BALTIMORE, MD -- He's baaack.

The truth of the matter, trainer Bob Baffert never really went away. The Hall of Famer's omnipresent influence--be it through his runners or the offspring of the stallions he helped mold--can be felt everywhere, regardless of whether the man shows up or not. Conspicuous in his absence at Churchill Downs two weeks ago, Baffert did make his first appearance on the Pimlico backstretch Friday morning, surrounded by a rockstar-caliber entourage, including his kids and his wife Jill, in addition to SF Bloodstock's Tom Ryan and Starlight Racing's Jack Wolf.

GUN SONG FIRES BEST SHOT IN THE BLACK-

EYED SUSAN by Christina Bossinakis

BALTIMORE, MD -- On a day where the track was proving kind to front-runners, **Gun Song** (**Gun Runner**) benefitted from a text-book ride by Hall of Famer John Velazquez to give Mark Hennig a win for longtime client Lee Lewis in Pimlico's Friday feature, the GII George E. Mitchell Black-Eyed Susan S. The 14-race card concluded with record handle of \$28.4 million, up from \$28.2 million one year ago.

Breaking slightly inward from post five, the chestnut cruised into contention, positioning herself on the flank of 18-1 shot Jeanne Marie (Speightster) while Corposo (Vino Rosso) and Call Another Play (Audible) were in close pursuit through an opening quarter in :24.20. Inching up on the pacesetter after an equally pokey half-mile in :49.47, the 23-10 favorite allowed Jeanne Marie to inch ahead momentarily as they exited the far turn. With Velazquez visibly clocking his competition heading to the quarter pole, he gave his filly the cue and she gained command in early stretch. Given a couple of reminders, although she didn't seem to need them, she coasted home an easy 3 1/4-length winner over Corposo with Call Another Play a head back in third. Whocouldaskformo (Uncle Mo) completed the superfecta.

"I was a little concerned of me taking too much hold of her," said Velazquez. "I didn't want to do that. But they were going so slow. She got relaxed on the backstretch and we were going so slow, so I was thinking that, hopefully, when I let her go, I didn't choke her down." **Cont. p9**





Mugatu, a son of the Maryland-based Blofeld (Quality Road) has taken owner Dan Preiss and trainer Jeff Engler to new heights, including a spot in the gate for Saturday's GI Preakness S. at Pimlico.

After the disappointing scratch of early GI Preakness S. favorite Muth (Good Magic), Baffert was on-hand to oversee his other runner, Imagination (Into Mischief), take to the track for a 1 3/8-mile gallop under exercise rider Humberto Gomez. Led to the track by assistant Jimmy Barnes aboard the barn's already famous pony Amarillo, the flashy bay looked far more chilled out on an overcast morning Friday than he did only a day before. Barely breaking a sweat, the colt completed his task with little fuss, suggesting he might be able to replicate the feat of last year's front-running Preakness winner National Treasure, campaigned by the same connections.

"He looks fine, I really don't have any excuses for him," Baffert said of Imagination, the 3-1 second choice on the revised Preakness morning line. "He should run well."

Of the GII San Felipe S. winner, Baffert added, He is going to have to step it up a level to be there with them," Baffert said. "I am hoping this will be his coming-out-party race. We need him now with Muth out. We really, really need him badly."

Embodying the same ease that ushered him through his Kentucky Derby victory two weeks ago, captain cool himself, **Mystik Dan** (Goldencents), continued to take everything in stride, neither wowing nor disappointing. On a loop since his first Derby win, trainer Kenny McPeek has been telling anyone that would listen that the colt's superpower is his intelligence and unflappable demeanor. Once again mobbed by the media Friday morning, Mystik Dan enjoyed nothing more than a light gallop under Robby Albarado, and has not turned a hair in the days leading up to the Preakness. The colt, who will be reunited with Brian Hernandez, Jr. in the second jewel of the Triple Crown, is the 8-5 favorite on the morning line.

"He didn't need anything complicated," McPeek said. It should be noted, however, the true star of the stakes barn was Sonny, McPeek's robust yellow Labrador Retriever who made his first appearance Friday. Garnering the star status that has not been seen since the days of Bobby Frankel's Australian Shepard Happy, Sonny one-upped his predecessor by getting his own track-issued credential. The affable pooch was clearly enjoying all the attention, and all the dog biscuits, that went with it.

Also getting his share of traffic at the barn Friday morning, trainer D. Wayne Lukas sent out **Just Steel** (**Justify**) and followed by GII Pat Day Mile scorer **Seize the Grey** (Arrogate) shortly after 7:30 a.m., in order to accommodate the 11:30 a.m. ET post time. He stationed himself atop his pony at the very end of the stretch to watch his horses go through their final paces, as far away from the ever-growing legion of media as he could comfortably post himself. An observation that was subsequently confirmed. However, it wasn't long before the press descended on the Hall of Famer's barn, and he obliged the numerous requests for a quote or a sound bite. But as an errant camera operator quickly found out, don't drift too far into the shedrow because The Coach won't hesitate to educate you.

Preakness Talking Horses


Beyond the week's most talked-about Preakness contenders, a few of the sophomores gave their connections some measure of quiet confidence heading into Saturday's Classic.

Chief among them, TDN Rising Star Tuscan Gold (Medaglia d'Oro), representing William Lawrence, Walmac Farm and Stonestreet Stables. Under exercise rider Janiel Rosado, the GII Louisiana Derby third-place finisher galloped 1 1/4 miles Friday morning.



