



DOZEN DECLARED FOR OAKS INCLUDING BECKETT QUARTET

Twelve fillies will line up in Friday's G1 Betfred Oaks at Epsom, with Aidan O'Brien set to be represented by a duo headed by the likely favourite and **TDN Rising Star Ylang Ylang (GB)** (Frankel {GB}) drawn on the outside in 12. Ryan Moore sticks with last year's G1 Fillies' Mile winner, with Wayne Lordan on the stable's Listed Lingfield Oaks Trial runner-up **Rubies Are Red** (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) who has drawn six. Their compatriot **Ezeliya** (Fr) (Dubawi {Ire}), The Aga Khan homebred from the Dermot Weld stable who captured the G3 Salsabil S., will be next door in five.

Ralph Beckett's quartet is made up of the Listed Cheshire Oaks first and third Forest Fairy (Ire) (Waldgeist {GB}) and Seaward (Ire) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) and the Lingfield Oaks Trial first and fourth You Got To Me (GB) (Nathaniel {Ire}) and Treasure (GB) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}), with the latter representing The King and The Queen.

Beckett is hoping the numerical approach can pay off. "We've done quite well in the race before, but it's a long time since I won it last with Talent, and since then nobody but Aidan O'Brien and the Gosdens has won. We've had plenty of tries since, but this feels like our best chance," he said.

CLASSIC TRAINER TOMPKINS BIDDING TO BE CLASSIC BREEDER

Mark Tompkins retired from the Newmarket training ranks in 2019 with his highest-profile winner having been the 1993 St Leger winner Bob's Return (Ire) (Bob Back). The final black-type victory of his career came with Brushing (GB), a homebred daughter of Medicean (GB), who landed the Listed Galtres S. at York as well as the Cumberland Plate.

Tompkins is now hopeful that by Friday afternoon he can add Classic-winning breeder to his list of achievements as Brushing's daughter, the Lingfield Oaks Trial winner You Got To Me (GB) (Nathaniel {Ire}), lines up for the Betfred Oaks as one of four runners from Ralph Beckett's stable. In what could be a big weekend for the family, You Got To Me's half-brother Ziggy (GB) (Sixties Icon {GB}) holds an entry at Epsom in the Northern Dancer Handicap on the Derby undercard. Cont. p6

"I think the market has them about right in terms of preference, although it got it wrong in 2013," Beckett added. "I may have had three runners in a race a few times, but I'm pretty sure I've never had four before. Let's hope one of them is competitive!

"Forest Fairy was very backward and immature and she had an issue at two and so didn't come to us until October. We were surprised that she was able to win like that first time out and then because her work on turf at home was good we decided to take her to Chester for the trial. You would hope she'd come forward again for that, based on her inexperience.

"We'll do a few things differently to manage You Got To Me, and we'll be putting some different kit in her mouth. She's a tall, sparely-made filly who doesn't carry a lot of condition, so she doesn't need much training, but she appears to take her racing well. She did well to hold on at Lingfield after going so hard, although Aidan's filly Rubies Are Red came from Brighton virtually and will be tough to beat.

"Seaward has trained well since the Cheshire Oaks and I was quite keen to come. I'd be less keen on her chance if the ground is slower than good. As for Treasure, we had been edging more towards the Ribblesdale, but we've had a change of heart. She's trained very well since then and ground on the easy side will be in her favour. It will be very exciting to have a runner in a Classic for The King and The Queen."

Other notables are the G3 Musidora S. scorer Secret Satire (GB) (Advertise {GB}) from the Andrew Balding yard in stall three and Godolphin's Dance Sequence (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) in two. Last year's G3 Weld Park S. winner Caught U Looking (Ire) (Harzand {Ire}) is in stall one, often seen as disadvantageous here, while fellow outsiders Making Dreams (Ire) (Make Believe {GB}) and War Chimes (Fr) (Summer Front) make up the field.

Friday's G1 Holland Cooper Coronation Cup will see five runners, headed by the defending title-holder Emily Upjohn (GB) (Sea The Stars {Ire}). Jean-Louis Bouchard's G1 Grand Prix de Paris-winning TDN Rising Star Feed The Flame (GB) (Kingman (GB) adds welcome French representation in a race the nation has succeeded in on several occasions, while Ballydoyle rely on stalwart Luxembourg (Ire) (Camelot {GB}).

THE LOWDOWN: BETFRED OAKS

A royal runner in this fillies' Classic at a meeting which her late breeder, Queen Elizabeth II, rarely missed, is just one highlight of an intriguing Oaks field. The runners range from the top-priced, seven-figure filly at Tattersalls October Book 1 to a ${\in}27,\!000$ Goffs Autumn yearling purchase, with four smart homebreds in play as well.

CAUGHT U LOOKING (Ire)

Harzand (Ire)--Wild Mix (GB), by Mastercraftsman (Ire)

Bred by Peter Kelly, she was sold by The Castlebridge Consignment for €27,000 to Peter Nolan and Noel Meade at the Goffs Autumn Yearling Sale. However, Kelly remained involved in the ownership of the filly, along with Tally Ho-Stud's Tony O'Callaghan, who bought into her after the sale.

Caught U Looking gained plenty of experience last year and has always shaped as though she would do even better when upped to 1m4f. Everything in her pedigree suggests she will be at her best when stepping up to the Oaks trip and maybe even beyond that. Not only did her granddam win over 1m4f, but she is also a half-sister to High Accolade (GB) (Mark Of Esteem {Ire}), who finished second in the St Leger. There is no doubt that Caught U Looking rates as one of the more interesting outsiders and is one to keep onside at a big price despite the fact that she was held by Ezeliya when fourth on her return in the G3 Salsabil S. at Naas.

DANCE SEQUENCE (GB)

Dubawi (Ire)--Tearless (GB), by Street Cry (Ire)

This Godolphin homebred has always been held in high regard and was not disgraced in the 1,000 Guineas when turning the tables on her Nell Gwyn conqueror Pretty Crystal (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), albeit well-held in ninth. She is a half-sister to smart 7f performer Romantic Song (Ire) (Shamardal) and solid stayer New Comedy (Ire) (Sea The Stars {Ire}). Her dam was something of a slow burner who won a Listed race over a mile and also tasted victory over 1m2f, while granddam Playful Act (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), a three-part-sister to Nathaniel (Ire) and Irish Oaks winner Great Heavens (GB), won the Lancashire Oaks before finishing second in the Irish Oaks. Dance Sequence is an undoubtedly classy filly who represents top connections and could well feature if handling this step up in trip.

