VALLENZERI FINDS A HOME

The sales odyssey of **Vallenzeri** (A.P. Indy--Azeri, by Jade Hunter) ended at Keeneland last night when the regally bred colt attracted a final bid of \$1.9 million from trainer Bob Baffert, acting on behalf of Kaleem



Shah, during the opening session of the April Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training in Lexington. Vallenzeri, the first foal of Horse of the Year Azeri, made headlines at Keeneland last September when he failed to sell at a record \$7.7 million.

"This horse finally found a home," Baffert said after surviving a spirited bidding war. "He's going home with me to California." Baffert outlasted John Sikura, bidding out back, and bloodstock agent Steve Young, bidding just under

the press box in the back row of the sales pavilion. Sikura, whose Hill 'n' Dale Sales consigned Vallenzeri for the Allen Paulson Living Trust last September, dropped out of the action at the \$1.6 million mark, leaving Young and Baffert to duke it out to the final seven-figure price tag. **Sale Coverage cont. p2**

New Name, New Game for Vallenzeri...

Vallenzeri was consigned by Eddie Woods, who was quick to congratulate Baffert and assure the silverhaired trainer, "He'll win the Derby for you." In addition to Vallenzeri's flashy RNA in September, the colt's champion dam Azeri, in foal to Ghostzapper, failed to sell at \$4.4 million at Keeneland in January. Baffert admitted, "We were prepared for something crazy, but he was on his own. The market tells you what they're worth, and tonight the market said \$1.9 million."

Baffert added that was his final bid, but admitted he was aided in his purchase by market conditions. "\$1.9 million is still a lot of money for the market, but I thought we got a pretty good deal," he said.

Baffert said watching the colt (<u>hip 22</u>) both at the under tack show (<u>video</u>) and around the barn and walk-ing ring made the decision to buy easier.

"When they are bred that well and you get to watch them perform and watch the way they move, that's usually half the battle right there," he said. "I loved the way he moved. He's by a champion out of a champion, a good-looking horse who is very well-conformed and he had a fluid way of moving. It takes a lot of the guess work out of it. He's changed a lot [since he was a yearling]. He was a picture. Before I decided to buy him, I wanted to see what he acted like in the back, and he was all class and really handled himself well. This afternoon, I was watching him around the barn and, for as much as he was shown, he's tough. He didn't act tired. You take a chance and step up to the plate."

The final price tag was the biggest splash to date for Shah, who has been very active at this year's two-yearold sales. "Kaleem Shah is very serious about getting into the game, and we've bought some really nice horses," Baffert said. "He wants to compete at the top end, so now it's time for me to get him there."

Shah was absent from last night's sale, but Baffert admitted he had given him a pep talk. "I told him, if you're going to be a bear, be a grizzly. He was a grizzly tonight."

Vallenzeri will get some time off and could be aimed at a late summer or early fall start in what will surely be a much-hyped racing career. "I'm going to take him to Caifornia, give him some time off and freshen him up," Baffert confirmed, adding, "He's by A.P. Indy, and the mare got better as she got older. This is the kind of horse you want for later on, for the Classics." And he may have a new name when he reappears. "I'm going to change that name," Baffert said. "It's a whole new page now."

The Price Is Right...

It was short of the fireworks seen at Keeneland September, but consignor Eddie Woods was satisfied with the final price for Vallenzeri. "It was very, very good," Woods said. "You know, he's a very good horse, and he could well have deserved to bring more. The market

and the economic climate didn't support that, but it was a good price, all said and done."

The connections of the royally bred colt were realistic about what to expect last night. "He was well over the reserve," Woods affirmed. "He was set where anyone could buy him, and that's what kind of got people in on him and made for some action."

The Irish horseman has all the confidence in the world in the colt, and believes his new connections will give him every opportunity to live up to his bloodlines. "He's going to a great place," Woods said. "Baffert's a great man with great horses and gets them to right events if they're up to it. I would be really disappointed if this horse didn't make some of the big events. There's no reason why not. This is a spectacular horse, he's always been a spectacular horse, and he just needs to carry on in the mode he has been."

