SINGING A SONG...OR TWO

Lane's End's sensational A.P. Indy was the flavor of the day during Monday's opening round of bidding at the Keeneland September Yearling Sale in Lexington, and the stallion remained popular Tuesday. But it was Taylor Made's Unbridled's Song who accounted for the top two sellers during yesterday's second session, which included 19 horses to eclipse the \$1-million mark. Demi O'Byrne, bloodstock agent and advisor to the Coolmore operation, bought six horses for gross receipts of \$11.7 million and was responsible for the top three lots. Lane's End's hip 432 was knocked down to

O'Byrne, standing in the back, after a spirited and entertaining clash with Clarence Scharbauer, Jr., seated inside the pavilion. The octogenarian, accompanied by Valor Farm manager Ken Carson and trainer Bret Calhoun, matched strides with the more resourceful O'Byrne up to and through the \$3-million plateau. Pausing for a brief second at \$3.3 million, Scharbauer then raised all five fingers on his right hand, upping the ante to \$3.5 million with a \$200,000 lob. O'Byrne fired back with a matching bid of his own and Scharbauer had had enough. Moving both arms across his body, like an umpire calling a batter safe, the Kentucky Derby-winning owner bowed out, gracefully and with a smile, allowing O'Byrne to emerge victorious at \$3.7 million. Pleased as he was with the winning bidder, Lane's End's Will Farish was also full of praise for the runner-up. "He was really game," he said of Scharbauer, after exchanging some kind words with him. "He really loved the colt and he was really determined to get him, God bless his heart." Scharbauer took it all in stride. "No, not really," he replied, when asked if he was disappointed. "I bought two colts and a filly and I'm really pleased with all three of them. I was a little surprised today to see the prices."

Topper's Pedigree Not Much of a Secret...

The colt, gray like his sire, is a son of Farish's GI Kentucky Oaks winner Secret Status (A.P. Indy), who also added a win in the GI Mother Goose S. en route to career earnings of \$1,053,705. A full sister to MGSW Alumni Hall, Secret Status has also proved to be a commercial success, having produced \$6.3-million KEESep graduate Objectivity (Storm Cat) two years back. "We certainly hoped for the best, because this is one of the best horses we ever raised," Farish said. He explained his rationale on sending Secret Status to the Taylor Made stallion. "She's a big, strapping kind of mare and Unbridled's Song is more of a lean, lanky horse," he offered. "Plus pedigree nicks cross all over the place on it."

million. The gray colt was consigned on behalf of owners Aaron and Marie Jones by Taylor Made, and hails from a family which has had few peers at this auction house in recent memory. Half Ours, the first foal produced by Zing (Storm Cat), was purchased by bloodstock agent Buzz Chace on behalf of the Joneses and Barry Schwartz for \$625,000 as a KEESEP yearling



in 2004. Chace added Zing's Pulpit colt for \$500,000 at this sale two years ago and the Joneses snapped up Zing herself for \$3.6 million at the 2005 Keeneland November sale. Zong, the mare's 2005 produce, was hammered down to Aaron and Marie Jones for \$1.7 million last September, setting the stage for yesterday's sale.

The April foal, who also hails from the female family of Yankee Gentleman, performed to expectations. "I thought it was a good sale," Taylor Made's Duncan Taylor commented. "I was very pleased with what he brought considering the market. He looks quick, he looks early and I think they bought a good horse at a fair price." Added Taylor Made's Frank Taylor, "The mare's got an Unbridled's Song by her side that's probably her best one. Todd Pletcher has [the two-year-old] Zong, and he thinks a lot of him, too. This colt was kind of in between Zong and Half Ours. Zong is a little taller and stretchier than Unbridled's Song, and this horse is just a little bit bigger than Half Ours. But the mare has nothing but A's, and she's a great physical herself." Rick Nichols, bidding on behalf of Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum's Shadwell Farm, was the immediate underbidder. Despite repeated attempts by auctioneer Cris Caldwell to get him to rejoin the fray, Shadwell's general manager remained steadfast, and as Nichols scribbled the price onto hip 501's page, Caldwell quipped, "Oh, it's never a good sign when they start writing the price in that catalogue." Said Nichols, "He was a good athletic colt. We try to get some nice horses to race in America, and he fit the bill. He was a nice colt and we tried--we wish them luck." Frank Taylor said that Zing was not bred in 2007 and, given her success with Unbridled's Song, she is likely to be booked back to him for 2008.



Another First for Demi...

Having changed his tune on A.P. Indy over the first two days of the sale, Demi O'Byrne seems to be coming around on Unbridled's Song as well. Though yesterday's were the first colts he has purchased by the sire, O'Byrne did buy Marylebone through Robert Scanlon for \$725,000 at the 2002 September Sale. "They were two very good Unbridled's Songs," he commented. "I had the first one, so I thought I'd better get the second one. I never saw ones I liked as well as I liked these." Duncan Taylor could not be more pleased with the Coolmore patronage. "It makes me feel great," he said. "They're in it for the long haul and they're looking for stallions they think are going to make it long term. They've picked the right ones before and they must think it's a great line to have. It's going to perpetuate itself and keep going."

Prussin the Flesh...