EZELIYA (FR)

Dubawi (Ire)--Eziyra (Ire) (Teofilo (Ire))

The Aga Khan homebred opened her account at the second attempt as a two-year-old, before returning from seven months off with a determined victory in the G3 Salsabil S. Cont. p4

She is the second winner from as many runners out of her G2 Blandford S.-winning dam, who was also Group 1-placed on multiple occasions. Her Listed-placed granddam, Eytarna (Ire) (Dubai Destination), produced a total of four black-type performers and is related to G1 Irish Oaks and G1 Prix Royal-Oak heroine Ebadiyla (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), G1 Moyglare Stud S. victrix Edabiya (Ire) (Rainbow Quest) and G1 Gold Cup winners Estimate (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}) and Enzeli (Ire) (Kahyasi {Ire}).

FOREST FAIRY (IRE)

Waldgeist (GB)--Bahama Girl (Ire) (Lope De Vega (Ire))

Bred by Philip and Orla Hore, she sold to bloodstock agent Alex Elliott and trainer Ralph Beckett for €78,000 as a Goffs Orby yearling.

This filly is unbeaten in two starts having followed her

wide-margin debut victory at Wolverhampton with a gutsy success in the Listed Cheshire Oaks, becoming the first stakes winner for her sire in the process. She is the first foal out of a granddaughter of the G1 Deutsches Derby and G1 Grosser Preis von Baden heroine Borgia (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}), whose daughter Born Wild (Ger) (Sadler's Wells) produced the G1 Prix Vermeille winner Baltic Baroness (Ger) (Shamardal).

MAKING DREAMS (Ire) (Make Believe {GB})--Sweet Dream (GB), by Oasis Dream (GB)

Bred by the Morera Partnership, Making Dreams was bought by Nick Bradley and Karl Burke for 33,000gns at the Tattersalls Somerville Yearling Sale. She was consigned by Manor Farm.

A battle-hardened filly who has made remarkable strides considering she was beaten in a seller at Chester on her third start as a juvenile, and it wouldn't be a big surprise if Making Dreams were to out-run her odds again. She is the fifth foal out of Sweet Dreams, who won a maiden at two but was well held in the Cheshire Oaks and failed to reach the frame in three starts as a three-year-old. However, Sweet Dreams is a half-sister to three individual winners, including the classy Tidespring (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}), who became the dam of Group 2-winning stayer Trawlerman (Ire) (Golden Horn {GB}). Meanwhile, her other half-sister Loveisthehigherlaw (GB) (Kodiac {GB}) won a

Listed race in Germany over 1m3f. While she was held by War Chimes in the Prix Saint-Alary and is unproven over this trip, Making Dreams boasts a likeable profile and shouldn't be underestimated.

RUBIES ARE RED (IRE)

Galileo (Ire)--Red Evie (Ire) (Intikhab)

The Coolmore homebred is still a maiden after three starts but thoroughly deserving of her place in the field, having caught the eye when finishing a never-nearer second in the Listed Oaks Trial Fillies' S. at Lingfield.

She is the fifth black-type performer by Galileo out of the G1 Matron S. and G1 Lockinge S. winner Red Evie, with the others including the GI Breeders' Cup Turf and G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe heroine Found (Ire) and the G3 Give Thanks S. scorer Best In The World (Ire), perhaps best known as the dam of

Snowfall (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}), who numbered this Classic among her three Group 1 victories in 2021.

SEAWARD (Ire)

(Sea The Stars {Ire})--Zvarkhova (Fr), by Makfi (GB)

Offered by her breeder
Loughtown Stud at the Goffs
Orby Sale, Seaward was knocked
down to Hugo Merry for
€460,000.

Held by her stablemate Forest Fairy in the Cheshire Oaks but she is an unexposed type who represents a stable with an excellent record in this race. Her

dam is a half-sister to classy handicapper GM Hopkins (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) and was Listed-placed in France before winning in America. Family goes back to 2,000 Guineas winner Mark Of Esteem (Ire).

SECRET SATIRE (GB)

Advertise (GB)--Secret Pursuit (Ire) (Lawman (Fr))

Guy Brook's homebred has stamina to prove but impressed with the turn of foot she showed when causing an upset in the G3 Musidora S., beating the subsequent Listed winner Francophone (GB) (Study Of Man {Ire}) by two lengths.

A first Group 1 runner for Advertise, she is the fourth winner from as many runners out of her Listed-winning dam, with the others including the Listed-placed Secret Solace (GB) (Gleneagles {Ire}). Her second dam, Secret Melody (Fr) (Inchinor {GB}), won the G3 Oppenheim-Stuten-Meile and has also produced the G3 Prix des Chenes and G3 Prix du Palais-Royal hero Pearl Flute (Ire) (Piccolo {GB}), while her fourth dam, Secret Form (GB) (Formidable), won the Prix de l'Opera when it was run as a Group 2 and was runner-up in both the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches and G1 Prix de Diane.

TREASURE (GB)

Mastercraftsman (Ire)--Shimmering Light (GB), by Dubawi (Ire)

Treasure, bred by Queen Elizabeth II and raced by King Charles III and Queen Camilla, boasts a big pedigree despite the fact that her dam failed to win in eight starts. Shimmering Light is a

half-sister to eight individual winners, five of which achieved ratings in excess of 100. The include Wavering (Ire) (Refuse To Bend (Ire)), who won the G1 Prix Saint-Alary, while another half-sister, Winters Moon (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}), was Group 1-placed herself before becoming the dam of multiple Group 1 winner and exciting first-season sire Earthlight (Ire). Treasure won her only start at two and shaped like a lovely filly for the future when fourth to stablemate You Got To Me in the Lingfield Oaks Trial.

YLANG YLANG (GB)

Frankel (GB)--Shambolic (Ire) (Shamardal)

Bred by Newsells Park Stud and Merry Fox Stud, she was the most expensive filly at Tattersalls October Book 1 when selling to MV Magnier and White Birch Farm for 1,500,000gns.

Successful in the G1 Fillies' Mile and G3 Silver Flash S. as a two-year-old, she ran the perfect Oaks trial when finishing a staying-on fifth in the G1 1,000 Guineas at Newmarket on her return to action.

She is the first foal out of her Listed-placed dam, a half-sister to the dual G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup hero and multiple Hong Kong champion Viva Pataca (GB) (Marju {Ire}), who raced as Comic Strip when trained in Newmarket by Sir Mark Prescott. She is also related to the GI Flower Bowl Invitational and GI Diana S. heroine Laughing (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) and to the dam of the Listed scorer and G3 Lillie Langtry S.-placed Twitch (Ire) (Azamour {Ire}). The family includes the multiple graded-stakes

scorer and sire Brave Act (GB), while the fourth dam is the champion two-year-old filly Circus Ring (Ire) (High Top {Ire}).

YOU GOT TO ME (GB) Nathaniel (Ire)--Brushing (GB) (Medicean {GB})

Bred by Dullingham Park Stud and Sarabex, she first sold to BBA Ireland for 62,000gns at the Tattersalls December Foal Sale. She was later bought by Alex Elliott for 200,000gns at Tattersalls October Book 1.

