Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's G1 Irish Derby hero **Fame and Glory (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) will bid to provide Aidan O'Brien with a first renewal of

the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) in the Sept. 5 G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown before failing to get into the thick of the action when only sixth in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp 12 days ago. "He ran a real good race in the Arc and came out of it very well, and, although he hasn't done much since, what he has done we've been very happy with" O'Brien said. Of the withdrawals, Sir Evelyn de Rothschild's Crystal Capella (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) was the most notable, and she heads to the G2 Pride S. on the same card in a bid to follow up on her win 12 months ago. Three fillies remain in the Champion S., and among them is Lady O'Reilly, the Moussac Family and Lucien Urano's Aug. 23 G1 Prix Jean Romanet heroine Alpine Rose (Ire) (Linamix {Fr}), who will be bidding to give trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre a second win in the event following the exploits of Pride (Fr) (Peintre Celebre) three years ago. Fourth when Crystal Capella was behind her in the G1 Prix de l'Opera on Arc day, the four-year-old may have had excuses there. "She was fourth in the Opera, but did not get a good run, "de Royer-Dupre commented. "She did not have a hard race that day, so I am happy for her to try the Champion S. The distance is perfect for the filly. The only concern is the up and down nature of the track. She ran very well over a mile and a half when second to Spanish Moon (El Prado {Ire}) in the [June 28] G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud, so she stays further but has speed and she is a Group 1 filly for sure." Meadowlands Cup S. cont.

Trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. will attempt to collect his third consecutive Meadowland's Cup victory when he sends out the entry of Anak Nakal and Great Debater in tonight's feature for older horses at the East Rutherford oval. Dutrow won the nine-furlong test with Diamond Stripes (Notebook) in 2007 and Arson Squad (Brahms) last season. Formerly trained by Nick Zito, Anak Nakal, the winner of last year's GII Pennsylvania Derby, makes his debut for Dutrow here. The four-year-old finished second in last year's edition of the race. "He certainly came to us in the right way, and he's training very well right now," said Dutrow Jr. "I know he is going to run well. He may need a race, but he is not training that way." Dutrow confirmed that entrymate Great Debater will be prominent in the early going. "The only reason I entered him was to make sure the pace is real in the race," added Dutrow. According to Dutrow, Anak Nakal, who was 14th in his most recent start in the Mar. 28 G1 Emirates Airlines Dubai World Cup, is expected to close out the season in the GII Clark H. at Churchill Downs in November.

Cima de Triomphe accounted for Conduit (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}) in the G3 Brigadier Gerard S. in May before finishing a distant fourth to Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) in the G1 Coral-Eclipse S. in July. In his most recent appearance, the gray was fourth in the Aug. 8 GI Arlington Million, some 7 1/2 lengths adrift of Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat).

SALES NEWS

BREAD AND BUTTER DAY OF TRADE AT TATTS

After the glitz of Books 1 and 2 of Tattersalls' October Yearling Sale, it was a more mundane affair in Newmarket yesterday for the first of two days of Book 3. The session turnover of 1,842,300gns dropped by eight percent on last year, the 7,000gns median was down by 12.5 percent and the 9,496gns average fell by 17 percent. The clearance rate rose from 68 percent in 2008 to 77 percent this year.

The 50,000gns paid a few minutes into the session by Richard Brown of Blandford Bloodstock for a member of the second crop of Shamardal (Giant's Causeway) was not bettered for the rest of the day, and the youngster is set to stay in Newmarket with trainer David Simcock. The colt was a half-brother to dual Group 2-placed juvenile Salsa Brava (Ire) (Almutawakel {GB}), and, bred by Crone Stud Farms, was consigned through John Cullinan's Horse Park Stud.

"He was a lovely colt, and obviously the stallion has made a fantastic start this season," said Brown, after outbidding trainer Marco Botti. "I think David has a couple more to get and will finalise the ownership of everything after that."

The day's second-highest price came for a Singspiel (Ire) colt out of a half-sister to G1 Oaks d'Italia winner Zanzibar (Ire) (In The Wings {GB}) sold from Peter Stanley's New England Stud. Michael Donohoe of BBA Ireland, acting for owner Mark Gittins, had the successful bid with trainer Ken Condon the underbidder. "I've been mad keen to get a Singspiel all year," said Donohoe. "He's an international sire who gets horses that go on any surface and most importantly, the individual fitted the bill."

video at OBS], and when you combine a fast breeze with a horse that looks like it could go two turns and handle Classic distances, that's what everybody's looking for. Gary saw it in him and deserves all the credit."

