitely gets a mile, but she may have been on the limit of her stamina here today--and Sean felt that--so we will see. Maybe the [G3] Jersey Stakes at Ascot, but we will see."

Kieran Lalor, racing manager to Al Shira'aa Farms, said of Vespertilio, "Willie [McCreery] has done a great job in getting her to the top today. Perhaps her draw didn't help and she was a bit tense initially, but then she settled well. She's put her best foot forward, which really bodes well for the rest of the season, especially as she has handled the journey to France very well. We had our doubts about her ability to stay a mile, but those doubts have been dispelled. We're going to see how she recovers from the race before discussing future plans. She's entered in the Irish 1000 Guineas and the Coronation Stakes at Royal Ascot. Her owner would love to run at Royal Ascot."

Charlie Appleby was inclined to think that the surface had dried too much for Romantic Style and said, "I'm delighted. There were two major questions going into race; the draw and the fast ground. She was coming off a very good effort on heavy ground at Deauville in the Prix Imprudence and, as a two-year-old, her best performances were on soft ground. William [Buick] thought she didn't let herself down as she usually does on this fast ground. As far as distance is concerned, she saw out the trip. We'll be thinking about what to do next-certainly keeping the ground in mind--but the [G1] Prix Jean Prat over 1400 metres is a possibility." Cont. p7

Rouhiya, who was conquering this race 40 years after Masarika (GB) opened the scoring for her owner-breeder, is the 20th top-level winner for her sire and the second foal out of the Listed Grand Prix de Fontainebleau-placed Rondonia. She is one of two black-type performers produced by the listed scorer Raydiya (Ire) (Marju {Ire}) alongside the G2 Debutante S. winner Raydara (Ire) (Rock Of Gibraltar {Ire}), who is in turn the dam of the Listed Prix Isonomy winner and G3 Prix de Fontainebleau-placed Rajapour (Ire) (Almanzor {Fr}) and the G3 Derrinstown Stud Fillies S.-placed Ridenza (Ire) (Sea The Stars {Ire}). Also connected to the G1 Coronation Cup third Roseburg (Ire) (Tamayuz {GB}), Rondonia has an unnamed 2-year-old filly by Camelot (GB) and a yearling filly by Sea The Stars's son Sea The Moon (Ger) to follow.

LOS ANGELES WINS THE DERBY TRIAL

Putting another piece in the Derby puzzle on Sunday, Ballydoyle's unbeaten Los Angeles (Ire) (Camelot {GB}--Frequential (GB), by Dansili (GB)) marked his return with a workmanlike but promising win in Leopardstown's G3 Cashel Palace Hotel Derby Trial S. Last seen winning the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud, the 4-5 favourite sat off the tempo set by stablemate **Euphoric (GB)** (Frankel {GB}) under Wayne Lordan and after getting to the front a furlong out stayed on to beat that rival by a length, with the Dermot Weld trainee Taraj (Ire) (Churchill {Ire}) a head away in third.

Aidan O'Brien was at ParisLongchamp, but stable representative Chris Armstrong was on hand to give the lowdown afterwards. "Both his runs last year were on an easier surface, so it's great to get him out here. He's carrying a bit more condition and the run is going to bring him on a ton," he said. "When he steps up again to a mile and a half he'll improve and he's right now bang in the Derby picture. He's very exciting."

"He's a big horse, but he's a beautiful mover and he's got the right mind," he added. "You could see him walking around the paddock beforehand, absolutely chilled and he has the same attitude at home. Camelot obviously went around Epsom no problem and this horse has a lot of his sire's good traits. The second horse ran a cracker as well and once he goes up in trip again he'll improve a lot. He is a very solid horse."

Pedigree Notes

Los Angeles, a full-brother to the G3 Prix Penelope-placed Be Happy (Ire) and G3 Ballyroan S.-placed Hector De Maris (Ire), is out of the unraced Frequential who is kin to the G3 Prix Messidor winner Impulsif (GB) (New Approach {Ire}) and the G3 Pride S. runner-up Veil Of Shadows (GB) (Frankel (GB)). Their dam Violante (Kingmambo) is a half-sister to the G1 Prix du Jockey Club hero and sire Anabaa Blue (GB) and a daughter of the G3 Prix de Flore winner Allez Les Trois (Riverman).