This filly showed a good

attitude when holding off Rubies Are Red to win the Lingfield Oaks Trial, racing clear for much of the race and digging deep when challenged in the straight. Her Listed-winning dam hails from the family of the GII Bay Meadows H. winner Wait Till Monday (Ire) (Maelstrom lake {Ire}), the G3 C. L. Weld Park S. winner Token Gesture (Ire) (Alzao) - who is in turn the dam of the GI Canadian International hero Relaxed Gesture (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) - and the GII All American Derby winner Evolving Tactics (Ire) (Machiavellian).

WAR CHIMES

(Summer Front)--Chipolata (Fr), by Muhtathir (GB)

Bred by Nicolas Clement, Hubert Honore and Christophe Clement, War Chimes was bought by her trainer David Menuisier for €62,000 when offered by Haras des Capucines at the October Yearling Sale at Arqana.

War Chimes won't lack fitness having run twice already this season but she failed to land a blow in a Group 2 event in France last time and her overall form leaves her with work to do. She is the first foal out of a dual winner in France over 6f and 7f respectively and the pedigree goes back to the prolific Chipiron (Fr) (Rio De La Plata), who won 10 times between 1m4f and 1m7f. Has a preference for soft ground, so the more rain the better.

"Her granddam belonged to some owners of mine and we always loved her so when they retired we inherited her," said Tompkins, the former owner of Dullingham Park Stud, which he sold to fellow Yorkshireman Steve Parkin in 2022. Parkin became a Classic-winning breeder himself on Sunday when Fallen Angel (GB) (Too Darn Hot {GB}) landed the Irish 1,000 Guineas.

"Steve breeds under the name of Branton Court Stud and he's had a really good weekend. I wish him good luck at Dullingham Park," he added.

Tompkins bred You Got To Me in partnership with Richard Marriott, who operates under the Sarabex banner.

He explained, "Richard always had horses with me in training, and mares when we had the stud. Now all the mares have gone over to Stuart Thom's Galloway Stud at Woburn. He does a great job."

Tompkins and Marriott sold You Got To Me as a foal through the National Stud for 62,000gns. Returned to Book 1 in the draft of Glenvale Stud, she made 200,000gns when bought by Alex Elliott on behalf of co-owner Valmont. Newsells Park Stud, which stands her sire Nathaniel, who is already the sire of an Oaks and a Derby winner in Enable (GB) and Desert Crown (GB), also owns a share in the filly.

The former trainer has resisted any temptation he might have had to make enquiries of You Got To Me's progress at Beckett's Kimpton Down Stables.

"I haven't really been in touch with Ralph but we've followed her along," he said. "We sold her as a foal and then she ended up with Ralph, which we were really pleased about, and she looks pretty useful.

"We still have a Time Test two-year-old filly out of the mare. We've just had her broken in but we don't know where she is going to go into training yet, and she has a Pinatubo foal. Brushing has gone back to Nathaniel this year."

The breeders are still involved with Ziggy, who is trained by Harry Eustace and has won three of his 14 starts, including finishing runner-up on his most recent outing at Epsom in the City and Suburban Handicap.

"He's been pretty good," says Tompkins, who adds of You Got To Me, "She stays well, the family all do, and she's very genuine. I think she has a chance if she can just not use up too much early on and there's not too much rain. But she will stay and she will handle the track."

Despite the excitement of being represented in the Oaks as a breeder, the Classic-winning trainer says that he won't be attending Epsom on Friday.

He adds, "I'm quite superstitious so I think I'll just have to let her run without being there."

BETFRED DERBY TO BE AVAILABLE FROM RECORD NUMBER OF BROADCASTERS

The total number of broadcasters that will stream the G1 Betfred Derby at Epsom Downs Racecourse live will increase to a record 36 on Saturday, June 1, The Jockey Club announced on Wednesday.

Television viewers in more than 160 territories will be able to watch the iconic Flat race after the efforts of Racecourse Media Group (RMG), Jockey Club Racecourses and HBA Media. New broadcasters include Sportsnet (Canada), Transvision (Indonesia), NTV (Mongolia), Racing.com and Entain (Australia), and Sport 24 and Anuvu (airlines and cruiselines). There will also be a variety of on-site broadcasters among them Fanduel (U.S.), Sky Racing Thoroughbred Central from Australia, and the Dubai Racing Channel, as well as domestic channels ITV and Racing TV, the rest of Europe is well-covered (Virgin Media, Viaplay, Setanta, Equidia, Polsat, SilkNet, Wedo TV), Africa (SuperSport, Racing 240, Gallop TV), Japan (Green Channel), Hong Kong (HKJC, Cable TV, TVB, Now TV), and Latin American and Caribbean (ESPN / Star +, SportsMax). There are also new syndication deals with news sites Reuters and SNTV. Overall, there are 41 broadcasters in total lined up to take coverage, including CNN International, Trans World Sports, and SPN (Sony) (Indian sub-continent) which will show the race in various iterations. Pan-European coverage has been secured through another first-time deal with Eurovision Sport OTT platform, which will show the full World Feed in 20 new European territories. Cont. p7

BUMPER ENTRY STILL IN CONTENTION FOR INAUGURAL GOWRAN CLASSIC

A total of 35 horses have stood their ground for the inaugural Irish Stallion Farms EBF Gowran Classic, which will be run at Gowran Park on Monday, June 3.

The richest race in the history of the scenic Kilkenny racetrack, the Gowran Classic offers prize-money down to tenth place, with a total purse of €200,000. In addition, the winner will receive an automatic free entry into the G1 Dubai Duty Free Irish Derby at the Curragh on Sunday, June 30.

The Gowran Classic is the culmination of the Spring Series, which was introduced to provide more opportunities for three-year-old middle-distance horses with a median price of no more than €75,000. The total prize-money for the series is €330,000, with a minimum fund of €25,000 per race.

Of the 35 entries, the Ger Lyons-trained Wendla (GB) (Ulysses {Ire}) is a potential class act following her victory in the G3 Al Shira'aa Racing "Mutamakina" S. at Leopardstown, while Spring Series winner Harbour Gem (Ire) (Zoffany {Ire}) and Ocean Of **Dreams (Ire)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) appeal as likely improvers for

the powerful yards of Dermot Weld and Aidan O'Brien, respectively.

British-based runners from the yards of Karl Burke, William Haggas, Charlie Johnston and Charlie Hills could also line up in the Gowran Classic, the headline event at the Bank Holiday fixture which will be free to attend thanks to the sponsorship of the Irish National Professional Bookmakers Association.

Nessa Joyce, Irish EBF manager, said, "The €200,000 Irish EBF Gowran Classic is the centrepiece of the new Spring Series, offering greater opportunities to three-year-old middle-distance horses. It is encouraging to see Harbour Gem, a Spring Series winner, entered and in with a chance to take some of the prize money which is all the way down to tenth place.