That is precisely what George Prussin found himself doing a lot of at Keeneland yesterday. The father of eight, including grown quadruplets, consigned a pair of beautifully bred youngsters to yesterday's session through the Lane's End consignment. The female family of the first, hip 265, needs little introduction. The A.P. Indy colt was produced by Blithe (Unbridled), an unraced half-sister to GI Kentucky Derby winner Fusaichi Pegasus, which Prussin acquired for \$2 million at the 2004 Keeneland November sale in foal to A.P. Indy. "I knew he was going to bring a lot," Prussin said. "He was a very strong colt, beautiful, a great walker and very solid." The bay was purchased by Demi O'Byrne on behalf of

Coolmore Stud for \$2 million. Prussin originally bought back the mare's A.P. Indy filly for \$475,000 at last year's September Sale, but later got her sold. Now named Indy Cheer, she is owned by John Oxley and is currently in training with John Ward. The success of the second of Prussin's offerings was a little more unexpected. Hip 378, a Giant's Causeway--Mayville's Magic (Gone West) filly, was purchased by Robert Krembil's Chiefswood Stables Limited for \$1.55 million. "I was a little surprised about the [filly]," Prussin admitted. "Giant's Causeway hasn't really sold at that number. I had to look up and make sure it was the right hip number, but Mayville's Magic threw off a really good foal and I guess there were a lot of people on her." Yesterday's results gives Prussin something to look forward to for 2008. "It's been very exciting," he commented. "Blithe paid us back pretty quickly. She is the dam of a Storm Cat foal of 2007. I'll go into next year's sale pretty excited."

Maynard, Darley Hook Up for Distorted Humor Colt...

A week after Darley purchased an interest in Distorted Humor and a month after announcing that one of his leading sons--Any Given Saturday--would be joining its stallion ranks upon retirement, Sheikh Mohammed's organization again showed its support of WinStar's standout yesterday when going to \$1.9 million for hip 460, a flashy chestnut colt produced by the Storm Cat mare Stormy Bear. "At the end of the day, he's a sire that's done it the hard way," explained Darley bloodstock advisor John Ferguson. "From our point of view, he's a horse that produces a very nice type." He added, "[This colt] was a real athlete. Not only that, he's an athlete by Distorted Humor out of a Storm Cat mare from the family of Chief Bearhart. He looks like the kind of horse you can take back to Europe and be successful." The eight-year-old Stormy Bear is a half-sister to two-time Canadian Horse of the Year and U.S. grass champion Chief Bearhart, as well as GISW Explosive Red (Explodent) and SW Ruby Ransom (Red Ransom). Hip 460 was consigned to the sale by the operation that bred him, Dick Maynard's Maynard Farm. It's another in a long line of successes for Maynard from the family. "I've had the granddam for 21 years now," Maynard explained, referring to 1996 Canadian Broodmare of the Year Amelia Bearhart (Bold Hour). Maynard bred not only Chief Bearhart, but the Storm Cat mare Platinum Heights, whom Maynard sold for \$2.8 million to Eugene Melynk at the 2002 Keeneland July sale. "I've still got five mares from that family," said Maynard, who owns an 80-acre farm near Lexington where he keeps a total of six broodmares. Maynard didn't seem particularly surprised by the lofty price his offering garnered. "I knew he was a nice colt, and I thought he'd bring what the market said was right," he said. He added that Stormy Bear had foaled a War Chant filly this spring and was bred back to Pulpit. During the first two days of Keeneland September, Ferguson purchased a total of three yearlings by Distorted Humor, including a \$950,000 colt, out of Bold Burst, and a \$1 million colt, out of Alchemist, during the first session.

Nobody Knows Him Better...

If there's an operation that knows how to get a Storm Cat colt ready for auction, it has to be Overbrook Farm. The 24-year-old stallion was responsible for hip 398 yesterday, a striking chestnut colt, which was

knocked down to Demi O'Byrne for \$1.7 million, the most expensive of 20 Storm Cat yearlings to sell thus far during the sale. The April foal, a half-brother to GSW Inexplicable (Miswaki), was consigned through the Eaton Sales agency of Tom Van Meter and Reiley McDonald. "We were pleased with the way the colt sold," said Ric Waldman, the stallion manager of Storm Cat and an advisor to Overbrook. "He's one of our better yearlings that we brought to the sale and that was a good, fair price. He had all of what a buyer would

look for in a Storm Cat. [Coolmore] know what to look for in a good Storm Cat." Waldman explained that the majority of the Overbrook yearling crop is for sale this year. "We kept 20 percent, give or take, and we're selling the rest," he said. "It's all part of the big picture of our business plan." One of their offerings they were not willing to part with was hip 15, a full brother to the prominent sire Grand Slam (Gone West--Bright Candles, by El Gran Senor). The dark bay RNA'd for \$925,000 during Monday's opening round of bidding. "We liked and still do like him a whole lot, so we're not afraid to put him in our racing stable," Waldman stated. "We let Grand Slam get away from us, so hopefully we kept a replica. He's really a good colt. We struggled internally whether to even bring him to the sale or keep him and race him. We didn't mind bringing him to the sale, but he had to bring our price and he didn't." Grand Slam was a \$300,000 purchase out of the 1996 September Sale.

No Big Balloons, But Solid All the Same...