Allez Les Trois was a half-sister to the G1 2000 Guineas hero King's Best by Violante's sire Kingmambo, and perhaps more importantly to the renowned G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe heroine and outstanding broodmare Urban Sea (Miswaki). That links Los Angeles to Galileo (Ire) and Sea The Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross (Ire)), as well as the stable's G1 Irish Derby hero Santiago (Ire) by Montjeu's other Derby-winning son Authorized (Ire). Frequential's 2-year-old Front And Centre (Ire) (No Nay Never) has already been gelded.

Completing a treble of shocks on Sunday's ParisLongchamp card, Alain Jathiere and Christine Guilbert's Birthe (Ire) (Study Of Man {Ire}--Barakaat {Fr}, by Lope De Vega {Ire}) belied odds of 11-1 when upstaging her peers to take the G2 St Mark's Basilica Coolmore Prix Saint-Alary. Coming off a win in Toulouse's Listed Prix Caravelle last month, the Laura Vanska trainee who cost a mere €10,000 at the Goffs Autumn Yearling Sale was settled on the rail early by Aurelien Lemaitre tracking the leading duo. Sent up the cutaway to take over approaching the furlong pole, she was driven out to beat Almara (Fr) (Almanzor (Fr)) by 1 1/4 lengths.

Second on debut second at Deauville in November, Birthe had won at Chantilly later that month and been third back there in March. All had come on the Polytrack prior to her listed success at Toulouse, which was staged on good-to-soft, so after the storm had softened the ground this was her first effort on easy turf. "I have only nine horses, so to have a filly like this is amazing," Vanska. "She pulled a shoe off and took a funny step and also the rain was a problem, as we know she doesn't really like the soft ground. That's why she ran on the Polytrack earlier in the season, but she obviously can do everything now. I'm really lucky to have her and a big thankyou to the owners. We'll go to the Diane now, there is no hesitation."

Bouncing back from a return sixth in the seven-furlong G3 Ballylinch Stud "Priory Belle" S. at Leopardstown last month, Juddmonte's illustriously-bred **Wendla (GB)** (Ulysses {Ire}-Intercontinental {GB}, by Danehill) benefitted from a masterclass from Colin Keane to cause a minor upset back at that venue in Sunday's G3 Al Shira'aa Racing "Mutamakina" S. Always at the fore with the pace modest, the Ger Lyons-trained daughter of the operation's high-class Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf heroine led the sprint for home in the mile test and had enough in hand to hold on by 3/4 of a length from **Buttons** (Ire) (Kingman {GB}).

"She's a lovely honest filly. The ground comes all the same to her, she's handled heavy and she handled that," Lyons said of the winner, who returned a 7-1 starting price and emulated the win of the same connections' Zarinsk (GB) (Kodiac {GB}) 12 months ago. "I probably had her wrong and Colin had her right. I thought the way the race was run it wasn't going to suit as it turned into a sprint, but Colin has her as having more speed than I gave her credit for and thankfully he was right. He was in the right place on her and she answered and did it well. If she ends up doing what Zarinsk did last year, we'll be over the moon. There are big races here at the end of the year that we can aim for, the mile race [the G1 Matron Stakes]."

Gelded following a 3-year-old campaign that proved largely uneventful other than when he captured The Curragh's Listed Celebration S. in July, Marc Chan's 5-1 shot was a touch free early for Shane Foley racing on the front end. Seemingly swamped inside the final furlong by **Real Appeal (Ger)** (Sidestep {Aus}), he battled back to regain the advantage late on and prevail by half a length.