"Another exciting element for the winner is an automatic free entry to the Dubai Duty Free Irish Derby, hopefully we are cheering on the Gowran Classic winner at the Curragh. The Irish EBF board are very grateful for the tremendous support given by every one of the 24 trainers and owners with entries in the €200,000 Irish Stallion Farms EBF Gowran Classic and we are keen to firmly establish the Spring Series and Gowran Classic in the Irish racing programme for years to come."

WOOTTON BASSETT GELDING TOPS MAY POINT-TO-POINT AND HORSES-IN-TRAINING **SALE**

Four-year-old gelding Arslan (Fr) (Wootton Bassett {GB}) (lot 10), who filled the runner-up spot on his point-to-point debut at Tralee last weekend, topped Wednesday's Tattersalls Ireland May Point-to-Point and Horses-in-Training Sale when selling to Harold Kirk and trainer Willie Mullins for €180,000.

Bred by Al Shaqab Racing, Arslan is out of the dual Grade I-winning mare Harmonious (Dynaformer) and was consigned by Richard Black of Ballinapark Stables, who had purchased him in France last July for €28,000.

"This is a beautiful horse, by a fantastic sire and with a pedigree," said Kirk. "I loved him in his point-to-point--he could be a two miler, could be a mile-and-a-half Flat horse or he could be a good hurdler. He has shown he can jump, but he could do two jobs and we are hoping he will make a good dual-purpose type."

Arslan was one of two lots to sell for over €100,000, with the other being the Zarak (Fr) mare Dippedinmoonlight (Ire) (lot 5), who won by 40 lengths on her debut at Inchydoney last weekend. Consigned by Daragh Barry's Furziestown Stables, she is out of a half-sister to the 14-time Group 1 winner Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) and was bought by trainer Emmet Mullins for €130,000. Cont. p8

"We are delighted," said Berry. "It was a quick turnaround, but things happen for luck and it's great that she is going to Emmet Mullins. We were quietly confident on Sunday but what she did was a bit special so I hope she goes on and proves it for the lads."

The sale was arranged in the space of just two weeks after consignors expressed a need for an additional point-to-point sale after the poor weather this spring altered so many training and running plans. Of the 23 lots offered, 16 sold (70% clearance rate) for an aggregate spend of $\[ifnger$ 718,500. The average was $\[ifnger$ 44,906 and the median was $\[ifnger$ 32,500.

He came well though, I wanted to get one more run into him before going to [Royal] Ascot and he'll go for the [Listed] Windsor Castle. He is tough and we don't know how good he is as he is very lazy, but yet he always seems to get there. His biggest attribute for Ascot is his relaxed temperament, which is what you need, and he has a bit of pace." Sir Yoshi is the second foal and scorer produced by Listed Prix de la Calonne and Listed Prix de la Pepiniere runner-up Johara (Ire) (Iffraaj (GB)), herself a granddaughter of G3 Prix des Reservoirs victrix and G1 Prix Saint-Alary third Summertime Legacy (GB) (Darshaan {GB}). Summertime Legacy is the dam of the Group 1-winning duo Mandaean (GB) (Manduro {Ger}) and Wavering (Ire) (Refuse To Bend (Ire)) and the second dam of dual Group 1-winning sire Earthlight (Ire) (Shamardal). MARIAMIA GOES TO YULONG'S PARTNER ZHIJUN ZHAO FOR \$1.8 MILLION

It was another big day at the Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale with the top echelon of mares attracting plenty of bidding attention with the Group 1 winning sprinter Mariamia (Aus) (Toronado {Ire}) the most popular mare selling for A\$1.8 million.

At A Glance:

- The day two topper was Mariamia (Toronado {Ire}) purchased by Zhijun Zhao for A\$1.8 million--higher than last year when Zenaida (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) headed to the same farm for A\$1.4 million.
- After two days of trading the average sits at A\$234,735 which compares nicely with last year's opening two-day average of A\$233,351, whilst the median of A\$100,000 is down from A\$110,000.
- There were 323 lots sold over the two days. This year's gross sits at A\$75,819,500 with a clearance rate of 80.75%.

- Three of the sale's overall top 10 sellers went through the ring on Wednesday.
- Zhijun Zhao remains the biggest buyer with eight mares for an average in excess of A\$1.6 million and a gross of A\$13.125 million.
- Newgate are the most prolific vendors--44 sold for an average of A\$356,341 and a gross beyond A\$15.6 million.
- Amongst the horses represented by at least three lots, I Am Invincible (Aus) boasts the highest averages both as sire and as covering sire.

Mariamia A Great Result For Newhaven

The day's topper came late in the day with Mariamia (Toronado {Ire}) purchased by Zhijun Zhao for A\$1.8 million--a lovely profit margin for Newhaven Stud who bought the talented bay for A\$335,000 online two years ago.

They had already fared very well out of Mariamia who improved off her benchmark form to win the G2 Expressway S. for her new owners and a couple of months later the G1 Galaxy.

Bred by Adam Sangster and purchased by Gasper Stellato for just A\$18,000 at the 2018 Inglis Melbourne Premier, Mariamia was bought by Newhaven to visit their resident stallion Xtravagant (NZ) but her Group 1 form demanded she be upgraded with I Am Invincible the obvious option.

It was a great decision by Newhaven with mares in foal to that champion sire proving exceptionally popular, though the stud's John Kelly was downplaying his foresight. "We got lucky!" he laughed. "It is a wonderful price, one that exceeded our expectations."

Keen to continue Newhaven's reputation as high class sellers, Kelly added, "We like to bring quality to the ring whether it be weanlings, yearlings or broodmares and we thought that this was a good time to sell Mariamia." Cont. p12

Hailing from a Victorian family--one of those that always seems to have a good one--Mariamia is out of Quinta Lago (Aus) (Encosta De Lago {Aus}) whose stakes-placed dam Flying Spice (Aus) (Flying Spur {Aus}) is the granddam of the G1 VRC Derby winner Warning (Aus) (Declaration Of War).

Biscayne Bay - Another in Foal to Vinnie

Yarraman Stud enjoyed success early in the day as vendors, selling for A\$1.2 million to the Panthalassa Syndicate the classy mare **Biscayne Bay (Aus)** (Sebring {Aus}).

The Widden Stud bred mare--a A\$410,000 Magic Millions yearling--was a good filly for the Ciaron Maher & David Eustace stable, winning two races and finishing in the placings in stakes company on three occasions, including a game third off an awkward start in the G1 VRC Oaks won by Willowy (Aus) (Kermadec {NZ}).

Retired to stud last spring, the attractive bay was served by I Am Invincible, getting in foal first time.

"She is a magnificent style of mare," said Yarraman's Matthew Scown, describing the 5-year-old as "a very versatile racehorse."

"And she has a great attitude which no doubt she will pass on to her progeny."

"We thought I Am Invincible was a really good mating for her," Troy Stephens, representing her new owners, agreed.