Keeneland April Holds Steady...

During a blitzkrieg opening session of the April sale Monday, Keeneland sold 31 horses for a total of \$6,885,000. The average of \$222,097, boosted by the \$1.9-million sale of Vallenzeri, was up six percent, while the median of \$120,000 was down 27.2 percent from a year ago. A total of 106 horses were catalogued for Monday's session, with 57 going through the ring and 26 reported not sold for a buy-back rate of 45.61 percent. "The outs are a little disappointing, but to sell the highest-priced juvenile colt of 2009 is very exciting," admitted Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "Eddie Woods sold our last Kentucky Derby winner [Big Brown], and maybe he's going to sell our next Kentucky Derby winner." Despite the tough economic climate, Russell seemed satisfied with night-one results. "It all went very well," he said. "The two-yearold market has always been a very tough market. It's a performance sale, so everything has to work in the right direction. The outs are a tribute to that--the ones that don't work as well or suffer little injuries are taken out, and those that do perform well get good prices. I think today showed a continuation of what the market is." The April sale concludes with a final session beginning this evening at 7 p.m. For catalog and complete results, visit www.keeneland.com.



Young Gun...

Steve Young may have been outgunned on Vallenzeri (A.P. Indy), but he stayed the course and signed the ticket on <u>hip 61</u>, a colt by Unbridled's Song out of In the Storm (Storm Cat). Consigned by Niall Brennan,



Agent I, the full to GSW Noonmark brought \$530,000. Young was not at liberty to reveal for whom he was buying.

"You know, he asked me not to tell," the agent explained. "He was also the underbidder on the Azeri, but he told me he'd rather I didn't say who I was bidding for."

It was no surprise to see an Unbridled's Song making headlines at the two-year-old sales. The

Hip 61, by Unbridled's Song EquiSport Taylor Made stallion is

the leading sire at the juvenile sales this year, with five sold for an average of \$675,000 and a median of \$700,000. That was not lost on Young.

"He's by one of the hottest studs in the world, he's a full-brother to a horse that's already a graded stakes winner, and he trained great," he remarked, adding, "I hope he's a Classic horse. I think a Classic horse can come out of any sale, but they have come out of this sale, as far back as Thunder Gulch."


Young was a little disappointed that he wasn't able to seal the deal on Vallenzeri, but he was happy with what he brought home.

"There were three or four horses that we liked an awful lot, and those were two of them," he said. "We took a big swing at the other horse and didn't get him. I wish we had, but we didn't. But I feel the horse we got is a terrific prospect for the price."

Young also picked up <u>hip 47</u>, a chestnut filly by Touch Gold out Field of Glory (Meadowlake), for \$320,000 for the same client. Consigned by Stephens Thoroughbreds, agent for breeder Paragon Farms, she is out of a half to the talented sprinting mare Randaroo (Gold Case). The May 4 foal RNA'd for \$95,000 as a KEESEP yearling, but proved harder to acquire last night. "The hammer prices are pretty strong," Young stated. **More on hip 61, p5**

Fast forward, and you find Ryan at Keeneland September in 2008, going to \$160,000 to get Noonmark's little brother. Brennan prepped hip 61 for KEEAPR, and this time the final price was what connections were looking for. "Obviously, we're very happy to get him sold, especially in this market, where it seems like it's all or nothing," Brennan said. "At the end of day, I'm glad that he sold well, because he deserved to. Those kind of horses are supposed to sell very well in any market; really, with his pedigree, he's like a collector's item." Despite the economy, Brennan expected the twoyear-old to attract his share of attention.

"He's by one of the hottest sires in the country, and we've been high on the horse for a long time," he said. "He's only a

showed how he can move. You put all the parts together and you solve the puzzle--he's just that nice a colt."

Still, the transplanted Irishman was holding his breath.

"It shouldn't be that it's a relief in this market to sell one good," he said. "It shouldn't be that way, but that's the way it is."

Brennan is confident hip 61 will be a success on the racetrack and beyond. "He's got so much upside," he offered. "If he is a good horse--and I believe he's a very good one--he's got stallion potential. He's got a great stallion's pedigree.