It wasn't the lofty price tag of either of her first two foals, but Welcome Surprise (Seeking the Gold) continues to be a producer of coveted racehorses. In the name of his M.A.B Agency, French bloodstock agent Marc-Antoine Bergracht went to \$1.6 million for the mare's Storm Cat filly, offered yesterday by Lane's End as hip 490. "She is for a Spanish owner who does not wish to be identified," he explained. "She was very expensive, but she's by a spectacular sire from a very strong family." Bergracht indicated that the filly would go into training with Andre Fabre in Chantilly and thinks her pedigree will be well suited to the European turf. "We'll make sure it is," he said. Welcome Surprise, a half-sister to A.P. Indy and Summer Squall, is the dam of Mr. Sekiguchi (Storm Cat), purchased for \$8 million to top the 2004 September Sale; and Surprises Welcomed (Storm Cat), knocked down to Southern Equine Stables for \$3 million at last year's auction.

Pletcher Buys One from Jones, One for Jones...

Family matters in Thoroughbred racing, and Todd Pletcher stayed with what he knew during yesterday's second session. The trainer signed a \$600,000 ticket for [hip 329](#), a Forestry half-sister to arguably the most famous product of Pletcher's stable, the dual Eclipse Award winner Ashado (Saint Ballado). For whom he signed the ticket was unclear. "I'm not sure yet--I'm working on that one," he laughed. The dark bay filly was produced by Aaron and Marie Jones's 14-year-old mare Goulash (Mari's Book), making hip 329 also a half-sister to this year's top grass horse Sunriver (Saint Ballado) and Grade III winner Saint Stephen (Saint Ballado). Taylor Made Sales Agency consigned the filly for the Joneses, who were in attendance to watch her sell. Pletcher conditioned Ashado to seven Grade I victories and over \$3.9 million in earnings. **Cont. p6**

Some time later, Pletcher was back in action, but this time instead of buying a horse from Aaron Jones, he was buying one for him.

Pletcher, representing the Oregon-based lumberman, won a spirited bidding duel for hip 494, landing the filly for \$1.5 million. Hip 494, by Storm Cat--Win Crafty Lady (Crafty Prospector), is a half-sister to the MGSW Graeme Hall (Dehere) and a 3/4-sister to GISW Harmony Lodge (Hennessy), both of whom were trained by Pletcher. Another Taylor Made consignee, she is also a 3/4-sister to GSW Win McCool (Giant's Causeway) and MSW Win's Fair Lady (Dehere). She was bred in Kentucky by West

Hills Farms. "We've been very lucky out of the family, training Graeme Hall and Harmony Lodge, and I know the family well," Pletcher commented. "She was a beautiful filly and she's got room to improve. She's going to grow into herself." Pletcher currently trains the Joneses' Sunriver, and also trained their good sprinter Half Ours.

Chiefswood Adds a Pair of Fillies...

At the tail end of a spirited bidding dual for hip 378, Keeneland bid spotter Pete McCormack implored Chiefswood head Robert Krembil for another salvo.

"C'mon--one more try," McCormack said. After a few seconds, Krembil acquiesced, moving the price on the board to \$1.55 million and, a moment later, the handsome filly by Giant's Causeway was in Chiefswood's possession. When asked if it was his last bid, Krembil laughed and said, "I don't

know, but she's ours now," adding that it was more than he expected to have to pay. So what attracted him to the filly? "Her pedigree, mainly," he offered. "Hopefully we've got a racehorse, but we definitely have a broodmare." Krembil was sitting in the sales pavilion alongside his son Mark, who co-owns Chiefswood, and his trainer, Eric Coatrieux, when he made the winning bid. A Canadian-based operation, Chiefswood operates a farm in Nobleton, Ontario, near Toronto. The operation typically adds a handful of yearling fillies to its roster each year in the hopes of eventually adding them to its broodmare band.

Hip 378 traces back to Gay Missile, dam of Lane's End's foundation mare Lassie Dear, and was consigned to this sale by Will Farish's outfit. Sha-li Leasing Association bred the chestnut filly, who is out of the winning Gone West mare Mayville's Magic, a 3/4-sister to European juvenile filly champ Gay Gallanta (Woodman) and a half to Group 2 winner Sportsworld (Alleged). Earlier in the day, Chiefswood went to \$800,000 to acquire a Pulpit--Lady Lochinvar, by Lord at War (Arg) filly from Darby Dan Farm, agent for Mr. and Mrs. Larry D. Williams. Selling as hip 355, the dark bay filly is a three-parts sister to MGSW Master Command (A.P. Indy). Chiefswood and Coatrieux are based at Woodbine, but also race at Gulfstream Park in Florida, according to Krembil. Krembil is the president of Chiefswood Investors Limited, a company involved with mutual funds.

Indy), the April foal is the second to be produced by Casual Look (Red Ransom), victorious in the G1 Vodafone Oaks in 2003, and third in that year's G1 Darley Irish Oaks and G1 Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup right here at Keeneland.