Chad Brown's assistant Jose Hernandez, who has overseen the training of Tuscan Gold since he arrived at Pimlico Tuesday, said, "He has been handling the track really well. He did fine again today. We didn't ask him to do anything more than he has been doing. He is just very focused right now. I am really confident going into the race."

Making only his fourth career start, Tuscan Gold will use a similar path as Brown previously employed with 2017 Preakness winner Cloud Computing and Early Voting, victorious in 2022. Both horses won the Preakness off only three races.

According to Hernandez, Tuscan Gold will just walk the shedrow on Saturday morning. The colt will be ridden by Tyler Gaffalione, who has been aboard in two of Tuscan Gold's three career starts.

Having garnered plenty of pre-Derby hype, **Catching Freedom** (Constitution) continued to draw rave reviews during his time at Pimlico this week. Winner of Oaklawn's Smarty Jones S. Jan. 1, he was third in the Feb. 17 GII Risen Star S. before annexing the Louisiana Derby. The Brad Cox trainee was last seen finishing fourth in the Kentucky Derby.





"He got here early Tuesday morning," said assistant Blake Cox. "He jogged a mile, Tuesday, late like 9 a.m. Very quiet track. He was very fresh coming home. [Wednesday] morning, we just galloped through a mile because the track was sealed. He looked very good and came back fresh again."

The colt was expected to school with Friday's first race.

"He looked very good," said Cox Friday morning. "He's been coming off the track bucking and squealing. He's as happy as he can be."

With the scratch of GI Arkansas Derby winner Muth, who would have likely installed himself on the front end come Saturday, several of the remaining participants continue to ponder where the early speed might come from. **Cont. p6**

"It might change the pace scenario," said Cox when asked about the favorite's defection. "And obviously, he was the favorite and it's a big scratch, and he's a very, very good horse, but we'll see who goes. I mean we're going to need to set up [off the pace] to be able to get the job done and we're, hopefully, going to get it."

Baffert echoed his concern with the lack of a legitimate target horse for Imagination, who will be ridden by Frankie Dettori, who was also aboard for a second-place effort in the Apr. 6 GI Santa Anita Derby.

"If he gets out there by himself, I don't know what he would do and how he would react," Baffert said. "I am going to leave it up to Frankie. He's on his own."

In addition to Derby winner Mystik Dan, who has already proven adept on winning over a soggy track, Friday and Saturday's forecast for rain have also seemed to improve the chances of Michael Milam and LC Racing LLC's Uncle Heavy (Social Inclusion). The winner of two of three starts at Parx at two, he earned his graded badge with a narrow score in a muddy renewal of the GIII Withers S. at the Big A Feb. 3. Trained by Butch Reid, Jr., the late May foal finished fifth last out in the GII Wood Memorial Apr. 6.

"Well, that's what I'm hoping for, a little wet-fast," Reid said. "He really likes that."

"I'm hoping for a track similar [to earlier in the week] on Saturday because he loved it, really relished it," Reid said. "Had a good, aggressive gallop and was getting over it really well."

Uncle Heavy will attempt to become the first Pennsylvaniabred to win the historic Preakness since Smarty Jones in 2004.

Uncle Heavy, who went out to the track for routine morning exercise Friday, will be accompanied by Irad Ortiz, Jr. for the first time Saturday.

Undercard Action at Pimlico

A quartet of Grade III tests highlight Pimlico's Sarturday undercard, including the six-furlong GIII Chick Lang S. for 3-yearolds. The race is highlighted by Mr Skylight (Practical Joke), the winner of his two latest starts, including a Keeneland allowance optional claimer Apr. 20. Also on the undercard, the GIII Gallorette S. features morning-line choice MGSW Fluffy Socks (Slumber {GB}), who looks to get back on track following a sixth in the Apr. 13 GI Jenny Wiley S. The remaining graded races on Saturday's card are the GIII Maryland Sprint S. and the GIII Dinner Party S. The 14-race card kicks off at 10:30 a.m.



PREAKNESS CONTENDER MUGATU BRINGS **BLUE-COLLAR STABLE TO THE CLASSIC**

When Mugatu (Blofeld) makes his way onto the track in the morning, it's hard to look away. The imposing chestnut colt with the unique blaze that spans across his forehead before trickling down to just above his nostrils has a presence that makes you pay attention. And when he moves across the track, it's easy to understand why he was the one that Dan Preiss sought out on the final day of the 2023 Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Spring 2-Year-Olds in Training sale.

After receiving a call from trainer Jeff Engler halfway through the sale, Preiss had a new order to fill: finding a 2-year-old for a group of Kentucky and Ohio-based clients with a budget of \$15,000. It was a feat that seemed nearly impossible as the horses continued to file through the ring until Preiss was directed to the Wavertree Stables consignment and met a Blofeld colt out of Union Way (Union Rags) (hip 1150).

"When I called Jeff, I told him, 'I really like this horse,' said Preiss. "He's bigger than most horses that I would ever buy at a 2-year-old sale but that's what I like about him because he went :10 3/5, which is why we could afford him. He's not built like a 2-year-old in training sale horse, he's a massive colt. Then I looked a little deeper and saw the gallop out, which was probably in the top 5% in the whole sale, and that's when I got excited."

Despite a brief bidding war with an internet bidder, Preiss came out on top at a final price of \$14,000.