Team Stallion, a racing and pinhooking syndicate launched by Jeff Massaro and his younger brother Dave in 2004, currently has 12 horses on its roster.

"Yearling sales and two-year-old sales are two different animals--no pun intended," the New Jersey native said when asked which of the two he prefers. "We buy at both, but the opportunity to watch a horse breeze an eighth or a quarter, see how it gallops out, and even how they come back to the barn after the work, are all important features. The two-yearold sales give you a little bit more to look at when trying to evaluate a racehorse."

Citrus Kid began his career with a seventh-place finish on the Saratoga lawn Aug. 5 prior to graduating by 3 3/4 lengths going a mile and 70 yards at Delaware Sept. 26 (video).

"Lemon Drop Kid is a hot sire, and his offspring have done very well on the turf," Massaro, 34, explained of trying Citrus Kid on grass in his debut. "In the morning it looked like had a turfy foot, so we gave it a try. He trained like a monster on dirt following that race, and we decided to take him to Delaware because we wanted him to go two turns, something we couldn't do at Belmont. We shipped him down there, and when he got his opportunity to go two turns on the dirt--like he's built for and like Gary saw--he showed what kind of horse he is."

Adding blinkers at second asking, Citrus Kid was the last one to exit the gate from stall six. Hustled to the front by Abel Castellano Jr., he gained a short lead on the first turn while hung out at least four wide. Enjoying a clear advantage through a half mile in :48, he turned back a challenge on the turn for home and strode clear nicely once switching leads in midstretch to win with something left.

"He wants to run all day," Massaro continued. "You watch him gallop out and he looks like he's made for Classic distances."

The dark bay employed different tactics in the Dover. With Castellano in the irons again, Citrus Kid secured good early position saving ground while racing up close in fourth. Guided three wide off the turn for home, the son of Orange Ice inhaled the leaders at the top of the lane and increased his advantage to the wire, scoring by five lengths.

"Showing the ability to win on the front end in the special weight, then using tactical speed and knowing when to make your move in the Dover not only shows talent, but also a smart racehorse," Massaro said, adding that Citrus Kid would be aimed at Aqueduct's GII Remsen S. Nov. 28. "It takes smarts to keep advancing, and he's done everything we've asked him to do so far. We have a special horse here, and I can't say enough about our partners and how much of a pleasure it's been campaigning this horse together. It's really been a great experience."

Massaro is also high on fellow OBSMAR graduate Eightyfiveinafifty (Forest Camp), who Team Stallion owns in partnership with the aforementioned Moirano and Lerner and others. Making his debut at Saratoga Aug. 1 (video), the bay ran on valiantly to place third behind subsequent GI Three Chimneys Hopeful S. hero Dublin (Afleet Alex) after exchanging blows with recent GI Champagne S. runner-up Discreetly Mine (Mineshaft) through fractions of :21 3/5 and :44 1/5. He outfinished the latter by a half-length. Freshened since, the son of Lifeinthefastlane (Unbridled's Song) fired a four-furlong bullet in :49 at the Big A Oct. 9.

"We're treating him like a big horse in the barn right now," Massaro said of Eightyfiveinafifty, who brought \$100,000 in the spring. "Gary did a great job identifying him at auction as well."

Massaro, a Fordham University alumnus, decided to leave law school to embark upon a handful of entrepreneurial efforts with his brother Dave, who graduated from Seton Hall University in 2001. Amongst these ventures, the siblings founded Clay Thomas & Associates, a Clifton, New Jersey-based insurance agency that maintains a division dedicated to equine insurance products and services, including full mortality coverage, horse owners liability, farm packages, veterinary malpractice, horse transportation insurance, etc.