Seated alongside Riggio's wife Louise, bloodstock agent Lincoln Collins signed the winning ticket. "It's a very good pedigree out of a Classic winner," Collins commented. "Mineshaft is coming on a little bit and we very much liked the horse. We are building a broodmare band, but we love racing as well and we want to keep the racing stable active." My MeadowView was also the successful bidder on an A.P. Indy half-sister to MGISW Hollywood Story on Monday, securing that Three Chimneys-consigned offering for \$1.5 million. Asked whether he thought a bit of weakness in the September marketplace had allowed him to purchase the colt on the "cheap," he said, "If you call \$1.2 million a discount, I don't know, but the market does seem to be a little soft. He's a beautifully balanced horse. We all liked him, Nick, myself and the Riggios from the first time we looked at him. With the Polytrack these days, the turf didn't bother us on the bottom side of the pedigree." Lane's End's Bill Farish had mixed feelings about the transaction. "We had very high hopes for him and that was a very good price for him," Farish said. "With so much pedigree and such a nice physical, we were actually hoping for a little more than that." Might the same horse have been more valuable 12 months ago? "It's always easy to say that first-year stallions usually bring a premium, so maybe he would have brought a little more last year, but we're still very, very bullish on the stallion," Farish stated. "There are still a lot of good ones out there that haven't run yet. He hasn't gone down in our estimation at all."

Lukas Enterprises Continues Spree...

Hall of Fame conditioner D. Wayne Lukas was busy during last month's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale, purchasing several yearlings that he planned to sell shares of, and yesterday he acquired another promising yearling in the name of his Lukas Enterprises. Lukas went to \$1.2 million for hip 456, a son of Storm Cat out of the stakes-winning Wild Again mare Spunoutacontrol.

The nine-year-old mare counts English highweight and G1 Middle Park S. winner Minardi and successful sire Tale of the Cat--by Storm Cat--as siblings, as well as the mare Myth, dam of multiple champion and promising young sire Johannesburg--a grandson of Storm Cat. "I'm trying to get some new people involved, and a horse that could maybe generate big numbers," explained Lukas. "The thing that's so attractive about this colt is that, in addition to being by the right sire, that dam is from a family of two studs that are really doing well, and you have Pulpit under the third dam, so you have three very good sires in the family. So if this guy can run a little bit, he can definitely be a stallion." The dark bay was bred in Kentucky by Jayeff B Stables and consigned to the sale by Lane's End. Jayeff B's Richard Santulli was quick to congratulate Lukas on the purchase, and commented on the sale afterwards. "He's going to a guy that's picked a lot of good Storm Cats, and I wish him luck," said Santulli. As an advisor to Overbrook Farm for many years and as a buyer at auction, Lukas has indeed seen his share of Storm Cats, and said the yearling stacked up well. "I loved this guy; absolutely loved his conformation," said Lukas. "I thought I'd have to pay considerably more for him." Lukas added with a laugh, "Actually, I lost the big bet--I thought he would top the sale."



Late Scratch of Storm Cat Colt...

Hip 503, a Storm Cat--Affluent (Affirmed) colt that many considered to be the sale's top prospect, was a late scratch yesterday. A reason was not given. The first foal from MGISW and \$1.5-million earner Affluent, the colt was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent CCXXVIII. The bay was bred in Kentucky by Janis R. Whitham, who raced Affluent, and WinStar Farm. "It's disappointing for the breeder, it's disappointing for the people that were here looking at it, and personally I was very disappointed when we were informed of it, but that's a fact of life and you just handle it," said Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "We wish them the best of luck on the racetrack."

The Battle That Wasn't...

When the dust settled on Book 1 of Keeneland's September Sale, perhaps the biggest story was that rivals Coolmore and Darley, the operations of John Magnier and Sheikh Mohammed, respectively, failed to produce any of the fireworks they have in recent years. Spectators and horsemen alike had gotten accustomed to seeing the two titans clash at both the September Sale and elsewhere, resulting in audacious price tags. At this sale last year, for example, Sheikh Mohammed outlasted Magnier for the \$11.7 million Meydan City (Kingmambo)--the highest-ever price at

September--and the \$9.2 million Plavius (Danzig), while Coolmore came out on top at the 2006 Fasig-Tipton Calder Sale with the \$16-million The Green Monkey (Forestry). Juvenile pinhookers were chagrined when Coolmore and Darley failed to lock horns this spring, and it was more of the same over the last two days, with the pair seemingly only going after the same horse once--Monday's \$2.9-million session-topping Dynaformer colt. Not bad money, but not \$11.7 million, either.

Yesterday's session-topping (and presumable sale-topping) Unbridled's Song--Secret Status that sold to Coolmore's Demi O'Byrne for \$3.7 million will be the lowest-priced sale topper at the September Sale since The Mighty Tiger (Storm Cat--Clear Mandate) was knocked down to O'Byrne for \$2.5 million in 2002 (Note: One Cool Cat, by Storm Cat, topped that year's Keeneland July sale on O'Byrne's \$3.1 million bid). Opinions are aplenty on when and if the heated rivalry would resume, and even sale officials seemed resigned to the fact that the two biggest players in the market won't be lighting up the auction house anytime soon. "I think those battles might be done for a while," said Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell.

"But if they do resume, we hope they resume here," he continued. Still, Russell found reason for optimism. The 19 seven-figure horses that sold yesterday pushed the overall number this year to 30, the same figure after last year's Book 1. That included 13 separate buyers of seven-figure horses yesterday that weren't O'Byrne or John Ferguson. "There were more individual millionaire spenders than we had last year; we just lacked the fireworks at the top," said Russell. The Irishman also pointed to the fact that yesterday's strong median of \$300,000 meant that figure went unchanged from 2006.