"We're delighted with that, he's a horse that's always promised an awful lot and we've held him in very high regard," Kate Harrington said. Cont. p11

"He had an allergy issue last year, it turned out he was allergic to grass. When he got his good-to-firm ground in the Curragh he was very good. We went hunting a bit afterwards with him, but we never got our ground. Fair play to Marc and Jamie McCalmont, as they said 'why don't we geld him?' and we actually did a kissing spine operation on him as well."

"He was only just ready to start there today and I think we should have a really exciting season ahead with him," she added. "We'll go to Royal Ascot next with him for the [Listed] Wolferton Stakes. We didn't put him in the Queen Anne. I wasn't too bothered if we did finish second today, as then he wouldn't have had a penalty for Ascot but now he will!"

PRIX DE DIANE UP NEXT FOR IMPROVING TAMFANA

Tamfana (Ger) (Soldier Hollow {GB}) will attempt to gain compensation for her luckless run in the G1 1,000 Guineas when she makes her next appearance in the G1 Prix de Diane at Chantilly on Sunday, June 16.

Trained by David Menuisier, Tamfana confirmed herself a high-class filly when finishing fourth at Newmarket, passing the post less than a length behind the winner and looking unlucky not to get closer still having endured a troubled passage.

Now all roads lead to Chantilly and the next stage of a plan which has been a long time in the making according to Eamonn O'Connor, managing director of owners Quantum Leap Racing.

"We've had this plan in mind over the winter, that it [the Prix de Diane] would be her main target," O'Connor said. "Whatever she did then [at Newmarket], we expected her to step up for the trip that the Diane offers, so that's where we will go."

Tamfana cont.

"We're pretty confident she'll stay at least that--most of the horses that Quantum Leap Racing buy are horses with a staying pedigree," he added. "It will be a great day out, I know that from previous experience. We'll enjoy it and we're looking forward to the season beyond."

Reflecting on Tamfana's run at Newmarket, O'Connor said, "David and I had a conversation as we were still in two minds about whether to go to France, but he thought the filly was good enough to win the English Guineas and I don't think he was wrong.

"We had a tremendous day, the members had the best day of racing most of them have ever had. We didn't win but it felt like we did. There was some mixed emotion afterwards about what could have been, but it's churlish to take anything away from the winner of a race like that and start going on about your own hard luck. We didn't win, but in truth we did come home thinking we had the best filly.

"David has never lacked faith in her. On the day she arrived she didn't look like a €20,000 horse, that's for certain. He genuinely wasn't surprised by the run. A little bit gutted, I guess, that he didn't get his Classic winner but not at all surprised that she ran so well."

LOPE DE LILAS (IRE) (f, 3, Lope De Vega {Ire}--Golden Gazelle {Ire}, by Galileo {Ire}), a July 20 G1 Irish Oaks entry who ran fifth tackling one mile at Galway in her only prior outing last October, lobbed along in seventh through halfway in this sophomore bow. Bounding closer on the home turn, the 9-2 chance powered to the front approaching the furlong pole and was ridden out late to defeat Finsceal Luas (Ire) (Camelot {GB}) by 2 1/4 lengths in stylish fashion. "Jim [Bolger] was very impressed with our filly, he thinks a lot of his filly and he thought our filly could go places," revealed trainer Willie Mullins. "Galway is a hard place to start off a 2-year-old, but I wanted to get a run into her before the end of the season just to teach her something. We were happy enough to wait for here and I was a little bit concerned about the [good] ground, but Colin [Keane] said she flew on it. She was only getting going at the line and went the whole way around to the mile-and-a-quarter start again. She wouldn't have had any ground like that at home and it was a learning day for her." Lope De Lilas is the second foal and scorer out of a winning full-sister to G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches, G1 Prix de Diane and G1 Prix d'Ispahan heroine Golden Lilac (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) and Group 3 winner Grey Lion (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)). Her dam Golden Gazelle (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) is also kin to Listed Prix de l'Avre victor Golden Guepard (Ire) (Hurricane Run {Ire}) and to the dam of multiple Group-placed Listed Prix Gold River victrix Palombe (Ire) (Nathaniel {Ire}). The January-foaled chestnut, whose second dam is G1 Prix du Moulin winner Grey Lilas (Ire) (Danehill), is half to a yearling colt by Too Darn Hot (GB). Sales history: €90,000 Ylg '22 ARAUG. TEN HAPPY ROSE SPRINGS UPSET IN VICTORIA, SECURES BERTH TO BREEDERS' CUP