Since then, he's taken his connections on quite the ride over various parts of the country. Owned by Average Joe Racing and Dan Wells, the colt made his first three career starts as a 2-year-old at Ellis Park before heading out to Keeneland, and later closing out the year in Florida at Gulfstream Park and Tampa Bay. Though it took some time, which seems to be a given with a horse of his stature, Mugatu broke his maiden in his fifth career start, going a mile and 70 yards on the all-weather at Gulfstream and winning it by 3 1/4 lengths.

Engler has tried the colt at a variety of distances and surfaces, giving him the upper hand in terms of experience when compared to many other colts his age.

"He's filled out tremendously [since last year]. He's gotten a lot bigger, stronger, wider," said Engler. "The nice thing about him is he runs good on everything, really. Tapeta he really liked, obviously he ran good in the [John] Battaglia [Memorial S.]. He ran a really big race in the Rushaway [S.] at Turfway. He ran eighth but got beat 2 1/2 lengths by Trikari (Oscar Performance) who came back to win [the GII American Turf] on Derby Day.

"He's run against a lot of high-quality horses, obviously Sierra Leone (Gun Runner) and Dornoch (Good Magic), but he seems to prefer dirt. His best number was on the dirt and when we switched him over to the dirt, we moved him from Turfway to Belterra Park to train on it leading up to the [GI Kentucky] Derby.

"Initially we thought he was going to be an outstanding turf horse, but he just didn't show that real big kick at the end. So, I'm thinking dirt and synthetic [for him]."

The colt's fourth in the Battaglia, along with his run in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S., where he outran his 181-1 odds to close from last to finish fifth, earned him 14 qualifying points on the Road to the Kentucky Derby. The colt and his team were on the outside looking in on the also-eligible list leading up to the first Saturday in May, just one scratch away from drawing into the field, but unfortunately didn't receive the call they had been hoping for.

Despite that disappointment, Engler has forged ahead with Mugatu, bringing him back to Belterra for one more work-breezing five furlongs in :59.80 on May 11--as the team switched their focus to Baltimore for Saturday's GI Preakness S.

"It was very disappointing not to draw in and obviously we needed someone to scratch, and we weren't wishing it on anybody," said Engler. "We were there [at Churchill Downs] all week, just saying, 'if it happens, it happens.' It didn't happen, but the good thing is he handled that entire week like a professional. He loves the camera and he handled the crowds, the press, and all of the people by the rail. He never flinched.

"We feel like we have a horse that has the mind and talent to be in these races and it's very exciting to be in this race. It's a Triple Crown race and for a stable the size of mine to be in a race like this, it's a lifelong dream. [The owners] are on cloud nine. They're all great people and they've been with me for 15 years, through thick and thin. They've had a couple halfway decent horses but never a horse to run in a Triple Crown race. It's like the blue-collar stable coming in to take on the white-collar stables."

It seems only fitting that Mugatu, though a Kentucky-bred, would make his Classic debut in the state where his sire Blofeld (Quality Road) resides at Murmur Farm in Darlington. Despite his smaller crop sizes, success is a consistent factor among his offspring, including stakes winners Chickieness, Johnyz From Albany, Miss Harriett, Alpine Mist and Charming Way from four crops with 93 foals of racing age. Last year, he climbed into the top five on Maryland's top 10 overall sires list.

"Since we [got Mugatu], I've learned a lot about Blofeld. He's got a small sample out there but oh my gosh...I would love to have several more Blofelds," said Engler.

Some would glance at Mugatu's light record, with only one win, a second and two thirds from 12 career starts, and dismiss him as the underdog at the level he's now running at. But according to his connections, he's only just getting started, and a longer distance seems to be the key in unlocking his true potential on the dirt.

"One thing Joe Talamo said to me, several times is, 'He's still not giving us 100%.' And he said, 'When he gives us 100%, he's a Grade I winner.' So, that gives me hope that there's still 20% in him and I think there is, so we'll see," said Engler. "I just really believe if we go on to get that mile-and-a-quarter distance, he's going to flourish."

The chestnut colt will break from post one with Joe Bravo aboard in Saturday's 149th running of the second leg of the Triple Crown, with the field down to eight after the scratch of GISW and 'TDN Rising Star' Muth (Good Magic) due to a temperature.

For Engler and Preiss, it's a culmination of the hard work they've put in day in and day out and the close friendship they've forged along the way. **Cont. p9**

"It's pretty special because we're a small stable. We don't get the big budgets and the big horses. Dan is kind of in the same boat because he's new to the [bloodstock] industry, so he's not getting the big clients, and he's got to work five times harder to buy a \$50,000 horse than somebody who's buying a \$500,000 horse. But he does and he's very passionate about it.

"Obviously we're really good friends now and it's nice to see that hard work does pay off. So, one of these days, and hopefully it's soon with Mugatu, it pays off for both of us."

He added, "But once I put my hands down at the three-eighths pole, she was relaxed. When I asked her at the quarter pole, she responded nicely."

The victory marked the first win in the race for Hennig, while it was a record-setting fifth score for Velazquez, who also won with Added Gold (1998), Roar Emotion (2003), Spun Sugar (2005) and In Lingerie (2012).

"I was anticipating more pressure from the outside," said Hennig. "We didn't get it--when I saw the three-quarters in 1:13, I thought, that's two seconds faster than they just stopped going a sixteenth of a mile [shorter in the previous race]. But I was pleased to see her go on. Turning for home, I could see she was pretty strong." He added, "Other than her last race, she always finishes very well. In my heart, I knew she was a good horse. I didn't have any doubts that she was a good horse. I had a little doubt about the distance after that last race, but I didn't have enough doubt to not try this."