Buyers Tread Cautiously in Book One...

Sales officials made the point following Monday's session that there seems to be a lack of buyers to "fill in the gaps," especially at the top of the market when the world's two leading buyers decide not to play. That fact seems to be borne out statistically, as the Book 1 average dipped by 23.6 percent, while the cumulative median is static. Missing from this year's sales are the peaks--the same number of horses (30) brought \$1 million or more over the first two days.

Sobhy Sonbol, advisor to Ahmed Zayat, was a major Book 1 player in 2006, buying seven horses for \$8.11 million, including \$4.6 million for Maimonides. More active in terms of numbers this year (nine), Sonbol's expenditures thus far have been \$3.635 million. "There isn't any method to the madness," Sonbol insists. "I bought the horses that I like and I think it's a very honest market. I just bought an A.P. Indy for \$800,000, I thought it was going to go for \$2 million." He adds, "I'm not going to pay money just so my name comes up in the paper. More or less, I think it's a pretty honest market. It doesn't have to be a \$6-million horse to be the right horse. Sometimes a \$6-million horse isn't the right one for my program. The horses are bringing what they're supposed to bring, I think. I'm finding what I like." Eric Guillot, a partner in Southern Equine Stables, takes a pragmatic approach to the sale and refuses to be influenced by any outside forces. "I try to run this as a business as much as I can, my partner and I, and I'm not going to buy a horse for a premium just because it falls on a select day," he commented. "I like to buy the right horse for the right price. Everything has got to fit the bill. It's got to have conformation, got to have pedigree, got to have the 'wow' factor and it's got to be the right price. If I buy two, I buy two, If I buy four, I buy four, If I buy 20, I buy 20. We liked a few [Monday]. We were the underbidder on a few. It's got to make business sense. There's just as many good horses Wednesday, Thursday and the next day." Last year, Southern Equine signed just two tickets, but one of those was the \$3-million Surprises Welcomed. Through the opening two days of this year's sale, the operation has purchased six horses for gross receipts of \$1.83 million.

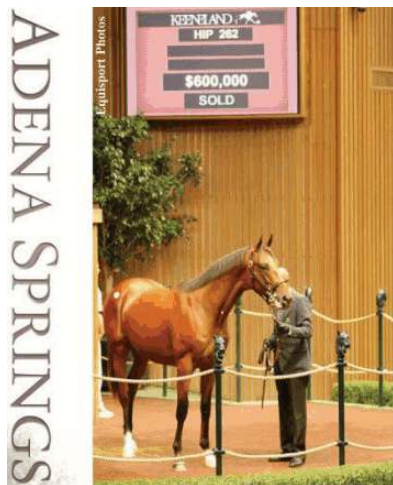

She's a good prospect. Her mother had a lot of early gas, and I think this filly might make it at two. She looks very much like a filly who will excel at seven furlongs to a mile."

BUY AMERICAN

After all the things we've learned in the marketplace the last two days, I'm standing by my comment that stud fees on the top horses are going to have to come down a notch. One of the important things we've learned is that not enough Book 1 horses are showing a profit right now. The facts are pretty bare. The gross was down \$37.5 million or 20 percent from \$182.8 million last year to \$145,377,000. The average was off 24 percent from \$564,383 to \$431,386. Strikingly, though, the median remained exactly level with last year, at \$300,000 (see comment about stud fees, above). But, as always, the facts require elucidation.

Two facts absolutely leap off the page. Fact number one: the sale was down \$37.5 million in gross. Sheikh Mohammed's (John Ferguson) spending was down more than \$40 million. Last year they spent \$57 million on 25 yearlings in Book 1. This year they bought 15, spending a little more than \$16 million. So that's one way of describing the drop in the sale's figures.

Fact number two is that five of Coolmore's (D.L. O'Byrne) 11 purchases were by two of the top all-American sires. They bought three colts by A.P. Indy, and two--including the saletopper--by Unbridled's Song. This surely signals their determination to remain competitive in an American market dominated by Darley's big-money stallion purchases this year.

Finally, the Storm Cat update. Better news here. Though six of his 17 catalogued today were outs, of the 10 which sold, five did make seven-figure prices. His overall average increased to \$601,400, at least above the stud fee. But, with 33 catalogued over two days, only 60 percent of those (20) were listed sales. Of those 20, six brought \$1 million or more, but none of the other 14 sold for as much as the stud fee. So you had a 30 percent chance of getting \$1-million plus, and a 70 percent chance of not getting your money back. Doesn't look that good a bet.

THIS DATE IN HISTORY...

September 13, 1974...Trainer **D. Wayne Lukas** notched his first Thoroughbred stakes victory, saddling his own three-year-old colt **Harbor Hauler** to take the second division of the Foothill S. at Pomona. The winner's share of the purse was \$6,312.

September 14, 1853...**West Australian** won the St. Leger S. by three lengths and became England's first Triple Crown winner.

September 14, 1959...The new \$32 million **Aqueduct**, operated by the New York Racing Association, opened.

September 15, 1973...**Secretariat** won the Marlboro Cup Invitational H. in the then-world record time of 1:45 2/5 for 1 1/8-miles. He defeated his stablemate, Riva Ridge, by 3 1/2-lengths. The winner's share of the purse, \$150,000, made Secretariat a millionaire.