"I'm delighted Steve Young got him," he added. "He's a very good judge of a horse, and he's been around a long time." Centennial Farm was the underbidder.



away by the sale. "It was probably right about where we thought he was going to be," he said. "We were hoping that he would bring a little bit more, but we always hope they'll bring a little bit more."

Mixed Reviews from the Selling Side...

The figures were mixed on opening day at Keeneland April, as were the comments from consignors. Niall Brennan was particularly bearish on the market.

"It's very hit or miss," Brennan said. "There's no depth to the market whatsoever. There's nobody to pick up the horses that are falling through the cracks. It just seems very thin.

"There's a lot of scratches, which makes it very difficult, and there's just some nice horses not getting sold here tonight," he continued. "There's nobody spending money, which is understandable, but at the end of the day it's very, very thin--probably as thin as we've seen this year at the two-year-old sales. It's absolutely the weakest market."

Hip 61, the Unbridled's Song colt that was second only to Vallenzeri at the session, was one of only two that Brennan got sold last night. He had seven RNAs.

Eddie Woods, who sent session topper Vallenzeri through the ring, had a more positive take on the proceedings. While business was somewhat slow in the days before the sale, the final results did not disappoint him.

"It hasn't been bad, compared to the way things felt down at the barn and everything," Woods said. "It's been stretched over so many days, you never really know what's going on. You really don't know to expect. But for what we brought up here tonight, it's gone pretty well. We've been pleased with it."

Woods was the night's leading consignor, selling five for a total of \$2,630,000.

Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stables was the secondleading consignor at the session, selling six lots for an aggregate of \$1,065,000.

"Nothing broke out, but they all sold respectably," Dunne said. "And we'll live to fight another day."



Offered by agent Sally Thomas on behalf of breeder Hickory Ridge Farm, this colt brought a \$110,000 final bid from Mike Akers' Dapple Bloodstock at the Fasig-Tipton Eastern Fall Yearling Sale last October. Strutting his best stuff over the Keeneland Polytrack during last week's breeze, the dark bay recorded the fastest time for an eighth of a mile, stopping the clock in :9 4/5. With the assistance of that speedy time, the colt became the most expensive product of his dam, and surpassed the highest price (\$270,000) paid for a juvenile by his sire in 2008.

What was your last purchase? Champagne after the Golden Shaheen.



Consigned by Niall Brennan Stables, Agent XII This Mar. 30 foal is a half brother to Grade I winner and freshman sire Eddington (Unbridled). Also a half to Group 1-placed Star Crowned (Kingmambo), the twoyear-old worked a quarter mile in :21.3 last week (<u>video</u>). His three-year-old half-sister Fashion Storm (Storm Cat) sold for \$1.2 million at the 2007 Keeneland September sale. "He's got a hell of a pedigree," Niall Brennan said of the Summer Wind Farm-bred colt.

<u>Hip 181</u>, c, <u>Leroidesanimaux (Brz)</u>--Java Drums, by Java Gold

Consigned by Scanlon Training Center, Agent V A Feb. 15 foal, this colt shared the second fastest furlong time of :10.0 at last week's under tack preview (video). He was purchased by Hidden Brook Farm as agent for Paul Pompa, Jr. for \$180,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July sale--well over the freshman sire's 2008 yearling average of \$52,898. "I think Leroidesanimaux is going to be a real sleeper," said Dave Scanlon. "I've heard good things and he's got nice babies out there." Of the two-year-old, a half brother to multiple graded stakes-placed Johnny Dollar (Olympio), Scanlon added, "He really seems to love the synthetic, he seems to get over it very nice. He's a real pretty horse, a real pretty mover over this track."

Mafaaz Stretches His Legs...