"She is carrying a beautiful pregnancy," he said, noting that with her 4 X 3 cross of Danehill that she looks a good match for "one of our young stallions like Pierata (Aus)."

"She is a gorgeous stakes winning Sebring mare who ran third in an Oaks and we thought she was really well bought."

Biscayne Bay's dam Fratianne (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}) has been a regular visitor to Zoustar (Aus) in recent years, her yearling colt by him fetching A\$400,000 (to Vinery) in January.

Also dam of the G2 Reisling S. winner Tenley (Aus) (Medaglia d'Oro), Fratianne is a granddaughter of the dual Group 1 winning high class broodmare Skating (Aus) (At Talaq).

Bester Goes For Frankel Factor

"The thought of a Group 1-placed mare in foal to Frankel {GB}) was very enticing," said James Bester after he purchased, on behalf of Morning Rise Stud, **Grande Dame (GB)** (Lope de Vega {Ire}) for A\$1.2 million.

A lightly raced and talented import who won two of her eight starts, including the Listed Distaff S. at Sandown, Grande Dame was third in the G1 Sun Chariot S. and placed at Group 3 and Listed level.

Bred by Whatton Manor Stud out of the internationally prolific Natalma (Native Dancer) family, Grande Dame is part of a Morning Rise plan to play at the top end of the game, with Bester saying that "If you are not playing at that level you might as well not play!"

Also involved in the purchase (for A\$1.4 million) of Legacies (Aus) (Justify) yesterday, Morning Rise are certainly upgrading their broodmare band and Bester is looking forward to the arrival of their Frankel foal.

"He is the world's best stallion--well if Justify isn't," he joked, pointing out Frankel's outstanding statistics including an 11.7% per cent group winner to runner strike rate.

"Most world class stallions have 10% stakes winners to

runners," he said, also impressed by the super stallion's Australian record, with 17 stakes winners amongst his 64 local winners from 91 runners.

Frankel has had just six runners out of Lope de Vega mares so far; four being winners including the Group 3 filly Halfday (Fr) who has looked good winning two of her first three starts.

Zoustar Mare Glistens

It was the third time through the Magic Millions sales ring for

Glistening (Aus) (Zoustar {Aus}), who in 2020 was purchased by James Harron and the Freedman brothers for A\$250,000. For that stable she won two of her 10 starts, including the G2 Reisling S., before being reoffered as a broodmare two years ago. James Harron again had his hand up that day, purchasing her for Morningside Park for A\$775,000 who sent her to Written Tycoon (Aus).

Sadly that foal died but she got back in foal last year and today she was sold with a late October service to the champion sire I Am Invincible to Kia Ora Stud for A\$950,000.

Kia Ora's Shane Wright said that he was happy to secure a top end mare today having found similar mares harder to buy vesterday.

"We did buy a few mares for our stallions on the first day but nothing at this level," he said, pleased with the price paid for this smart mare.

"When you look at the prices in the racehorse section we have to be happy," he added. "Glistening won a proper 2-year-old race and she is a lovely mare to add to our broodmare band.

"We will take her home and work out who she goes to--it is wide open. She could go back to I Am Invincible or maybe go to Snitzel (Aus)--she is the sort of mare who could produce something special."

Glistening is out of the G3 Gold Coast Guineas winner Beethog (Aus) (Shovhog {Aus}) who is still at stud, served last spring by Jacquinot (Aus). Her 2-year-old Zouper Fellow (Aus) (Zousain {Aus})--a A\$120,000 Easter yearling--is a member of the Michael Freedman stable.

La Dragontea Proves Popular

The second high priced mare by her high achieving sire for the day, **La Dragontea (GB)** (Lope de Vega {Ire}) was sold by Rosemont Stud to the nearby Baystone Farm whose Dean Harvey was very happy with the "good package" he secured for A\$900,000 for long term clients.

"She is a well performed international mare in foal to one of the hottest stallions in the country," he said of the imported mare who was sold with an October 24 service to Darley's exciting first-season stallion Too Darn Hot (GB).

"In a couple of years mares in foal to him are going to be worth more," he said, pleased with not only the pregnancy but with the quality of La Dragontea who raced well in Canada, England, America and Australia.

The winner of four of her 22 starts, the 7-year-old won the GII Canadian S. at Woodbine and was second in the GI EP Taylor S. at that same track. She was also Grade III-placed at Aqueduct and second to Foxy Frida (Aus) (Foxwedge {Aus}) in the Listed Centaurea S. at Morphettville.

Julian Blaxland/Rosemont Stud had purchased La Dragontea for \$1,375,000 (A\$2,074,844) at Fasig-Tipton November in 2021.

La Dragontea's dam is a Sadler's Wells three-quarter sister to the European champion 3-Year-old colt Montjeu (Ire) from the family of fellow Group 1 winners Again (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), Aclaim (Ire), Goldream (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) and Galileo Gold (GB) (Paco Boy {Ire}).

Annavisto; a Sharp Mare

As the winner of seven of her 19 starts, including two runnings of the G3 Frances Tressady S., **Annavisto (NZ)** (Reliable Man {GB}) was going to prove popular and so it transpired with Ridgmont and Clarke Bloodstock going to A\$850,000 to secure her from the Widden Stud draft.

Claimed only late when a game second to Nimalee (Aus) (So You Think {NZ}) in the G1 Queen Of The Turf S., Annavisto was retired to stud last spring and served by Toronado (Ire), giving

her foal three strains of Sadler's Wells.

A daughter of the dual Listed winner Avisto (NZ) (Tavistock {NZ}), Annavisto was well admired by Jim Clarke who said, "She is a lovely mare physically and she was very talented.

"She has a good race record--her Group 1 placing was a great performance--and she was sharper than many of the Reliable Mans.

"She is in foal to a very good young stallion and she has a versatile pedigree so there are a lot of options for her. We will get her home and see where she fits in--she will of course be mated commercially. Toronado is going well here and in Hong Kong and being in foal to him made us go for that one last bid."

Still owned by Annavisto's breeders Nearco Stud, Avisto was served last spring by Satono Aladdin (Jpn) having lost her previous foal by Reliable Man.

Frankel Again

Not surprisingly mares in foal to Frankel (GB) continued to prove popular and Lolloping (War Front) was snapped up for A\$750,000 by Boomer Bloodstock.

A mare with a lovely international pedigree, she is out of the G1 Railway S. winner Bounding (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}) whose G3 Blue Diamond Prelude winning dam Believe 'N' Succeed (Aus) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}) also produced the G1 Epsom Derby winner Anthony Van Dyck (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

A good buy on her own, the Frankel inside her was an excellent bonus.

"It is a pretty rare package," said Boomer's Craig Rounsefell. "She is by a champion sire out of a champion mare who is a half-sister to a champion, and she is a good looking mare. We will take her to Three Bridges Thoroughbreds and work out a mating for her."