A debut winner going six furlongs at Aqueduct last October, Gun Song was third to next-out Letellier Memorial S. winner Leslie's Loot (Fast Anna) in the slop at that venue while adding a furlong against allowance foes in December. She gave 'TDN Rising Star' and future GI Central Bank Ashland S. winner Leslie's Rose (Into Mischief) all she could handle in a Gulfstream optional claimer Jan. 11 and went one better with an impressive 5 3/4-length win going a mile at the Hallandale oval Feb. 9, but could do no better than fourth when trying two turns for the first time in the GII Gulfstream Park Oaks Mar. 30.

"I think she got tired last time," added Velazquez. "And then I worked her last week [5f, 1:00.30 at Belmont May 9], and I knew she was ready. I knew this time she was quite ready for it."

Of the runner-up and second choice in the wagering, trainer Peter Eurton said, "I am very proud of her. I think she is still very green. I am taking nothing away from the winner. She ran huge."

Gun Song, a \$400,000 OBS March purchase by Lee Lewis, is out of graded winner and Grade I placed Nicole H. The daughter of Mr. Greeley is also responsible for an unraced juvenile colt by War of Will, named Nicole's Will, and a colt, foaled this season, by Practical Joke.

Of his relationship with owner Lewis, Hennig explained, "[I've been with him] Forty years. I was an assistant for Wayne Lukas at the time. Lee and I just always had a good relationship from that day forward. Last year, I told him I had a bloodstock agent I wanted to team up with. We'd been trying to buy horses for [Lewis] without any help. It was hard because we just don't have the manpower between [wife] Rosemary and I to go and look at all the horses at Keeneland and all the 2-year-olds in training. Phil Hager of Taproot Bloodstock has done a good job. This was the first filly we bought. We're off to a good start."

A well-backed 5-1 while making his stakes debut in Friday's GIII Pimlico Special S. over the Preakness S. course and distance, Blue Heaven Farm homebred Pyrenees was delivered in the nick of time by Kentucky Derby-winning jockey Brian Hernandez, Jr. to complete a memorable stakes three-timer for the Cherie DeVaux barn.

The beautifully bred 4-year-old, who capped a three-race winning streak--with Hernandez, Jr. aboard each time--courtesy

of a three-length allowance victory over a sloppy Keeneland main track Apr. 12, was eased back and settled not far from a dawdling early pace set by the rail-drawn Harlocap and heavily favored Kingsbarns through an opening half-mile in :50.26. Racing in the two path around the turn, Pyrenees was niggled along to keep pace five-sixteenths of a mile from home and was pulled out four and five deep in upper stretch, with every conceivable chance if good enough. Kingsbarns edged in front for Luis Saez well off the inside with less than a furlong to run, but Pyrenees did slightly the better of the two and clawed his way home late for a narrow success. Harlocap held for third after laying down those soft splits.

DeVaux also took the Hilltop S. with the impressive She Looks Pretty (Karakontie {Jpn}) and the Allaire duPont Distaff S. with Shotgun Hottie (Gun Runner), both backed into odds-on favoritism.

"I've never won three races in a day, so we'll take this," DeVaux said. "We were just hoping the horses showed up. You just hope you come in here and the horses run their race, they come out sound, they come out healthy. That's the most important, the last part. It's great. This is my first time really running here on my own. So, I think I'll have to make this a yearly visit."

With the better-known 'Mystik' still in the barn, Mystic Lake went to the front end and never looked back, rolling home a 4 1/2-length winner over favored Youalmosthadme in Friday's Miss Preakness S. at Pimlico.

A second-out winner at Woodbine last fall, she was runner-up in that venue's Glorious Song S. on the synthetic in October before weakening late to be third in the GIII Mazarine S. in November. Kicking off 2024 with a win in Tampa's seven-panel Gasparilla S. on the dirt Jan. 13, the Florida-bred filly was fifth going a mile in Gulfstream's grassy GIII Herecomesthebride S. but rebounded to post a front-running victory facing state-bred rivals back on the dirt in the Sophomore Fillies S. at Tampa Mar. 24. Returning to Woodbine for her latest start, she finished second as the favorite in the Star Shoot S. over six furlongs Apr. 27.

Sent off at 5-1, Mystic Lake broke like a shot from the rail and raced to the front with Launch (Omaha Beach) in hot pursuit as Value Area (More Than Ready), breaking from post 2, was pinched back and dropped back to the rear of the field. Carving out a quarter in :23.09, the filly continued to show the way over Launch and a rail-skimming Youlamosthadme through a :46.44



half. Straightening for home, Mystic Lake showed no signs of letting up and spurted clear as the 2-1 favorite tried to reel the front-runner in, but couldn't make headway late. Discreet Ops closed to grab third over Cap Classique (Vino Rosso).

"She jumped very well and got an early good position, and she did the rest from there," said winning rider jockey Flavien Prat, accompanying the filly for the first time. "You've got to break well, but she did, and it turned out well."

"She is just a consistent filly and she ran big today," added trainer Saffie Joseph, Jr. "She has run well on the dirt. She has won her last three on the dirt. The only blemish on her record was her first time on the dirt [in her career debut at Gulfstream when she ran ninth]. For some reason, she did not break that day and ran poorly."