In a wild upset of the G1 Victoria Mile on Sunday at Tokyo Racecourse, **Ten Happy Rose (Jpn)** (Epiphaneia {Jpn}) rocketed home late to secure her first win at the highest level and an automatic berth into the GI Maker's Mark Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf at eye-popping 208-1 odds.

Having finished sixth in her most recent appearance on track in the G2 Sankei Sports Hai Hanshin Himba S. Apr. 6 and seventh before that Feb. 17 when trying the G3 Kyoto Himba S., her last time in the winner's enclosure was August 2023, when she won the Listed Toki S., and before that in May 2022 in the Freeway S.

In no hurry after the jump, the chestnut watched the race unfold early from the back flight with only three others behind her as **Conch Shell (Jpn)** (Kizuna {Jpn}) and **Feel Sympathy (Jpn)** (Behkabad {Fr}) stepped out to set the fractions. **Namur (Jpn)** (Harbinger {Jpn}) broke particularly poorly, along with a rival to her outside, and the 5-2 second choice found herself trailing the field. The positions remained largely unchanged through the first 600 metres but the shuffle started in earnest entering the final bend as Ten Happy Rose inched forward from the grandstand side.

Entering the final 600, the eventual winner still had at least seven rivals to catch, and was unwittingly aided when 2-1 favourite **Masked Diva (Jpn)** (Rulership {Jpn}) hit traffic as her path between runners closed on her in the stretch. **Cont. p16**

While that one shifted in to try and recover the lost ground, Ten Happy Rose had stormed to the front in the final 200 metres and comfortably held off **Fierce Pride (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) and the troubled betting choice by 1 1/4 lengths.

"The race development, from the start up until the final corner, exceeded my imagination and it was just a matter of how much the mare could extend her strides from there," said winning rider Akihide Tsumura. "When we were actually leading in the last 200 meters, it was almost unbelievable. I am grateful for the fans that have been rooting for me and I hope this is just the start of more victories like this."

The most recent addition to a storied list of Victoria Mile winners--including names such as two-time Japanese Horse of the Year Vodka (Jpn), 2010 Horse of the Year Buena Vista (Jpn), and two-time Horse of the Year Almond Eye (Jpn)--Ten Happy Rose, along with the other top three finishers, has also earned an automatic starting position in the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp as well as the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois.

Pedigree Notes

Ten Happy Rose is the most accomplished runner for her dam Fatal Rose (Jpn) (Tanino Gimlet {Jpn}), who was an honest racehorse in her own right having hit the board 13 times in her career with several of those coming in unlisted Japanese stakes races on local circuits. Ten Happy Rose's last registered sibling is unplaced 3-year-old full-sister Fatal Tour (Jpn).

The pedigree is quite calm beneath the second dam, but shines when reaching the third, by name Oenothera (Ire) (Night Shift). A Group-placed runner in Germany, she claims U.S. champion grass horse, GI Breeders' Cup Turf winner Northern Spur (Ire) as a half-brother and herself produced noteworthy runners or the dams of them, including the likes of multiple Group 1-placed Sundrop (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), the bridesmaid in the 1000 Guineas and Fillies' Mile. That daughter further advanced Oenothera's legacy when she became the mother of Listed winners Storm Damage (GB) (Night Of Thunder {Ire}),

Nature's Colors (GB) (Poet's Voice {GB}) and that one's full-sibling Whitman (GB). Sundrop was also the granddam of stakes-winning Quiet Times (Ger) (Reliable Man {GB}).

In addition to Breeders' Cup champion Northern Spur, this is also the female family of multiple Group winner Great Marquess (GB) and G1 Irish Derby runner-up, Glyndebourne (Ire).