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum's Mafaaz (GB) (Medicean {GB}), who earned an automatic berth in the GI Kentucky Derby after winning the inaugural Kempton Challenge Mar. 18, cleared quarantine at Keeneland yesterday in time to get in one circuit around the Keeneland training track with exercise rider Miguel Moya up. The colt will prep for the Derby in Saturday's Blue Grass. "We just wanted to get him out to stretch his leas, and it was the first day a rider has been on him since Friday," said Les Reynolds, head traveling lad for trainer John Gosden. "He cleared quarantine at 9:30 this morning." Reynolds said that Mafaaz would remain in the quarantine barn rather than move to Barn 1, where a stall was waiting for him in Kiaran McLaughlin's barn. "He's very happy here and eating well and we didn't want to move him again before the race," Reynolds said. "Now after the race, if he does well and stays here, we may move out of the quarantine barn." Gosden is scheduled to arrive Friday night. Richard Hills, who rode Mafaaz in the Challenge S., retains the mount.



Hooh Why Doubtful for Oaks...

Hooh Why (Cloud Hopping), who upset Stardom Bound (Tapit) in Saturday's GI Ashland S. at Keeneland, is unlikely to compete in the May 1 GI Kentucky Oaks, her connections have said. Mark Hoffman, who coowns the filly, admitted that he's in no rush to lock horns with Sunday's dominant GII Fantasy S. heroine Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro), the likely favorite for the Oaks. "I was in the parking lot at the hotel and a buddy called me and I listened to the call [of the Fantasy]," Hoffman said. "She [Rachel Alexandra] has the same running style as my filly, and it doesn't make much sense to take her on now with so many other races out there to run. As I've said, I want to try my filly on the grass." Hoffman is not sure what he will do next with Hooh Why. "You know, I didn't decide to come here until the last minute, and the reason I did is because all those other fillies [from California] would be shipping for the first time and my filly loves to ship," Hoffman said. "I wouldn't say the Oaks is totally out now, but most likely doubtful. There's the GII Black-Eyed Susan at Pimlico [May 15], the American 1000 Guineas at Arlington May 23rd...a lot of races and not too many horses."

NUMBERS REBOUND A BIT AT EASTER MONDAY

The market rallied impressively as vendors and purchasers found a happy middle ground at the second session of the Inglis Australian Easter Sale, which had a rapidly improving clearance rate and saw its average boosted by four purchases of A\$1 million or better.

"It was a totally different day today with an overall clearance of 81.5 percent and an average of A\$274,000," said Inglis Managing Director Mark Webster. "It was up around A\$290,000 a couple of hours ago, but [it drifted down a little] with no million-dollar horses in the last couple of hours."

Webster added that many horses passed in on the first day had subsequently found new homes. "The first session clearance was [originally] 68 percent, and today it is 76 percent," he said.

Leading the charge was <u>Hip 231</u>, an Encosta de Lago (Aus) half-brother to glamour stallion Al Maher (Aus) (Danehill) out of a half-sister to the dam of Redoute's Choice (Aus). The flashy colt was knocked down to Dean Watt's Dynamic Syndications for A\$1.8 million, with Coolmore underbidder on the youngster offered by His Excellency Nasser Lootah's Emirates Park Stud.

"I would have been disappointed if he was not one of the top three or four colts here," said Emirates Park General Manager Dr. Shalabh Sahu. "I would tick all the boxes with him: pedigree, type, conformation--and he was subject to a lot of interest. People inspected him not once or twice, but four or five times."

Watt said securing the beautifully bred bay was "an adrenaline rush," adding that the colt would remain in Australia.

"It was a pre-existing order for an overseas buyer," Watt said. "We had a little bit more to spend; we wanted a racehorse with the credentials to stand at stud, and I believe we have fulfilled the client's dream.'

In addition to being a half-brother to Al Maher (Aus), who is domiciled at Emirates Park, the colt is a halfsibling to Group 3 winner Salemeh (Aus) (Secret Savings). His dam Show Dancing (NZ) (Don't Say Halo) is a half-sister to successful sires Hurricane Sky (Aus) and Umatilla (Aus), and to Shantha's Choice, a resident of Coolmore who is the dam of Redoute's Choice (Aus) and GSP Sliding Cube (Aus) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}).