Mystic Lake's Miss Preakness victory gives Mo Town (Uncle Mo) his sixth career graded winner. A \$130,000 OBS March 2-year-old buy, Mystic Lake was previously purchased for \$3,500 by Tom McCrocklin at the OBS yearling sale in 2022. Mystic Lake was consigned to the recently concluded Fasig-Tipton May Digital Sale, but was unsold on a final bid of \$370,000, having already been entered for the Miss Preakness. BOLT D'ORO FILLY, AUTHENTIC COLT WORK BULLETS IN TIMONIUM FRIDAY

TIMONIUM, MD - The under-tack show for the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic May 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale concluded with a third session Friday at the Maryland State Fairgrounds in Timonium and after an initial session of headwinds and a second session punctuated by tailwinds, conditions were calm with overcast skies during the show's finale.

A filly by Bolt d'Oro (hip 401) had the fastest furlong work of Friday's session, covering the distance in :10 flat during the day's third set. Consigned by Wavertree Stables, the bay filly is out of Werewolf (Arch) and is a half-sister to stakes winner and graded-placed Howling Time (Not This Time).

"We thought she would work as good as one could work up here," Wavertree's Ciaran Dunne said. "We were nervous only because when you have such high expectations, usually it is tough to meet them. But I think she worked as good as one is going to work here today."

The filly was purchased for \$335,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale.

"She is a big, pretty filly," Dunne said of the juvenile's appeal last fall. "She's the type of horse we like. Physically, she's strong and she's balanced and she moves good. There is nothing to not like."

Of her progression over the winter, Dunne said, "She was right there with the best of what we had this year. She was supposed to go to the April sale, but she had a little setback. We gave her the time and she's never done anything other than advertise herself as top class."

A colt from the first crop of GI Kentucky Derby winner Authentic (hip 565) set the bullet mark for a quarter-mile Friday when covering the distance in :21 2/5 during the session's second set. Consigned by Pick View, LLC, the dark bay is out of Jeannie S (Sky Mesa) and is a half-brother to multiple stakeswinner Shanghai Starlet (Shanghai Bobby).

The colt will be making a quick reappearance in the sales ring after bringing \$150,000 at the OBS April sale last month.

Veteran horseman Hoby Kight purchased the youngster, who worked a furlong in :10 flat at the Florida auction, on behalf of a group of partners. Cont. p14

"I was looking for a couple of horses to buy to bring up here that worked good, that were real horses that I thought would work well on the dirt," Kight said. "I do it every year. And it works out for me."

Asked what he looked for in horses to buy in Ocala to reoffer in Timonium, Kight said, "I like a horse with pedigree and work. And this horse worked good. He is a big stretchy horse, the kind I like."

Of the colt's work at OBS, Kight said, "There are so many horses who go:10 flat at OBS which are not real. This was real. There are a lot of horses there that work good that are real horses and there are some horses who work good where the synthetic just helps them a little bit. I don't want that horse."

Kight was impressed by the colt's bullet drill in Timonium Friday.

"I think it was awesome," he said. "A :21 2/5 on the dirt, seven times out of 10 is a stakes horse."

The juvenile's work was no surprise to consignor Joe Pickerrell.

"He worked really good in April, so we expected him to work big," Pickerrell said. "He's a big, beautiful two-turn colt. He was up to the task today. [OBS April consignor] Top Line [Sales] did a great job with him."

Of Kight, Pickerrell added, "Hoby is one of the best that ever did it. He's always buying and selling and in parts of the market that people kind of forget about. That's why he is so successful because he thinks outside of the box. If something outworks him today, I am sure Hoby will be there to look at it because we like fast horses. We are thankful he chose us to offer a horse like him."

In addition to hip 565, Authentic was represented by two of the five juveniles to share the week's fastest quarter-mile work of :21 1/5.

The Pick View consignment was busy throughout the undertack show, sending 25 juveniles to the track over the three days.

"The track has been great," Pickerrell said. "These guys do a phenomenal job of dealing with the weather on this track. We are lucky to have these track guys and Fasig does an excellent job. They made the right call by delaying the breeze show and I think it's been fair for everybody. A little bit of a headwind one day and a little tailwind the other day--I feel like the buyers will be able to sort that out. There is so much separation here with dirt horses. There is a lot more that goes into it here than just a fast work. I feel like people are here to buy good dirt horses and they are going to find them."

The Fasig-Tipton Midlantic May 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale will be held next Monday and Tuesday with bidding beginning each day at 11 a.m.

BELMONT GOLD CUP TO SERVE AS INTERNATIONAL QUALIFIER FOR MELBOURNE CUP

The New York Racing Association, Inc. (NYRA) and the Victoria Racing Club (VRC) have formed an agreement that the GII Belmont Gold Cup, slated for Thursday, June 6 at Saratoga Race Course, will be a 'Golden Ticket' event offering the winner an automatic berth into the G1 Lexus Melbourne Cup, NYRA said in a Friday release.

The new partnership will provide the winner of the Belmont Gold Cup, a two-mile test for older horses, a place in the starting gate for the Lexus Melbourne Cup on Nov. 5, 2024, at Flemington Racecourse in Victoria, Australia.

The Belmont Gold Cup headlines opening day of the four-day 2024 Belmont Stakes Racing Festival, which will be held at Saratoga Race Course from Thursday, June 6 through Sunday, June 9.