September 16, 1978...For the first time in history, two Triple Crown winners met in a race, the Marlboro Cup at Belmont Park. **Seattle Slew**, the 1977 Triple Crown winner, defeated **Affirmed**, the 1978 Triple Crown winner, by three lengths.



MINSHALL IN TRANSITION

The past few years have been relatively quiet for Barbara Minshall, the only woman to receive the Sovereign Award as Canada's top trainer, but the Montreal native is enjoying the challenge of transitioning into a public trainer after years of success under the Minshall Farm banner. That transition could take a major step forward Sunday when Minshall saddles **Estevan** (Grand Slam) in the GI Woodbine Mile.

Minshall had plenty of experience working with horses, even representing Canada in dressage at the 1976 Olympics, but it wasn't until she met her late husband and Minshall founder Aubrey, that she was exposed to horse racing.

"My whole horse career turned to horse racing," Minshall explained. "I really liked racehorses from then on and that's way-back-when in the late 70s."

But it wasn't until after her husband's death in 1993 that Minshall took over training duties for the Canadian breeding operation.

"Aubrey always thought I should take my license out, and when he passed away, it just seemed the thing to do," she said. "We had a very hands on operation all the time, always had a private trainer and then I became more free to go ahead and train."

Minshall Farms, run by Aubrey's sons Shawn and Patrick, enjoyed some stellar years in the 1990s with Minshall training. The year 1996 was particularly good to the farm.

"In '96, I was Trainer of the Year," Minshall recalls. "Mt. Sassafras was Horse of the Year and we were Owner of the Year and Breeder of the Year. We had just a phenomenal year in '96, so you'd have to say that was a pretty good year for anybody--to have that many good horses all at once."

"The following year, Mt. Sassafras won a Grade I race down at Gulfstream [the GI Gulfstream Park H.], so we had some really nice horses and some really nice highlights," she said.

During the 1990s, Minshall also trained Prince of Wales S. winners Stephanotis and Kiridashi.

But things were coming to an end for Minshall Farm.

"After Aubrey passed away, we had some extremely successful years, but that was basically sort of reaping the fruits of labor of what he had put together over the years," Minshall explained. "My two stepsons did not want to stay together in the horse business. It's been sort of, over the last four or five years, a slow wind-down process of the actual Minshall Farms stock. Minshall Farms, as we knew it for all those years, has dispersed."

The end of Minshall Farm left Minshall starting over.

"I've basically had to start from scratch,"

Minshall confirmed. "I do have a few horses for my one stepson who is in the horse business, but we are no longer breeding horses as Minshall Farms. I was under contract to strictly train for the farm, so I could not train any other horses during that wind-down period and it did take several years to finally wind it right down. This is the very first year that I've come out as a public trainer, and it's kind of odd because I've always been a private trainer and a lot of people still have no idea [that I'm training publicly]."

Minshall currently has about 20 horses at the track, including 12 that she owns and trains.

"I do have a few new clients and I'm trying to build up a public stable," she said. "I'd like to try to get a few more, but I'd like to increase the quality of the horses. The last few years has been winding down, so the quality has suffered and then your stats suffer and everything suffers. It's hard to train cheap horses--everybody knows that in the business. So I'm trying to rebuild the stable with better quality and I'd like to have new people. I have several new owners, but most of the new horses I've received were all young horses and they are two-year-olds this year so, hopefully, I think there are some nice horses in that group."

Because of the large number of young horses in her barn, Minshall took notice when six-year-old Estevan was entered in a \$62,500 optional-claiming race at Woodbine June 14.

"I knew the horse a little bit because he has run a lot at Woodbine," Minshall recalled. "I immediately threw out his last two races [off the board efforts at Gulfstream and Calder Apr. 13 and May 5, respectively]. They were not good races and I could easily discard them. I looked back into his form and I thought, 'This is a nice horse.' There were a few spots in his form where I thought that I could improve him perhaps, if my gut instinct was right, and I thought he looked like he had a lot of upside to him and was worth every penny."

Estevan, who captured the 2005 Labeeb S. at Woodbine, finished 11th, beaten 5 1/2 lengths in that June 14 race and, in his first start for Minshall, he was a close-up fourth in the Aug. 25 GII Play the King S.

"I tried to run him in a prep for the Play the King and it did not fill, so I felt that he was just a tad short coming into that race," Minshall commented. "I'd given him some time off and sort of changed up his program a fair amount. I thought he ran really well in the Play the King. It came up soft and he was only beaten 1 3/4 lengths. He was right there and I was really pleased with his race."

Off his effort in the Play the King, Minshall thought Estevan earned a shot at the Woodbine Mile.

"He came out of the race in really good order and he's improved out of that race," she said. "The Mile is right here, the horse has a lot of back class and I do own him. I thought I'd take a shot."

Minshall won't rule out claiming more runners for her burgeoning public stable, but her focus is more on younger quality runners.

"I always keep my eyes open, but I'm not in the claiming game," she confirmed. "I definitely prefer young horses. Until the last year, every horse I've ever trained, basically we broke it as a yearling and we brought it on from that stage, but I always keep my eyes open for horses."

From the glory years of Minshall Farms to her building a public stable, Minshall remains philosophical.