"We're a niche market insurance agency and brokerage that engages in specialty lines of business," said Massaro, who, along with his wife Lisanne, is expecting the arrival of his first child shortly. "Through our business dealings with Team Stallion Racing, we have had the good fortune of building relationships with many of the industry's prominent players, from owners to veterinarians to horse transporters, and down the line. Despite the economic climate right now, I am proud to say that our equine insurance division is consistently expanding to offer new products and services, and our client list is growing. I attribute this success to the passion my brother and I have for this sport, and the industry as a whole. We are able to assess and manage risk from a horseman's point of view, and that insight enables us to better serve our clients from their perspective." -- Steve Sherack

HOUSE OF GRACE (Limehouse)

The Land of Lincoln has never had, and likely never will have, the reputation for being a hotbed of Thoroughbred breeding. But over the last several years, a handful of solid, black-type winning Illinois-bred mares have made a name for themselves as producers.

In the early to mid 1990s, Bayou Plans (Bayou Hebert) rattled off four black-type wins in state-bred company and has since gone on to drop three stakes winners, including GISW Midas Eyes (Touch Gold). She is also the dam of this year's FTFFEB topper, the promising Al Zir (Medaglia d'Oro). The Saratoga Six mare Sassy Pants also earned her keep on the Chicago circuit, bagging a trio of added-money events, but has made an even bigger name for herself as a broodmare. Her second foal, Madcap Escapade (Hennessy), won the GI Ashland S. at Keeneland and is the dam of the recently retired GISW Mi Sueno (Pulpit). Her next produce, Dubai Escapade (Awesome Again), took the GI Ballerina Breeders' Cup for Darley. Gracility (Known Fact) has a fair amount of work to do in order to catch up, but she is off to a good start in the form of her daughter House of Grace (Limehouse), who took Thursday's JP Morgan Chase Jessamine S. on the Keeneland Poly.

Racing for the DiCicila family's Crown's Way Farm, Gracility won the 2002 Violet S. for the late trainer Gene Cilio, and she is a daughter of another outstanding Crown's Way runner, Kuma (Naevus). The latter also produced the multiple stakes-winning Shemya (Valiant Nature), but foundered and died in 2001. Gracility was bred for the first time in 2004, but failed to get in foal and was returned to the races. She left the track for good in 2005, but did not catch that year either. Enter Dede McGehee, the Lexington-based owner of Heaven Trees Farm, who has become something of a specialist in working with mares that have trouble conceiving.

"She had trouble getting in foal for those first two years, but we finally figured out that her cervix wasn't opening very well," said McGehee, who now owns Gracility outright after breeding her first three foals in partnership with Crown's Way. "Since then, it hasn't been a problem."

With the advice of horseman and former consignor James B. Keogh, the decision was made to send Gracility to Limehouse for the 2006 breeding season.

"She was a big-boned, raw kind of mare and Limehouse is smaller and more refined," McGehee said of the mating. "James said to go with it and that's what we did."

The result was a bay filly foaled Mar. 6, 2007, and she was raised at Heaven Trees, not far from the back gate at Keeneland. With Keogh out of the consigning business, McGehee brought her Gracility filly and two other offerings to the 2008 Fasig-Tipton July Yearling Sale; it was the first time she'd consigned her own horses. Set to go through the ring in the last half-hour of session one, the filly--naturally nervous to begin with--had to endure a 10-minute power outage at the Newtown Paddocks. After finally being backed down the chute and into the ring after what seemed an eternity to McGehee, hip 268 was knocked down to trainer Ken McPeek for an even \$100,000.

"She did everything fine," recalled McGehee, who had reserved the filly for just short of \$75,000. "She wasn't real big and still doesn't look very big, which is strange, because the mare is big. We liked her well enough, but did we know that she'd sell well? I did like her, but Crown's Way was willing to race her if they had to," she added.

Gracility is now owned by McGehee alone, and is the dam of a Roman Ruler filly of 2008, which sold to Stephen Hillen for \$100,000 at this year's FTKJUL sale. The mare, now 10 years old, foaled a filly by Langfuhr the Sunday after this year's Kentucky Derby and was not bred back due to the late foaling date. McGehee, who also sold a colt by Powerscourt (GB) (Sadler's Wells) for a session-topping \$180,000 (reserve \$39,000) on the third-last day of this year's Keeneland September sale, has not yet decided on a mate for Gracility for 2010.

"I'm just going to wait and see how things shake out with the stallion market," she said.

McGehee, who also bred and sold GISW Panty Raid (Include) and was co-breeder of GISW Imperial Gesture (Langfuhr), admits that winning a race, even as a breeder, never gets old. "It's good, it's really, really good," she commented. *--Alan Carasso*