Boomer Bloodstock also purchased a lifetime breeding right (Lot 396) in Pierata for A\$250,000. Widden Stud had went to the same amount for another breeding right (Lot 394) in the Yulong stallion.

LOUISIANA RACING COMMISSION TO LOOSEN DRUG REGULATIONS, INCL. ON CLENBUTEROL

The Louisiana Racing Commission has passed a set of emergency rules set to go into effect on June 8 that will create what are arguably the most lenient set of medication regulations in the sport. The withdrawal times for several medications have been reduced, and the list includes the controversial bronchodilator Clenbuterol. It can now be given to a horse within 72 hours of its racing.

Louisiana, a state that does not fall under control of the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority (HISA), currently follows guidelines established by the Association of Racing Commissioners International (ARCI). Under the ARCI rules, the withdrawal time for Clenbuterol is 14 days prior to a race.

The HISA rules on Clenbuterol, a drug that is believed to act like a steroid and build muscle mass, are even more strict. Clenbuterol can be prescribed by a veterinarian for a duration not to exceed 30 days in a six-month period. After the horse is administered Clenbuterol, the covered horse shall be placed on the veterinarians' list and shall not be eligible to participate in a workout or race until blood samples have been taken that show that the drug is no longer in the horse's system. *Cont. p3*

BAFFERT: SURGERY GOES WELL FOR

Surgery to repair a condylar fracture in **Mr Fisk** (Arrogate)'s right front foreleg was successful, said trainer Bob Baffert on Wednesday morning.

Mr Fisk won the GII Hollywood Gold Cup over stablemate Reincarnate (Good Magic) on Monday, but felt 'off' in the gallop-out, according to his jockey, Kazushi Kamura.

The fracture was later revealed on X-rays.

The surgery to insert two screws into the leg was performed by Dr. Ryan Carpenter at the Southern California Equine Foundation Hospital on the backside at Santa Anita.


"He had his surgery, and it went well, so now we just have to wait four months and reassess how it heals," said Baffert. "He looks good, he's back in stall, and he looks bright."

Under HISA, any trainer violating the Clenbuterol rules faces a suspension of up to two years.

Why the racing commission made these changes, which it called "Active Emergency Rules of Racing," is unclear. The *TDN* placed calls to the commission's executive director Stephen Landry and assistant executive director Gerald Calogero. By deadline for this story, neither racing executive had returned those phone calls.

In loosening up the rules regarding medications, the Louisiana Racing Commission went against a trend in the sport, which has largely cut back on the use of medications and in particular Clenbuterol.

ACRI President Ed Martin made it clear he was not in favor of the changes.

"Our withdrawal time is 14 days and they've set it at 72 hours. That's a huge change," Martin said. "I do not understand the reasons for this and I don't understand why this was an emergency rule. There have been concerns with the overuse of Clenbuterol because it has a steroidal effect on horses. We do not understand why they would depart from the ARCI model rules. If they had information and thought the model rules should be revisited they should have come to us. We do that sort of thing from time to time. But no one from Louisiana has come to us for consideration. It is a unilateral action and we've reached out to the commission and are requesting any supporting documentation.

"There have been concerns that use of Clenbuterol is something that needs to be approved by the regulatory veterinarian. We understand the benefit as a medication and the ACRI model rule landed where it is as a result of significant work by the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium's scientific advisory committee." *Cont.*

"This is a departure from a long standing, established regulatory practice. We don't understand what the emergency is. What you are allowing is allowing therapeutic drugs to be given closer in to race day than has otherwise been the agreed-upon norms by all the regulators in the country, which have collaboratively assessed the science and the challenges that the sport faces. Those rules have worked well for many years."

Another dramatic rule change is the one regarding Depo-Medrol, or methylprednisolone, a steroid injected into joints to treat pain and swelling. ARCI model rules call for a 100 mg. injection with a withdrawal time of 21 days. The Louisiana rule doubles the allowable injection to 200 mg. while cutting the withdrawal time down to seven days.

While HISA has no control over what goes on in Louisiana, HISA CEO Lisa Lazarus expressed her disappointment and worried what the Louisiana decision would do for horse racing's overall image. Cont.

"From a HISA perspective, obviously we are really disappointed," she said. "This is a time when the industry is really coming together and making really significant progress, particularly in the area of safety and welfare of the horses. This will definitely set the industry back and create a bigger gap between the HISA and non-HISA tracks that we already have. Even though it's not a HISA state, the general public doesn't know that Louisiana isn't governed by our rules. They look at horse racing as one industry."

Lazarus said there are some steps that HISA could take.

"From an integrity standpoint, we're not going to be able to let horses just come back and forth from Louisiana to a HISA track," she said. "That would be unfair to the trainers who are competing according to the rules at all the HISA tracks, given how big the gap is. We haven't worked through exactly how we are going to adjust that. It could be additional clearance testing. It could be some sort of prohibition regarding going back and forth from Louisiana. It wouldn't be fair to the horsemen at the HISA tracks if we are going to allow horses who were on, for example, Clenbuterol, which, as we know, stays in the system for a long time, and come in and race against trainers who have not been in Louisiana.

Hall of Fame trainer Mark Casse, an outspoken critic of Clenbuterol, expressed similar sentiments. A Fair Grounds regular, he said he may not return there later this year.

"This is a step backwards," he said. "The biggest disappointment to me is that when horses leave the Fair Grounds and they come to compete outside of there, they're going to have an advantage that is not really fair. Clenbuterol, even though it only stays in their blood for a period of about 10 days, the effects of it can last for a long time.



"There is no way that it doesn't move horses up."

Trainer Cherie DeVaux, who winters at Fair Grounds, appeared to agree, posting on X, "This is a big step backwards for all of the positive change towards the safety of this industry. Also, creates an uneven playing field for those that race and esp claim at FG for the winter and go back to HISA-regulated tracks. Hoping for some sort of resolution before that time."

Not every horseman was upset by the changes. Benard Chatters, who is the president of the Louisiana HBPA, said the new rules will be good for the horses. He said that to the best of his knowledge, no one from the HBPA lobbied the commission to make the changes.

"These new rules are good and they will help us to be effective horsemen," Chatters said. "I like them. The rules on these medications are well thought out and will let horsemen practice their trade and help veterinarians to do their job effectively. I am happy with these changes, I can tell you that. They are trying to do what is right for the animals. I imagine they changed the rules to try to allow the horse to get the optimal care."

Churchill Downs Inc., the owner of Fair Grounds, did not see it the same way. *Cont.*

"Churchill Downs Incorporated is extremely disappointed with the Louisiana Racing Commission's `emergency rule making' to weaken Louisiana racing medication standards," said Tonya Abeln, Vice President of Communications for CDI, in a statement emailed to *TDN*. "We had no opportunity to weigh in on this action and view it as an inexcusable abuse of process resulting in a substantial degradation in the safety and integrity of racing in the State."