JUICY PREAKNESS FUTURE-BET PRICES, PROVIDED YOU GUESSED WHO'D SHOW UP



Mystik Dan arrives at Pimlico | Maryland Jockey Club

Bettors were able to lock in some juicy prices in the two futures pools for this year's GI Preakness S., but banking on which horses would even enter the middle jewel of the Triple Crown ended up being almost as tough a task as choosing a winner.

Consider yourself a pretty decent Preakness prognosticator if, in Pool 1 that closed back on Mar. 2, you nabbed 30-1 advance odds on subsequent GI Kentucky Derby winner **Mystik Dan** (Goldencents); 19-1 on likely Preakness favorite and **'TDN Rising Star' Muth** (Good Magic), or 70-1 on **Catching Freedom** (Constitution), the Derby's eventual fourth-place finisher.

Yet for a select few to be able to hold tickets on those gaudy overlays, there were a lot Preakness futures players whose hopes were dashed long before the crab cakes started cooking in Baltimore.

Of the 39 individual betting interests offered in Pool 1, those are the only three colts expected to be entered when the Preakness is drawn on Monday.

MYSTIK DAN SETTLES IN AT PIMLICO; CONTENDERS BEGIN TO ARRIVE

GI Kentucky Derby winner **Mystik Dan** (Goldencents), who was confirmed for the GI Preakness S. Saturday by trainer Kenny McPeek, traveled Sunday to Pimlico Race Course and arrived shortly after 4 p.m. accompanied by McPeek's assistant trainer Ray Bryner.

"No muss, no fuss," said Bryner. "He's a really easy horse to be around, not complicated."

Bryner indicated that the colt's plans for the week included a Monday gallop over the Pimlico surface following the 8:30 a.m. renovation break.


Set to join Mystik Dan in Baltimore is the Chad Brown-trained **Tuscan Gold** (Medaglia d'Oro) who will try to award his trainer a third Preakness after Brown won in 2017 with Cloud Computing and in 2022 with Early Voting.



Week In Review Cont.

Most bettors who choose to wade in to futures pools know there is inherent risk involved in trying to chase higher-odds rewards, because if your horse doesn't end up starting, you lose.

But Pool 1 of the Preakness futures pool took that concept to the extreme this year, with only 7.5% of the entire slate of individual entrants still in contention less than one week before the race. The "field" option of all other 3-year-olds closed at 5-1.

Further contributing to the Pool 1 odds imbalance, so many would-be wiseguys loaded up on 'TDN Rising Star' Nysos (Nyquist) two months ago that his price plummeted to 5-2.

The "wisdom" of the crowd at that point in the Triple Crown season was that because Churchill Downs had banned Nysos's trainer, Bob Baffert, the colt (who at the time was ranked No. 1 on both TDN's Sophomore Top 12 list and the NTRA's poll of 3-year-olds), would automatically be targeting the Preakness.

But Nysos's connections had never made any such public declaration way back in late winter, and 10 days after Preakness futures Pool 1 closed, he was taken out of training with what Baffert described at the time as a "minor" setback.

Nysos has not had a published workout since. But the Baffert-trained Muth subsequently won the Mar. 30 GI Arkansas Derby.

And because Mystik Dan ran a non-threatening third behind Muth at Oaklawn, his price drifted even higher, to 45-1, in Pool 2 of the Preakness futures, which closed approximately one hour before the Kentucky Derby went off on May 4.

Muth, by contrast, went off at 7-2 odds in Pool 2. Bettors by that time were armed with the knowledge that he was being pointed for Baltimore on May 18. All things considered, that's still a pretty fair mutuel considering he projects to go off much lower on Preakness Day.

Pool 2 reflected a much more likely lineup of Preakness starters. Yet because 'TDN Rising Star' Fierceness (City of Light) took the brunt of the action at 9-2 and then stamped himself as a no-go for the Preakness with a 15th-place finish in the Derby, there was still decent value spread among seven other likely Preakness starters.