Flemington Racecourse announcer Matt Hill will travel to Saratoga to call the race and will bring the 2024 Lexus Melbourne Cup trophy along with him. The 18-carat (gold) trophy has its own travel documentation to ensure it is exempt from export laws and taxes, and will be available for photo opportunities with fans throughout the live racing program on Thursday, June 6. The Cup is created from 34 gold pieces with over 200 hours craftsmanship and is valued at AUD\$600,000.

Godolphin's British homebred Siskany (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), trained by Lexus Melbourne Cup-winning trainer Charlie Appleby, won last year's Belmont Gold Cup and is slated to return to New York for the race.

"The Belmont Gold Cup has proven to be a strong race, attracting top marathon horses from North America and across Europe," said NYRA Senior Vice-President of Racing and Operations, Andrew Offerman. **Cont. p15**

"The addition of a 'Golden Ticket' to compete in one of the world's preeminent turf races only serves to heighten the profile of what is sure to be an exciting Festival in Saratoga."

VRC Executive General Manager Racing, Leigh Jordon, said, "The introduction of the Belmont Gold Cup as a golden ticket opens up another pathway for international staying horses to compete in the Lexus Melbourne Cup. The race is an already established international contest and we look forward to potentially welcoming this year's winner to Melbourne in the spring."

Even though he ran poorly in the Derby, Fierceness figures to make his presence felt in the Belmont. Classy but inconsistent and enigmatic, he seems to run well every other race. After a spectacular maiden win, he was beaten 20 1/4 lengths in the GI Champagne S. But Pletcher had enough confidence in the Mike Repole-owned homebred to ship him to Santa Anita for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, which he won by 6 1/4 lengths.

But old habits seem to die hard with this horse. He kicked off his 3-year-old campaign with a lackluster third-place finish in the GIII Holy Bull S. at Gulfstream before demolishing his opponents in the GI Florida Derby, which he won by 13 /2 lengths.

Pletcher has proven that he can take a horse that ran poorly in the Derby, freshen them up and then have them ready for a big effort in the Belmont. In 2013, Palace Malice (Curlin) won the Belmont for Pletcher after running 12th, beaten 13 1/2 lengths in the Derby. In 2017, Pletcher's Tapwrit (Tapit) won the Belmont after finishing sixth, beaten 10 1/4 lengths in the Derby. He has won the race four times.

Fierceness (City of Light), the beaten favorite in the GI Kentucky Derby, is scheduled to make his next start in the GI Belmont S. on June 8 in Saratoga.

"He has settled in well and we are pointing to the Belmont," trainer Todd Pletcher said in a text.

Sent off at 3-1, Fierceness finished 15th, beaten 24 1/2 lengths in the Derby.

When asked if his colt had any excuses in the Derby, Pletcher replied: "Perhaps too close to a fast pace? Stuck a little wide on both turns?"

Following the Derby, jockey John Velazquez told reporters: "His first jump was not very good. His second and third jump he was OK. He got pretty aggressive since I had to give him a nudge out of there. The horses on the outside put the pressure on and then he got into the bridle. I tried to keep him as settled as much without letting doing too much but he was already engaged. When I let him go, he just didn't have it."



MILA'S WISH COMES TRUE AT GULFSTREAM

When **Mila's Wish** (Cajun Breeze) just held on for a debut victory--and then survived a claim of foul--at Gulfstream Park Friday, track announcer Pete Aiello clued the crowd into what a special moment it was when he said, "You've heard of Cody's Wish. Here's the Florida version. Here's Mila's Wish." Much like the 2023 Horse of the Year who was named after the late Cody Dorman, the 2-year-old colt was making the wish of another youngster come true.

Mila Spillone is a 4-year-old battling Aicardi syndrome, a rare genetic disorder that has left her blind in one eye and, with low muscle tone, she is unable to walk or talk. The lifespan of someone with Aicardi syndrome is roughly 18 years. Michael Yates was able to make Mila's wish of having a horse named after her come true and the colt duly delivered with a dramatic first win Friday.

"A really good friend of mine, [bloodstock agent] Sean Perl, reached out to me," explained Yates, who trains the colt and bred and owns him in the name of his Shadybrook Farm. "His sister Jackie is director of special events for Make a Wish Southern Florida. And so that is how the connection was made. They were trying to find somebody who would grant Mila's wish to name a horse after her and I accepted the challenge. I thought it was a wonderful thing."

Yates was originally hoping to find a homebred filly to name after the little girl with the big wish, but ultimately picked a son of the gritty Cajun Breeze, whom he co-owned and trained to three stakes-placings in Florida.

"I couldn't decide which filly that I own to name that," Yates said. "The horses were getting closer to running. And this horse was showing some talent. I thought it would be a good horse to name after her. It was also [one] I bred and Sean Perl had actually picked the mare out for me when I bought [her]." **Cont.**

The 9-5 favorite in his first trip to the post Friday, Mila's Wish led from the start and was some two lengths clear at midstretch before just holding off the resurgent Lou (Brethren) by a head while running greenly late.

"I expected he would run well, but as with any 2-year-old, you never really know," Yates said. "But I expected he would run well, he had worked well."

Yates met Mila and her family for the first time Friday at Gulfstream.

"They were over the top elated," Yates reported. "And very grateful for us naming the horse after their daughter. They had a wonderful day here at the races."

Looking ahead to a next start for Mila's Wish, Yates said, "It's pretty early, but he's a Florida-bred and we are based here at Gulfstream. We will probably point forward to the first next step for the 2-year-olds as it comes along, which would probably be a 2-year-old stakes, if that comes about prior to an allowance race being written."