SEIZE THE GREY WORKS; LUKAS EXPECTS PREAKNESS WINNER WILL BE IGNORED IN

It was back to work for GI Preakness S. winner **Seize the Grey** (Arrogate) on Wednesday at Churchill Downs as he prepares for the GI Belmont S. at Saratoga Race Course June 8.

With regular jockey Jaime Torres on board, Seize the Grey had his first workout since his upset win in the Preakness. He went six furlongs in 1:13 (1/1).

"I asked [Torres] if he was responsive, and he said, 'very,'" Hall of Fame trainer D. Wayne Lukas said by phone from Louisville. "He said he could have let him run at any minute. He was full of good energy and that is what we wanted to see. I wanted to do a little more with him. This horse really enjoys the mornings; he enjoys going out there and working out."

Seize the Grey, owned by MyRacehorse, won the Preakness by 2 1/4 lengths over a muddy track at Pimlico on May 18. He went off at odds of 9-1. When the field is drawn for the Belmont on Monday, Lukas expects Seize the Grey won't be one of the morning-line favorites.

Come race day, he said he figured the price will be juicy on the colt who gave him his seventh career Preakness win.

"I would think he would be about fourth choice, he might even be fifth," Lukas said. "I don't think they are convinced. I look for him to be north of 10 [-1 odds]. I love it."

Lukas said the plan is still for Seize the Grey to van to Saratoga on Saturday, June 1. The only other horse from the Lukas barn making the trip is his pony, Bucky. Lukas said Seize the Grey will walk the shedrow Sunday and then go the track, most likely the Oklahoma Training Track, on Monday.

Seize the Grey has won three of five starts this year. Before the Preakness, he won the GII Pat Day Mile S. on May 4 at Churchill. After winning an allowance to start his season, he was third in the GIII Jeff Ruby Steaks at Turfway Park and then seventh in the GI Blue Grass S. at Keeneland.

He ran twice at Saratoga as a 2-year-old, breaking his maiden in his second career start--on a sloppy track--and then finishing third on a muddy track in the Skidmore S., a race originally carded for turf.

"He is ready," Lukas said. "I have no reason to think I am not going to get a good effort out of him."

Anita in November, are being pointed to the seven-furlong GI Woody Stephens S.

Baffert is also planning on running 4-year-old **National Treasure** (Quality Road) in the GI Metropolitan Handicap.

Those races are part of the nine-race stakes schedule on June 8 with the highlight being the GI Belmont S.

All three horses are scheduled to work Friday or Saturday at

Santa Anita, Baffert said.

"As long as they work welland I don't see why they wouldn't--they would ship Sunday," Baffert said by phone from Southern California. "I don't put them on the plane unless I know they are doing really well."

After vying for the early lead with Preakness winner Seize the Grey (Arrogate), Imagination faded out of contention for jockey Frankie Dettori over a Pimlico Race Course track labeled "muddy."

Baffert said he is willing to draw a line through the race, which was the first in Imagination's seven-race career where he did not win or finish second.

"I think the mud maybe made him rank and he was rank the whole way around there," Baffert said. *Cont.*

"He just didn't have anything at the end."

Imagination has not worked since the week before the Preakness.

Prince of Monaco, like Imagination, is owned by SF Racing LLC and partners. He had won his first three starts before the Breeders' Cup, including the GI Del Mar Futurity

He has been working regularly since April and had a bullet five-furlong breeze on Sunday. Prince of Monaco was timed in :58.80 (1/36).

"We would have liked to get a race into him before something like this," Baffert said, "but it was hard to get it. He worked really well the other day."

National Treasure will be racing for the first time since finishing fourth in the G1 Saudi Cup on Feb. 24. He returned to the work tab Apr. 12 and has breezed four times, including a six-furlong work in 1:11 (1/7) on Saturday.

Among his highlights last year, National Treasure won the Preakness and was second, beaten a nose, by Cody's Wish (Curlin) in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile.

Before going to Saudi earlier this year, National Treasure, also owned by the SF Racing LLC group, won the GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational S. at Gulfstream Park.

"He looks good, the way he worked the other day, he came back well," Baffert said. "He fits. When he is on, he is a tough, good horse."

Baffert also said that Muth (Good Magic), the 8-5 Preakness morning-line favorite who was scratched because of a fever, continues to recover. Muth stayed in Baltimore an extra week after the Preakness before heading back to California.

Baffert said that Muth had his first day back at the track on Wednesday at Santa Anita. The next goal for the GI Arkansas Derby winner, Baffert said, is the GI Haskell S. at Monmouth Park July 20.

DeVaux was no overnight sensation after going out on her own in 2018 after working for Chad Brown. She lost her first 28 races and it took her 10 1/2 months to record her first win. But she put that slow start behind her and is now recognized as one of the top trainers in the sport. How did she do it? Those where among the questions we asked when DeVaux joined our group on the TDN Writers' Room Podcast presented by Keeneland. DeVaux was the Green Group Guest of the Week.

"I just put a lot of pressure on myself to always be successful and to do things at a high level," she said. "So, there was a lot of talking me off the ledge, and that was a joke when I first started. In August of 2017 I talked about this with my husband [bloodstock agent] David [Ingordo] when I told him he was going to have to take on a new role of Doctor Phil to just really help me stay focused and talk me off the ledge. And he's earned every penny. Now we joke about it. But he says, 'you can't say I didn't warn you.'

"I had to see if I had the constitution to keep going. Then like two years into this, COVID hit. So there were a lot of circumstances that were less than ideal. But I'm just a big believer. I believe it's a win when you just wake up, put one foot in front of the other and keep going. Eventually the water gets a little bit easier to tread. The first couple years, that's just how I got through it."

Even after a big week like the one she had at Pimlico, DeVaux refuses to rest on her laurels. To her, every day is a new challenge.

"I'm the type of person where when we win, I'm already focused on what is the next task," she said. "The next day we have runners and we have horses to breeze. One thing that I am working on is just trying to allow those milestones to sink in.

"I'm kind of a perfectionist by nature, so something else might be on my mind when I really should be paying attention to the bigger picture and how awesome this has been."

Her goals moving forward?

"It's hard to answer that," she said. "Not everyone's going to like you, but I want to be known as being a respectful person. I want to have a positive impact on the industry as a whole. I don't go out there and say, 'I'm a woman trainer, I'm here for women.' My parents were harness trainers, and they worked hard. I didn't come from a lot of means, so I just try to be positive. That's my goal, just to have a positive impact."