Those overlays include Catching Freedom at 14-1 (far lower than his Pool 1 price but better odds than you will get on Saturday); Imagination (Into Mischief) and Tuscan Gold (Medaglia d'Oro), both at 17-1; Seize the Grey (Arrogate) at 25-1; Just Steel (Justify) at 35-1; Copper Tax (Copper Bullet) at 50-1 and Uncle Heavy (Social Inclusion) at 133-1.

The "all others" proposition went off at 12-1 in Pool 2. But among the 10 likely entrants at deadline for this column, the only horse that field bet would cover is **Mugatu** (Blofeld), who figures to be at least three times that price on Saturday. **Cont.**

Lucky Sevens

It's only early May, but already we have two horses tied atop the North American leaderboard with seven wins apiece in 2024. Both won races at smaller tracks on Kentucky Derby Day to break a three-way tie among six-time winners this season.

Epicurean (Speightster), a 6-year-old mare, scored in a starter/optional claimer at Thistledown to run her record to 7-for-8 through only a little more than four months of racing this year. She's 12-for-42 lifetime, and prior to her second win at Thistle this spring had previously hit the winner's circle during the winter months at Mahoning Valley for owner/trainer Nestor Rivera.

Tennessee Moon (Ransom the Moon), a 4-year-old filly, won the \$25,000 Swihart Memorial S. at Fonner Park to compile the same 7-for-8 mark this year with victories at both Fonner and Delta Downs. She's 12-for-22 lifetime for owner/trainer Mark Hibdon.

Oddly enough, the gelding right behind them in the standings with six wins, **Inside Stunt** (Greenpointcrusader), is a stablemate of Epicurean's in Rivera's barn.

Deja vu All Over Again


Here's another oddity: Last June 4, I wrote an article for TDN titled "Deja vu at Atokad" that detailed how the same set of four Nebraska-bred Thoroughbreds, competing in one-furlong races on back-to-back days at Atokad Downs, finished 1-2-3-4 on both afternoons. The mare who won two races within 24 hours was **P R Girlfriend** (Gold Schleiger).

The unusual result was the product of the South Sioux City track's ownership, Ho-Chunk, Inc., needing to conduct at least one day of live racing to maintain Nebraska licensure as an active racetrack, a status that Ho-Chunk, for nearly a decade now, has been perpetuating in an oft-delayed attempt to eventually develop a racino.

This year's two-day festival at Atokad was conducted Friday and Saturday. As in recent years, it consisted of three one-furlong races per day, limited to four starters each, with multiple horses entered on back-to-back days. The sprints for Thoroughbreds took place over a straightaway with a J-shaped gallop-out that is part of what remains of the five-furlong oval where the otherwise demolished Atokad previously conducted more traditional race meets from 1956 through 2012.

P R Girlfriend, now age six, had gone five starts over the last 11 months without being able to win at two other Nebraska tracks, Columbus and Fonner. But she proved she is a one-furlong specialist and horse-for-the-course at Atokad, winning again on Friday and dead-heating for another victory on Saturday.

On Friday, P R Girlfriend went off as the 2-1 second choice (yes, these contests had betting--about \$2,300 in win, place,

exactas and doubles for that race), scoring by a head in :12.40 despite breaking last in a one-furlong sprint.

On Saturday, just 21 hours and 33 minutes later, P R Girlfriend again was sent off as the second choice in a four-horse field. This time she broke third, put away the favorite, then got hooked on even terms at the wire by a fresh closer for the dead-heat win, matching Friday's :12.40 clocking.

And P R Girlfriend wasn't the only horse at Atokad to win two races in two days this past weekend. The 9-year-old gelding **Pickeljuice** (Holiday Justice), who hadn't won a race in nearly two years, also managed the feat.

Ho-Chunk business operations manager Marshall Bass told KCAU-TV there is no firm timetable for the new racino, but the hope is to break ground in the next year.

"We will continue the races going forward," Bass told KCAU.