"He was the best mover in the sale, bar none," Bester said. "He had an amazing action, a huge overstep and he extended beautifully. He also has a marvelous temperament. I took particular notice every time he was led out, which was often. His dam was outstanding. I thought he was the buy of the sale." Bester said the colt would be trained by Gai Waterhouse.

Paradise is a Blue Sky...

<u>Hip 235</u>, a well-regarded Redoute's Choice colt out of Slice of Paradise (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) was knocked down to syndicators Blue Sky Thoroughbreds for A\$1 million. Slice of Paradise, MSP as a two-yearold, is a full-sister to champion three-year-old Alinghi (Aus). The colt was offered by Arrowfield Stud as agent, with Arrowfield chief John Messara confessing he had hoped the colt would have fetched more on type alone.

"Frankly, I thought he could have topped the sale," Messara said. "He is a lovely horse out of a fast mare from a good family. He is a very nice individual. I thought he would fetch a bit more, but I am very happy. Anytime you get anywhere near that sort of money you have got to be pleased."

Yarraman Park's Harry Mitchell summed up the view of vendors when he said the sale had gained momentum throughout the day. "It was stronger and nice horses are still making good money," Mitchell offered.

Patinack Early and Often...

Patinack Farm made its presence felt with 11 purchased for A\$5.1 million, including A\$1.2 million spent to acquire <u>Hip 292</u>, a Redoute's Choice (Aus) half-brother to Makybe Diva (GB) out of Tugela (Riverman). Offered by Tony Santic's Makybe Farm, the colt is a full-brother to Musket (Aus), who was purchased for A\$2.5 million at this sale in 2005 by the Ingham family. He has since won the G2 Shannon S. and is engaged in the G1 Doncaster H. at Randwick Apr. 18.

What They're Saying At The Sales...

John Messara, Arrowfield Stud:

"At last count, it was down 35 to 40 percent and it seems to be picking up some steam, and it is likely to finish around a third down and, hopefully, with 75 percent clearance. If that was to happen, it is within the range of expectations. Buyers are still wanting to buy horses they like for a good premium but if the horse is not desirable to them, it is very difficult to move it. Stallion fees are bound to be rationalized after something like this but there are stallions like, for example, Charge Forward (Aus), whose fee might go up a little. [Charge Forward] looks like being champion first crop sire, he has sold well, people find his progeny attractive, he is a horse that will serve a minimum book; he could easily cope with a slightly higher fee. I can't speak for everybody, but I think all studs are likely to meet the market and offer stallion fees at a level where they can allow breeders to get a financial outcome".

Antony Thompson, Widden Stud:

"This sale has been OK; it is sort of what we expected and we are not unhappy. It has picked up today and it is as good as you could expect."

John Ferguson, agent for Sheikh Mohammed:

"Funnily enough, the sale has held up much better here than at other major sales in the Northern Hemisphere. People here might feel it is a steep fall but in comparison to other markets, it is not too bad and it will rebound faster here because racing here is great and prize money here is better than many other places. Stallion fees have to follow the market. Everyone has to look very closely at it and fees will be revisited as people adjust their expectations. Sheikh Mohammed is very keen to come out and see the studs and how horses are trained and look closely at it all. And he had wanted to visit this week, but he had a meeting with [Prime Minister] Putin in Russia. I sent him a text after our Group 1 wins on Saturday and he was thrilled."

Trainer Anthony Cummings:

"There are some notable absentees, but it is nevertheless hard to buy a nice horse. There's a gap in the middle market, most certainly, that the merchant banking types used to fill. There is a big gap, [but] there is certainly some value there. Nice horses attract the right people and they bring the right money. We still have great racing, the prizemoney has not gone away and the inevitable upturn is going to be there. We are breeding the best horses in the world here in Australia. We are getting all the overseas pedigrees, all the overseas stallions, you've got the best place to grow horses that can be found. And results show that. Australian horses are competitive worldwide. I think the fact there is such great depth to the buying bench is testament to how the world sees Australian Thoroughbreds. And it is echoed in the ring."