As for the inspiration for the colt's name, Mila's mother said, "Mila has overcome many challenges and each day is a blessing. She truly is a miracle."



BACK TO BACK YORKSHIRE CUPS FOR GIAVELLOTTO by Tom Frary

Friday's G2 Boodles Yorkshire Cup was all about **Giavellotto** (Ire) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}), as last year's winner returned in rude health to dominate for the repeat on York's Knavesmire. Readily reversing the form of his latest fifth to **Tower Of London** (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G2 Dubai Gold Cup, the Marco Botti-trained 5-year-old who started at 7-2 cruised to **Vauban** (Fr) (Galiway {GB}) two out and bounded into the clear for a 4 3/4-length success under Oisin Murphy. Gregory (GB) (Golden Horn {GB}) was a further 3/4 of a length behind Vauban in third as the 7-4 favourite Tower Of London disappointed in fifth.

With a promoted third in the G1 St Leger as a 3-year-old to add to his win in an up-to-scratch renewal of this race 12 months ago, clearly a mile and three quarters on a flat track is Giavellotto's bag. Beaten in all four starts over further including third placings in the G2 Lonsdale Cup here last August and in Riyadh's G3 Red Sea Turf H. in February, it is no surprise to learn that Botti is not considering Royal Ascot's G1 Gold Cup. "We've tried several times over two miles and while I'm not saying he doesn't stay, because he has run well a few times, it does stretch him. The Gold Cup trip is too far for him," he explained.

"He loves the track--he always shows his best form at York," his trainer added. "The race went to plan, he got into a nice rhythm and while he got to the front a little sooner than we wanted, he galloped all the way to the line. I was a bit shocked he was in front so early, he made them look slow today. The Irish St Leger I know is in September and the ground could be softer, but it was a race we considered last year and we didn't go but I would say that could be his target."

Botti is also considering a drop in trip for the winner. "We have been thinking of running him over a mile and a half eventually, we wouldn't rule it out. Between a mile and a half and two miles, I think I'd rather run him over shorter than further. He's definitely got stronger."

Vauban, who was having his first start since a disappointing

effort in the G1 Melbourne Cup, is Gold Cup-bound. "I was delighted, they'll be very happy with that," jockey William Buick said. "He's going to get further and he felt he was going to improve for that, so there are plenty of positives to take from it."

Royal Ascot is also on the agenda for last year's G2 Queen's Vase winner Gregory according to John Gosden. "I really liked the way he got his second wind and stayed on again," he said. "The plan is to go straight to the Gold Cup. He'll enjoy the distance."

There is not much now for sprinting 3-year-olds in France and she is not entered at [Royal] Ascot, so we will see how she comes out of this and formulate a plan in due course."

Reflecting on the performance of runner-up Classic Flower, Pauline Chehboub said, "She didn't have the best trip on the outside, but she looked a bit lazy and maybe she could do with a hood. Anyway we shall stick to the original plan and go to Royal Ascot for the [G1] Commonwealth Cup."

"We're delighted with him, he's a lovely horse," he said. "When he gets there he just waits, but Ryan was very happy with him. Ryan said he has plenty of speed left, all the speed is there, but he just pulls up when he gets there, he's just lazy. The plan was obviously the two runs and then go to Ascot, if everything is well with him then. It's amazing that he came back, it's great to have him back. He just has a lovely relaxed way of doing it."

BACK IN THE BIG TIME

by Tom Frary

Saturday sees the return of the sensational G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. winner **Big Rock (Fr)** (Rock Of Gibraltar {Ire}) in Newbury's G1 Al Shaqab Lockinge S., where it is a case of in at the deep end for the trainer if not for the colt in question. While Yeguada Centurion's 4-year-old has obviously been there and has the t-shirt, new handler Maurizio Guarnieri is in maiden territory with the powerhouse who so memorably destroyed the subsequent G1 Dubai Turf winner Facteur Cheval (Ire) (Ribchester {Ire}) by six lengths on British Champions Day at Ascot.

"I received the horse three weeks ago, so I am just starting to get to know him and he is just starting to get know me," Guarnieri explained. "He is a nice horse, like a nice man, he is quiet all the time and causes no problems, he is very easy. I did a canter with him on the racetrack at Chantilly with a lead horse and his rider Aurelien Lemaitre and he did the minimum, so I'm not sure if he is ready to run and what percent of his potential he is at or not. But his jockey said he is always this way and the horse is always quiet in the morning. A lot of good horses are this way."



Big Rock | Scoop Dyga

Big Rock's biggest issue will be that the ground is going to ride a fair bit livelier than at Ascot, perhaps more in line with that he encountered when coming off second best in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois and G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp. His next biggest issue is the fact that the mare who beat him so convincingly in the former contest at last year's Deauville August festival is in the line-up.

It is fair to say that Cheveley Park Stud's Breeders' Cup heroine Inspiral (GB) (Frankel {GB}) takes some knowing, so the absence of Frankie Dettori could be her main problem regardless of the undisputed talent of Kieran Shoemark. Scintillating on her seasonal bow in 2022 but overturned on her first run of last term, it is hard to know what to expect from the queen of Clarehaven as she bids to become her owner-breeders' third female to beat the colts in this after Russian Rhythm (Kingmambo) in 2004 and Peeress (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) in 2006.