"This might be the last year, we might have another one here next year. But in the grand scheme, the big plan at the end is to have these races in a full track at our new facility here in South Sioux City."

Preakness Starters Cont.

Shipping from California Tuesday will be the Bob Baffert pair of **Muth** (Good Magic) and **Imagination** (Into Mischief), who will leave their Santa Anita base early Tuesday morning and arrive at Pimlico Tuesday afternoon.

"They are both doing well," said Baffert. "I liked the way they breezed; they were a good team. I am happy the way they are coming into this."

The field of eight, which was drawn Sunday, also includes Jeanne Marie (Speightster), Ringy Dingy (Dialed In), Call Another Play (Audible), Gun Song (Gun Song), Whocouldaskformo (Uncle Mo), Corposo (Vino Rosso) and Recharge (Gun Runner).

"She has her days when she's up and down and everything," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas of Lemon Muffin. "On her best day, she's a very, very nice filly. But she doesn't always show up every time, so we're hoping that we get one of those days when she does."

Call Another Play earned her way into the Black-Eyed Susan with a win in Laurel's Weber City Miss S. April 20, her third consecutive win for trainer Mike Trombetta.

"She just finally caught some continuity and she's figuring things out in these two-turn races," said Trombetta. "She's been able to handle it. She's going to have to step up her game, it's just a matter of how much."

The Black-Eyed Susan is one of three graded-stakes races on the card Friday at Pimlico to open Preakness weekend in Baltimore. First post Friday is at 11:30 a.m. with post time for the Black-Eyed Susan going off at 5:44 p.m.

CATCHING FREEDOM TO ENTER PREAKNESS **ACCORDING TO COX**

Albaugh Family Stables's Catching Freedom (Constitution), the GI Kentucky Derby fourth-place finisher, is slated to enter Saturday's \$2 million GI Preakness S. at Pimlico Race Course, trainer Brad Cox said Sunday morning via a 1/ST Racing press release.

Cox's initial reaction was not to run the colt back in two weeks after the hard race the GII Louisiana Derby winner had under the Twin Spires, in which he finished less than two lengths behind victorious Mystik Dan (Goldencents). However, Catching Freedom has been training so well at Churchill Downs that Cox felt the 3-year-old deserved another chance at a Triple Crown race.

Regular rider Flavien Prat will have the mount.

"Obviously we like how he's doing," Cox said. "It's just eight days after the Derby. It's very important to watch the horse. He has been galloping well. I'm happy with the way he's moving. Tomorrow (Monday) is entry day, and we are going to ship tomorrow. We need to get our ducks in a row, and we feel he's shown us enough.

"It's not ideal to run back in two weeks at this level, but that's the way the schedule is. This race provides an opportunity to be very competitive in a Grade 1. We don't want to miss that opportunity as long as he's doing well. The Preakness is a very prestigious race. It's not only a Grade 1 but a classic."

Cox has participated in Old Hilltop's featured race only once before, finishing third with Owendale (Into Mischief) and fourth with Warrior's Charge (Munnings) in the 2019--neither of whom ran in the Derby. He had one of the Preakness favorites last year in MGSW First Mission (Street Sense), only to have that horse scratched the day before the race.

"We put a lot of focus on the Kentucky Derby, and that obviously does take away from Preakness a little bit," the multiple Eclipse winning conditioner said. "It's just not as common to run these horses back in two weeks as maybe it used to be. It basically comes down to how the horse is doing, and we're happy with the way he's training. Based off who we hear is running, he stacks up with that group of horses--bottom

Cox said Catching Freedom will leave for Baltimore after training Monday morning. His son, assistant trainer Blake Cox, will oversee preparations at Pimlico.

Coming off a disappointing 15th in the GI Kentucky Derby, Fierceness is also on target for the Belmont.

Other runners shipping north were GII Man o' War S. winner Silver Knott (Lope de Vega {Ire}) for Godolphin and Charlie Appleby along with **Nation's Pride (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}) who are both slated to appear during the Belmont at Saratoga meet.