JOCKEY CEBALLOS SEEKS YET ANOTHER HISA SIX-STRIKE PENALTY REVERSAL BY FTC

Both the jockey and the owner/breeder of the second-place finisher in the Feb. 18 GIII Sunland Derby have filed a notice of appeal with the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) in an attempt to reverse a more-than-six-strikes whipping disqualification under Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority (HISA) rules that cost them the placing in that stakes and \$85,360 in purse

At issue is the contention by jockey Oscar Ceballos and Eleanor Martin, the owner/breeder of Alotaluck (Sir Prancealot {Ire}), that some of the 11 strikes of the whip that Ceballos administered to the 3-year-old gelding shouldn't have counted against his HISA-mandated six-strike limit because he was allegedly using his whip to control a dangerous situation.

Ceballos is banking on a precedent that he established last year: On Sept. 11, 2023, Ceballos earned the distinction of being the first jockey to get the FTC to reverse a HISA-imposed whipping penalty that also involved a total of 11 strikes administered in a stakes at a New Mexico track.

That previous case dated to a Sept. 24, 2022 incident in which Ceballos struck Sheriff Brown (Curlin) five times more than permitted when winning the Downs at Albuquerque H.

This new May 22, 2024 notice of appeal filed by Ceballos and Martin regarding the Sunland Derby makes contentions similar to those that Ceballos raised in his successful 2023 appeal to the FTC.

"HISA was presented with testimony from a licensed Thoroughbred trainer, attending veterinarian, and attending farrier advising Alotaluck suffered an abscessed foot injury, a primary cause for the horse to lose its path and drift out during the stretch," the FTC appeal stated. Cont.

"For the safety of the horse and riders, Ceballos engaged the crop and tapped Alotaluck's shoulder to safely steer the horse," the FTC appeal stated.

Ceballos was additionally fined \$853.60 and penalized with a three-day suspension.

On Apr. 16, when the HISA Authority's board of directors heard the initial administrative appeal, it didn't buy the argument that Ceballos had whipped in the interest of safety.

"There is no dispute that Mr. Ceballos struck Alotaluck 11 times during the race," stated the Apr. 26 decision of the appeal signed by HISA's board chairman, Charles Scheeler. "The evidence established that seven of the eleven strikes were to the shoulder of the horse...

"The videotape of the race clearly shows that the horse was lugging out and also moving toward the rail at different points," the HISA decision continued. "The videotape also shows that Mr. Ceballos was trying to properly position the horse in order to win the race.

"The Board does not believe that Mr. Ceballos administered shoulder strikes to Alotaluck for safety purposes," the HISA decision stated. "The videotape shows that the horse was not running amid close traffic, and Mr. Ceballos was not looking behind him or otherwise manifesting signs that he was concerned about safety.

"In addition, Mr. Ceballos testified that the horse was 'off' during the race, and the Board is concerned that Mr. Ceballos continued to strike the horse with the crop if he thought the horse was in trouble."

D'ANGELO CONFIRMS ASCOT TILT FOR **GABALDON**

Soldi Stable LLC's **Gabaldon** (Gone Astray), impressive debut victor in Gulfstream's Royal Palm Juvenile May 11, will target the upcoming Royal Ascot meet, according to his trainer Jose D'Angelo Wednesday.

The Royal Palm Juvenile, a five-furlong turf sprint for 2-year-olds, offered the winner an automatic stakes berth at Royal Ascot, as well as a \$25,000 travel stipend. A \$9,000 purchase at last year's OBS October sale, the Florida-bred set half-mile fractions of :21.33 and :43.80 under heavy pressure before kicking clear to win by 1 1/4 lengths in :56.20.

"I knew he was ready. When we worked him in company, he was perfect," D'Angelo said. "We bought the horse with the idea to run him in the Florida Sire Stakes. One day, when I tried him on the grass, he was better on grass than dirt. So that's why we tried him in the stake. I thought he would run big.

"They went fast. I think he has a big chance to win over there." The George Weaver-trained Crimson Advocate (Nyquist) captured the Royal Palm Juvenile Fillies at Gulfstream before winning the G2 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot last year.

D'Angelo has already made three trans-Atlantic trips for stakes engagements in recent years.

MGISP Jesus' Team (Tapiture) finished sixth in the 2021 G1 Dubai World Cup. In February, D'Angelo finished third in the G3 Saudi Derby with MSW Bentornato (Valiant Minister) and in March, he traveled to Dubai with Caramel Chip (Midshipman), who finished sixth in the G2 Godolphin Mile.

"We're very excited to go to Royal Ascot. We went to Saudi with Bentornato. We went to Dubai with Jesus' Team and Caramel Chip. We almost got to the [Kentucky] Derby with No More Time [Not This Time] this year," said D'Angelo. "I'm feeling so blessed and happy to go to all the places the horses have brought me. For a while my goal was to run there, now we have to win over there."

Emisael Jaramillo will ride Gabaldon at Royal Ascot.

WEEKLY RULINGS



1 1/2-YEAR SUSPENSION FOR TRAINER **GELROD; STEWARDS AND COMMISSIONS RULINGS, MAY 22 - MAY 29**

Every week, the TDN posts a roundup of the relevant Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA)-related rulings from around the country.

Among this week's rulings, trainer Monte Gelrod has been suspended for 18 months and fined \$12,500 after his trainee, Ratified, tested positive for cobalt salts after winning at Parx Racing on Feb. 19. Gelrod's suspension started Apr. 17.

HISA classifies cobalt salts as a banned substance. Cobalt has been proven to stimulate the production of red blood cells (erythropoiesis), which explains why some have turned to it as a potential performance-enhancer in both humans and animals. Greater blood cell production can help endurance and decrease muscle fatigue.

Present in all horses at very low baseline levels, cobalt is also found in all sorts of traditional feeds and feed supplements. There is currently no detailed explanation of the ruling on the Horseracing Integrity and Welfare Unit (HIWU)'s website.

Trainer David Jacobson has also been banned for 30 days and fined \$2,500 after his trainee, Got Thunder, tested positive for an alkalinizing agent (TCO2) when finishing second at Penn National on Mar. 21.

High total carbon dioxide (TCO2) levels could be an indication of bicarbonate loading--otherwise known as "milkshaking"-which can neutralize the build-up of lactic acid in muscles, thereby helping the horse's performance. Jacobson's suspension begins May 30.

RRP THOROUGHBRED MAKEOVER ADDS CLINICS

A day of clinics and guided schooling opportunities has been added to the Thoroughbred Makeover and National Symposium, according to the Retired Racehorse Project (RRP) Wednesday. The additional day, which will be offered Friday, Oct. 11, will feature participants in the disciplines of dressage, show hunter, show jumper and ranch work that did not qualify for the Finale Championships. The symposium will run Oct. 9-12.

Clinics will follow a format of a small group working with the clinician, who will be a judge from preliminary competition, while guided schooling will be short individual sessions allowing trainers and horses the opportunity to ride the course with input from the judge.

All clinics and guided schooling rounds are free for the general public. The ASPCA Makeover Marketplace runs concurrently, allowing clinic spectators the opportunity to try multiple Thoroughbreds offered for sale.