Henry Pumptre, Darley Australia general manager:

"This is nothing that I didn't expect, and nothing that all of us have not been talking about all year. The market has dropped 40 percent, and all of us have got to rethink or plan to get through the next 12 to 24 months--or however long it takes--and start thinking about the rebuilding process. I have absolutely no doubt [there will be a stallion fee rationalization]. There is also no doubt that there are some good results here; this is the premier catalogue of the year and if you don't get a good result here, then we really are in trouble. But I think the overall market from January onwards has reflected a general drop of around 40 percent in yearling prices. It follows that the broodmare market is going to be the same [and it] follows that the stallion owners have got to reassess their fees."

<u>Hip 409</u>, c, <u>Encosta de Lago (Aus)</u>--Charmview (Aus), by Royal Academy

Consigned by Yarraman Park Stud Blue Sky Thoroughbreds purchased this colt from Coolmore for A\$500,000 at the Inglis Select Weaning Sale, making him the highest-priced weanling to appear in this catalogue. The first foal from a Group 3-winning daughter of Royal Academy, he is among an astonishing 70 yearlings by Encosta de Lago (Aus) catalogued here. "He is a very nice horse that has done particularly well since he came to us, and [he appeals] as a twoyear-old type," reported Yarraman's Harry Mitchell. Encosta de Lago's progeny are recording solid results off his 2006 advertised fee of A\$160,000. Coolmore's flagship Australian stallion had 45 yearlings sell here last year at an average of A\$588,222. <u>Sirecam vid</u>eo.

Consigned by Willow Park Stud, agent Primus (Aus), a full-brother to this lot, placed in the G1 Rosehill Guineas, Canterbury Guineas and Caulfield Guineas before he went to stud at Chatswood in Victoria, where he has covered two books of more than 100 mares at a fee of A\$11,000. Primus was a 2004 A\$120,000 Inglis Easter Yearling Sale graduate, with trainer John O'Shea signing the ticket. Hip 423 also has a half-brother named Viscose (Aus), a A\$140,000 Inglis Easter yearling purchased by Nick Williams for A\$140,000 in 2007. Unraced mare Copa de Ora (Aus) has a Flying Spur (Aus) colt and was covered by that sire once again last November.

<u>Hip 429</u>, c, Redoute's Choice (Aus)--Crimson Reign (Aus), by Red Ransom

Consigned by Torryburn Stud This is the first foal from a mare who won the G3 Kindergarten S. and placed in the G2 Reisling S. after she was purchased here by Kia Ora from Torryburn Stud for A\$260,000 in 2003. "We bought the mare at Tattersalls and gave her one start, which she won, before we put her to stud," said Widden Stud's Anthony Thompson. <u>Hip 465</u>, c, <u>Encosta de Lago (Aus)</u>--Elegant Fashion (Aus), by Danewin (Aus)

Consigned by Brooklyn Lodge as agent This is the second foal from outstanding racemare Elegant Fashion (Aus) (Danewin {Aus}), whose eight wins include the G1-HK Hong Kong Derby. She has a Fusaichi Pegasus filly and was covered last October by Encosta de Lago (Aus). Her first foal, Zabeel (NZ) filly Dezign (Aus), was withdrawn from last year's sale. The colt's second dam is notable producer Wily Trick (Clever Trick), whose five sold to date have fetched A\$2,135,000, including GSP colts Malayeen (Aus) (Anabaa) and Causation (Aus) (Giant's Causeway). Those two sold for A\$750,000 and A\$550,000, respectively, at previous editions of this sale.

"He is a very, very well-balanced colt and I am very strong on Charge Forward," said Ron Gilbert. "I have got four foals at home by him, and he is doing a fantastic job this year. From 65-odd live foals in his first crop, he has had two in the Magic Millions and a Golden Slipper runner-up in Manhattan Rain (Aus). I think he is on the way to becoming a successful stallion. This colt looks like a very mature horse with plenty of bone who will run at two, and he has been very popular at the sale. I am confident he will finish up in the hands of a good trainer." There aren't many mares who can claim to have two Grade I sires among their sons, but Lyphard's accomplished daughter Skimble has now achieved this feat, thanks to the sons she produced as her first and second foals.