PIPSY IMPRESSIVE IN LAST-TO-FIRST **SOARING SOFTLY WIN**

Just five months after bringing 700,000gns at the Tattersalls December Mare Sale, Pipsy (Ire) (Kodiac {GB}) impressed in her North American debut with a last-to-first win in the GIII Soaring Softly S. at Belmont's The Big A meet Sunday. As a juvenile in her native Ireland, she won two of her three races including a listed stake before heading to auction where Woodford Thoroughbreds stuck the winning bid and imported the filly to race out of the William Walden barn.

The tepid 3-1 favorite had her backers watching on nervously as the filly jumped straight in the air as the gates opened and spotted the field several lengths. Trailing her nine rivals up the backstretch as a pair of longshots battled up front, Pipsy regained contact with the back of the group as the opening quarter passed in :22.42. Pushed along around the turn, the favorite had still just one horse beat as the lead pack bunched up past the quarter pole. Confidently handled by Flavien Prat, Pipsy swung out past the furlong marker and engulfed the field from the center of the track, driving to the line a clear winner even as Kairyu (Ire) (Kuroshio {Aus}) chased her home.

"The horses were acting up around her and she got very anxious in the gate and broke in the air," said Prat. "So, we went to Plan B. I gave her a chance to see if she would get underneath me and she sure did. When I tipped her out, she made a great move."

Pedigree Note:

One of 97 stakes winners for Kodiac, Pipsy sold for 700,000 gns as a 2-year-old before her U.S. debut after previously RNA'ing for 45,000gns as a yearling at Tattersalls October in 2022 and bringing €60,000 as a foal at Goff's November Foal Sale in 2021. The first winner out of a half-sister to GSW/MG1SP Ziyad (GB)

(Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), this is also the family of MG1SW Aquarelliste (Fr) (Danehill) and MGISW Artiste Royal (Ire) (Danehill). Experte's youngest foal is a yearling colt by Ghaiyyath (Ire) and she was not reported bred for this year.



Kathleen O. got back to the winner's circle for the first time in over two years when winning Monmouth's Serena's Song S. over a wet track on Sunday.

With a solid start to her racing career as a late juvenile, the Shug McGaughey trainee rattled off three straight wins at three, including the GII Davona Dale S. and GII Gulfstream Park Oaks. The dark bay, a respectable fifth to 1-2 finishers Secret Oath and Nest in the Kentucky Oaks, she did not return to action until November when she was runner-up in the GIII Comely S. at the Big A.

Runner up in last year's GIII Royal Delta S. and Top Flight Invitational S., she was last seen running a well-beaten sixth against optional claimers at Gulfstream Park in Mar. 17. Given a break for nearly two months, she shipped to Oceanport where she was tabbed as a 9-1 shot here.

Kathleen O. brought up the rear heading into the first turn, but she looked to be engaged up the backstretch. With still a good bit to do around the far turn, the 5-year-old tipped to the extreme outside by the top of the lane and was set down for the final drive. At the eighth pole, Occult cut off the rail-skimming Venti Valentine, but was unable to stop the momentum of Kathleen O., who secured the win in the final jumps. After a claim of foul, the stewards placed Venti Valentine second and moved Occult to third.

"I think the two turns helped, said Hall of Fame trainer Shug McGaughey. "I took her to Kentucky to get her out of Florida and let her eat grass and get some cool weather instead of the hot Florida weather and I think she did good there. She had a really good work at Keeneland on the Saturday before she shipped up [to Monmouth]. She shipped good.

He continued, "She's always in the back when she races. She breaks okay but she doesn't break running. I'd like to see her get to where she breaks running and goes from there. We may try to stretch her out even more and see where it takes us. Yes, the [GIII] Molly Pitcher [July 20] is a possibility."

The winner's dam is responsible for 2-year-old filly Jacquelyn Eau (Tapwrit) and a yearling filly by Upstart. Kathleen O.'s extended female family includes GISW and sire Cupid (Tapit), plus 'TDN Rising Star' V V's Dream (Mitole).