"Everything goes around in circles," she maintained. "It's the highs and the lows in this business and you've got to be able to stick to the program. When things are going good, it's great, but when things aren't going as good, you stick to the program and trust yourself and carry on."

Estevan could go a long way to starting a new tradition of excellence for Minshall with a big performance Sunday.

RIO ADDED TO NATIONAL FIELD Godolphin's G2 Vintage S. scorer **Rio de la Plata** (Rahy) was supplemented for Sunday's G1 National S. at The Curragh yesterday. Having paid the €30,000 fee to add the impressive winner of that Aug. 1 Goodwood contest, connections were keeping options open by leaving him in Saturday's G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster. Jim Bolger is looking to field his unbeaten homebred **New Approach** (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the Curragh prize, but announced that the G2 Futurity S. winner, who Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum has acquired a half-share in, has an entry in Friday's Goffs Million at the same venue. "Nothing has been decided at the moment, even though Rio de la Plata has been supplemented for the race," Bolger told the *Racing Post*. Also featuring among the 18 colts at the five-day stage are Susan Magnier's G1 Prix Morny hero **Myboycharlie** (Ire) (Danetime {Ire}), who will be partnered by Kieren Fallon, and a team of 10 from Ballydoyle, including the G2 Coventry S. victor and G1 Phoenix S. runner-up **Henrythenavigator** (Kingmambo). Fozzy Stack, assistant to his father Tommy, told *PA Sport*, "We have entered Myboycharlie for the National S. and the intention is to run at this stage." Dermot Weld has Khalid Abdullah's impressive Naas maiden winner **Famous Name** (GB) (Dansili {GB}) engaged, while Mick Channon supplied the sole British challenger in G2 Superlative S. winner **Hatta Fort** (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}).

GREEN DESERT: THE NEW DANZIG BRANCH by Gary Hadden

At the moment, the Danzig line has only a low-key influence on the domestic racing and breeding industry in the U.S., but in Europe, he has a phenomenal grip which is growing year by year. This year, nearly 30 percent of all group races in Ireland, England and France have been won by progeny sired by Danzig-line stallions. We are now starting to see two distinct branches forming from the line: that of Danehill, of course, but also now Green Desert. They had similar race records, with both of them hittin the board in the G1 2000 Guineas before dropping down to six furlongs to win Group 1 races. Without doubt, Danehill has been the more prepotent sire, and this can be seen with his tally of 40 individual Grade/Group 1 winners (Northern Hemisphere only), compared with 13 Group/Grade 1 winners sired by Green Desert.

The classification of Danehill and Green Desert can be defined by the main protagonists of the branches. Coolmore, obviously, ultimately owned Danehill as a stallion, and have tried to focus on the prepotency of this branch, whereas Green Desert is owned by the Maktoum family. Darley stands four stallions in England and Ireland originating from Green Desert (including Green Desert himself), and only one member of the Danehill branch. They are supporting him and his sons rather than jumping on the Danehill bandwagon. This is very evident in viewing the buying patterns (foals and yearlings) of the main conglomerates. Last year, the Darley/Shadwell group purchased 15 progeny (eight were by non-Darley owned stallions) from the Green Desert branch, but only one from the Danehill branch. While the Coolmore team signed for nine Danehill representatives (only one was by a non-Coolmore owned stallion), but just one from the blossoming branch of Green Desert. There are nine stallions that stand under the Coolmore banner originating from Danehill, but none deriving from Green Desert.

There are now viable alternatives of stallions from both branches which are standing on 'neutral' ground, which brings us to Juddmonte, a key player with the promising stallions Dansili and Oasis Dream. Coolmore and the Maktoum family may not only be reluctant to buy progeny by stallions owned by their main rival, but also from the opposing branch of Danzig.

The branch of Danehill has certainly been very unlucky in the last number of years. Danehill himself died in 2003 at 17 just as he was reaching super stardom;

two of his sons, Landseer and Horatio Nelson, suffered fatalities on the race track. Danetime (sire of Myboycharlie, a leading juvenile and recent Coolmore purchase) died at just 10 years old and has shown in recent years that he was a considerable loss. The very promising Mozart died after one crop, and then of course there is the enigmatic

George Washington, whose breeding future is currently in limbo. The current flag bearers of the Danehill branch are Danehill Dancer (A Runner Index 2.16) and Dansili (A Runner Index 2.00), with a whole host of other representatives from this branch waiting in the wings. This has been the first year that there have been no two-year-olds by Danehill (in 2006 he was the sire of the winner of six group two-year-old races which came from the trio of Holy Roman Emperor, Admiralofthefleet and Simply Perfect), and it is allowing Green Desert to make up some ground.

The Verdict

Among all sires (F96-F04), his **3.93 A Index** ranks behind only Distorted Humor (\$225,000 fee), Smart Strike (\$75,000 fee) and Forestry (\$125,000 fee).