The 20-year-old Skimble got off to a fine start as a broodmare when she visited Nureyev back in 1995. Although their son, **Skimming**, won nothing better than a Wolverhampton maiden race during his time in Eu-

Naturally, there were also high hopes when Skimble's second foal, a Mr. Prospector colt called Cloud Hopping, went into training with Henry Cecil. Unfortunately he managed only three starts and his victory in a 10-furlong maiden race at Sandown on his second start was followed by a disappointing effort in a handicap. Unraced at four, Cloud Hopping was sold to become a stallion in Florida, starting out at a fee of \$3,500 at Wycombe House Stud in 2002.

Of course by 2002, breeders everywhere had learned that racecourse achievement wasn't all-important in Mr. Prospector's stallion sons, as the following list illustrates:

Allen's Prospect: although a three-time winner, Allen's Prospect failed to earn black type. This didn't stop him becoming a dominant force in Maryland breeding, or from siring more winners than any other stallion in 2001.

Double Negative: this New York allowance winner stood at a low fee in New York, where he sired a hand-ful of graded winners.

Geiger Counter: collected some \$33,000 in winning two of his seven starts. Helped considerably by the fact that his dam was the celebrated Thong, Geiger Counter went on to sire the Australian champion Gold Guru and the high-class European sprinter Nuclear Debate.

Hussonet: although he earned black type with a couple of third places in stakes at Aqueduct, Hussonet failed to become a stakes winner. The fact that he now ranks as one of the highest-priced stallions in Australia pretty much tells its own story. His Chilean crops contained the likes of Wild Spirit and Host and his Australian son Weekend Hussler took Horse of the Year honors.

Not For Love: in a 29-race career, Not For Love only once made the first three in stakes company, when third at Monmouth. Even so, he has become Maryland's leading stallion, with his fee rising to \$25,000 from its original \$3,500.

Pioneering: the fact that he earned less than \$40,000 kept Pioneering's fee low, but this half-brother to Storm Cat has the Grade I winner Behaving Badly among his numerous stakes winners.

Prospectors Music: finished out of the first three in his three starts but sired the Grade I winner Gygistar.

Silver Ghost: failure to earn black type was again no obstacle to the sire of the Grade I winners Dreams Gallore, Lunar Spook and Love Lock.

It is worth stressing that this list, which is by no means complete, doesn't contain a single stakes winner, so we shouldn't be too shocked that Cloud Hopping has sired a filly as talented as Hooh Why, the unexpected winner of Saturday's GI Ashland S.

The list also acts as a reminder that it isn't only the obvious candidates which are capable of siring high-class winners. Several of these Mr. Prospector horses, such as Allen's Prospect, Hussonet, Not For Love and Pioneering, were out of notable mares, so had very strong pedigrees. Breeders in Australia, New Zealand, South Africa and South America have often made excellent use of this type of horse in the past and it's a shame that the huge books in today's industry effectively prevent a wider range of stallions being given a chance to prove their worth. Cloud Hopping is now in Uruguay, and it will be interesting to see how he fares there, as a bigger fish in a much smaller pool.

It isn't hard to understand why Cloud Hopping was considered as a mate for Hooh Why's dam, the unraced Magic Merger. As a daughter of the Travers S. winner Corporate Report, Magic Merger is a grand-daughter of Private Account. When Mr. Prospector was mated to Private Account mares, he sired the likes of Aldebaran, Miner's Mark, Traditionally and Our Emblem. Mr. Prospector also sired the high-class Strategic Mission when mated to a half-sister to Hooh Why's third dam, the talented Lien. Another incentive was that this family has produced four black-type horses to Eltish, a Florida-based stallion whose dam, Nimble Feet, was a three-parts sister to Skimble.

It looks as though Hooh Why has inherited some of the toughness which allowed Skimble to race 25 times between the ages of two to five. Skimble won in each of her four years on the track and she was better than ever at five, when her four graded victories from 10 starts included the GII Dahlia H. and the GII Wilshire H. Skimble is still going strong as a broodmare and is scheduled to visit First Defence this year after she foals to Mizzen Mast.