Whereas Big Rock's connections would welcome rain, Cheveley Park Stud's Chris Richardson has fingers crossed it stays away. "We hope to run, we've declared, we'll just have to watch the forecast and see what happens," he said. "She didn't enjoy soft ground when she ran in the Sussex and it's still early in the year. We think she's in good form, but we don't want to risk her on ground which doesn't suit as she is unlikely to put her best foot forward."

"She seems to come good in June and maybe that is the way it will work out again. We'd like to get her out earlier if we can, but we'll see what happens between now and Saturday and see what John decides," he added, before pointing out that the G3 Criterion S. winner **Audience (GB)** (Iffraaj {GB}), a grandson of the aforementioned Peeress, is there to serve his illustrious stablemate. "The two of them have been working together for the last few weeks and he is in there to make sure there's pace in the race," he said. **Cont. p7**

Should the big two miss a beat, Nurlan Bizakov's Charyn (Ire) (Dark Angel (Ire)) will be poised to take advantage having cut an admirably professional figure on his two starts so far in 2024. A strong finisher at the trip, he holds Poker Face (Ire) (Fastnet Rock (Aus)) on the form of last month's G2 Sandown Mile and the Gosdens will know what how Inspiral compares having saddled the third in that contest, Lord North (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}).

"The rain won't harm Charyn, but he's a versatile horse in terms of ground and we won't mind conditions on Saturday," trainer Roger Varian said. "It's a nice position to be in when you are not sweating on the weather and he is in good form. I was very impressed with him at Sandown and he was very powerful through the line. He will have to do more to win the Lockinge, but he goes there as one of the frontrunners in the market and deservedly so, and it is exciting."

Poker Face is one of the "darker" horses in the line-up alongside Clipper Logistics' G2 Dullingham Park S. winner Flight Plan (GB) (Night Of Thunder {Ire}), who always gave the impression he would be a better 4-year-old last term. Also at Newbury, The King and The Queen's G1 St Leger third **Desert** Hero (GB) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) returns in the G3 Sky Sports Racing Aston Park S., while the Listed Haras de Bouquetot Fillies' Trial S. sees some Oaks prospects line up headed by Juddmonte's Sandown novice winner Siyola (Ire) (Siyouni {Fr}). The form of that win was boosted this week by the third Secret Satire (GB) (Advertise {GB})

STELLENBOSCH GUNNING FOR CLASSIC DOUBLE IN YUSHUN HIMBA by Heather Anderson

Katsumi Yoshida's **Stellenbosch (Jpn)** (Epiphaneia {Jpn}) is aiming to add a second Classic to her resume in Sunday's G1 Yushun Himba (Japanese Oaks).

Facing off against 17 other fillies, the daughter of the three-time winner Bloukrans (Jpn) (Rulership {Jpn}) will leave from gate seven under Keita Tosaki. She defeated her G1 Hanshin Juvenile Fillies conqueress Ascoli Piceno (Jpn) (Daiwa Major {Jpn}) and Listed Elfin S. heroine **Light Back (Jpn)** (Kizuna {Jpn}) in the G1 Oka Sho (Japanese 1000 Guineas) over 1600 metres back in April. If she prevails on Sunday, Stellenbosch would then be poised to become the eighth Japanese Fillies' Triple Crown winner and second in consecutive years after Liberty Island (Jpn) (Duramente {Jpn})'s heroics in 2023.

Trainer Sakae Kunieda said, "She didn't get a good position from the start last time, but the jockey did a great job to get her into the race, and she finished well to win with a bit in hand. She's had her usual break at Northern Farm Tenei, and she's returned to the stable refreshed. She weighed a little less for her last race, but the warmer weather is the reason for that."

Fourth in the Oka Sho after closing from last to miss by less than 1 1/4 lengths for all the glory, G2 Tulip Sho winner **Sweep Feet (Jpn)** (Suave Richard {Jpn}) returns for another crack at Stellenbosch. Trainer Yasushi Shono said, "She went to the farm after her last race, and returned to the stable at the end of April. She recovered quickly from her last run, and she was seen at her best in the Tulip Sho. This next race is at Tokyo, and she'll have to transport over for it, so she won't need such strong work in training. We'll just monitor her condition as we see things."

A filly trying Group 1 waters for the first time is last out G2 Sankei Sports Sho Flora S. heroine **Admire Belle (Jpn)** (Suave Richard {Jpn}), who was an even length in front of **Lavanda (Jpn)** (Silver State {Jpn}) in that 2000-metre affair on Apr. 21.

"The race worked out perfectly for her last time, by getting a good position in behind the leaders and biding her time," said trainer Yukihiro Kato of the Junko Kondo colourbearer. "She found a good rhythm, and completed the first five furlongs in about 60 seconds, and was then able to finish off strongly. On that run, the Oaks looks good for her."

Sunday Racing's pair of **Cervinia (Jpn)** (Harbinger {GB}) and **Queen's Walk (Jpn)** (Kizuna {Jpn}) are both Group 3 winners that ran unplaced in the Japanese 1000 Guineas and are looking for redemption.

Assistant trainer Taku Fukunaga said of Queen's Walk, "With a tightly packed field in the Oka Sho, it was difficult for her to find a good rhythm. It didn't matter so much about the final result, and since her break at Northern Farm Shigaraki, she's returned to the stable, where we have been tuning her up for this next race. Hopefully, she'll be able to show her best this time."

The G3 Flower Cup one-two **Mi Anhelo (Jpn)** (Duramente {Jpn}) and **Hohelied (Jpn)** (Rulership {Jpn}) are also in the line up and leave from gates one and eight, respectively.