In the last number of weeks there have been five group-winning two-year-olds by three sons of Green Desert: Hatta Fort (Cape Cross) won the G2 Superlative S.; Visit (Oasis Dream) won the G3 Princess Margaret S.; Fleeting Spirit (Invincible Spirit) won the G3 Molecomb S. (the latter two were subsequently beaten by Nahoodh, who is a daughter of the Danehill stallion Clodovil in the G2 Lowther S.); Campfire Glow (Invincible Spirit) won the G2 Debutante S.; and on Sunday last, Young Pretender (Oasis Dream) won the G3 Prix La Rochette for HRH Princess Haya of Jordan. The tally is currently 7-5 to the Danehill branch in this year's leading juvenile races (the Danehill branch group winners being sired by Danetime, Dansili, Danehill Dancer and Clodovil).

Invincible Spirit (A Runner Index 2.38) has very much built on the big reputation he created last year, headed by the top-class Lawman, who represents the first Group 1-winning grandson of Green Desert to retire to stud. Darley have recently purchased a sizeable share of Invincible Spirit, and this would again support the theory that they want to concentrate on the branch of Green Desert rather than Danehill (in Europe). The Darley-owned Cape Cross (Ire) (A Runner Index 2.39) has been knocking on the door for the past couple of years and has the potential to be a top-class sire.

Both Shinko Forest (A Runner Index 2.2) and Desert Style (A Runner Index 1.6) are very capable of throwing a top horse and siring progeny that more than pay for themselves.

Oasis Dream may have been a step slow to get off the mark when compared to Acclamation and Choisir with their first crop of two-year-olds this year. It's true that Oasis Dream was a top-class sprinter and was a Group 1-winning two-year-old, but he himself didn't start until the middle of August of his two-year-old career. He won his maiden towards the end of September, then stepped up to win the G1 Middle Park S. at the beginning of October. Speed and precocity are not the same attribute. It is no surprise that his progeny are only now finding their stride, with the progressive Captain Gerrard and Young Pretender being his latest stakes winners.

As everyone is now turning their attention to the matings for the 2008 breeding season, I feel it is a good time to refresh elements which have recently proved successful for the Green Desert branch.

By my count Invincible Spirit has 10 Northern Hemisphere stakes winners, of which six are inbred to *Turn-to (including four of his five group winners), with five of the six having a duplication of Sir Gaylord in the damsire line of the first four generations. **Cont. p21**

This type of inbreeding also seems to suit Cape Cross as the following stakes horses by him are inbred to Sir Gaylord: Hatta Fort, Confuchias, Nights Cross, Gwaihvir, Sabana Perdida, Sentinelese, Charlie Farnsbarns and Happy Crusader, etc.

As pointed out by Andrew Caulfield recently, inbreeding to Never Bend is also playing a significant role in the success of Green Desert and his sons, who all carry Never Bend through Courtly Dee. The second dams of the Invincible Spirit colts Lawman and Captain Marvelous are by Shirley Heights. This type of inbreeding has been tried a lot, especially with a first generation cross, so finding the right blend may be the key. It may be the case that Oasis Dream is the most suited to this type of inbreeding as he carries a duplication of Never Bend in his own pedigree and has already sired two stakes horses (Starlit Sands and Eastern Romance) that carry a third strain of Never Bend.

Something Invincible Spirit has inherited from his sire and the line in general is an affinity for Raise a Native-line mares with four of his 10 stakes winners coming from this line. Over the years, the Nijinsky line has been an excellent foil for the Danzig sire line with the first-generation cross having produced nearly 50 individual A Runners to date. Oasis Dream has produced two stakes horses from Nijinsky line mares so far (Visit and Tuscan Evening). Nijinsky is the third damsire of Lawman and the second damsire of Conquest. Nijinsky is also prevalent with the success of Cape Cross as he has sired Mazuna, Privy Seal and Wagtail from Nijinsky-line mares.

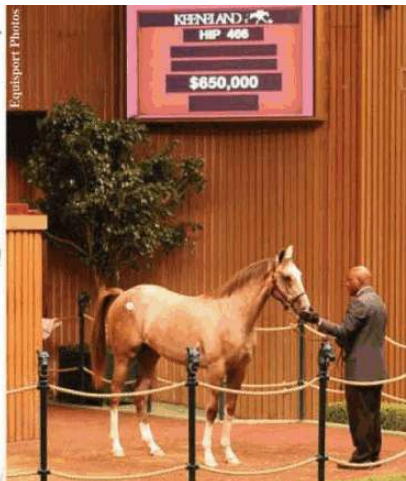

Collier Hill, who will enjoy his pension split between trainer Alan Swinbank's yard and part-owner Russell Hall's farm, retires with a career record of 15 wins, from 45 starts and earnings of £2,317,161.

EI FORCES INGLIS TO CANCEL SALES William Inglis, the nation's leading Thoroughbred sellers, has just lost one of its more important sales as a result of the equine influenza invasion. William Inglis & Son announced the abandonment of this year's juvenile Breeze-Up Sale, as well as the October Racehorse Sale, both scheduled for Oct. 28. It was decided to cancel the sales after Victorian officials voiced concern that the virus will jump the border and disrupt the Spring Carnival. The loss of the sales is estimated to cost Inglis close to A\$6 million in commissions. "William Inglis & Son have taken this step in order to try to eliminate the possibility of the EI virus making its way into Victoria through the movement of industry participants," said Inglis Victorian representative Peter Heagney. "With buyers from interstate set to attend the sales, it was felt in the best interest of the industry as a whole, that the indefinite postponement of these sales was the correct option. Further notification will be made at a later date once more is known regarding the current situation."
