KING GEORGE ATTRACTS SEVEN

An exclusive field of seven remains engaged for Saturday's G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S., following the addition of impressive Royal Ascot winner **Nathaniel (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) at yesterday's supplementary stage for Ascot's midsummer

showpiece. The Berkshire track's terrain is currently described as good with soft places, but further rain is forecast before the weekend. Recent rain--and a pleasing workout at Newmarket Sunday morning--has encouraged connections of last year's G1 Epsom Derby and G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe hero **Workforce**

(GB) (King's Best). "We're hoping for some good rain for Workforce to be able to take his chance," trainer Sir Michael Stoute, who has taken the last two renewals with Conduit (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}) and Harbinger (GB) (Dansili {GB}), told Racing Post. Fellow Juddmonte colorbearer Midday (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) also stands her ground, but will participate only in Workforce's absence. "If Workforce goes for the King George, then Midday will go to Goodwood for the [July 30 G1] Nassau S., and if Workforce doesn't go to Ascot, then Midday will probably head there instead," explained Juddmonte racing manager Teddy Grimthorpe. Aidan O'Brien's red-hot Ballydoyle yard supplies the G1 Coronation Cup winner and current 6-4 favorite St Nicholas Abbey (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), while stablemate **Seville (Ger)** (Galileo {Ire}) may get an early chance to advertise the form of the July 14 G1 Juddmonte Grand Prix de Paris where he ran second. Godolphin's GI Arlington Million victor Debussy (GB) (Diesis {GB}) may undertake pacesetting duties for the team's standard-bearer Rewilding (GB) (Tiger Hill {Ire}), who was victorious in a thrilling renewal of the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot. Lady Rothschild and John Gosden will be looking for a return on the £75,000 fee paid to add Nathaniel, the half to Playful Act (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), into the race, prompted by a five-length win in the G2 King Edward VII over track and trip on similar ground at last month's Royal meet.



BANIMPIRE MAY TAKE NASSAU CHANCE

Fresh from an oh-so-close second in Sunday's G1 Darley Irish Oaks at The Curragh, Coolcullen conditioner Jim Bolger has nominated the July 30 G1 Nassau S. at Goodwood as a possible target for **Banimpire (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}). The Jackie Bolger-owned distaffer, a veteran of eight black-type starts already this term, may face a cast which includes **Midday (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}), **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab) and **Misty For Me (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) for a race the trainer won with Alexander Goldrun (Ire) (Gold Away {Ire}) in 2005. "Banimpire may take her chance in the Nassau, although a final decision won't be made until early next week," Bolger said.

DANCING RAIN A YORKSHIRE OAKS POSSIBLE

Martin and Lee Taylor's G1 Epsom Oaks heroine Dancing Rain (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), who ran fifth to Blue Bunting (Dynaformer) in the G1 Irish Oaks at The Curragh Sunday, may get the chance to gain revenge on that rival in the Aug. 18 G1 Yorkshire Oaks, according to trainer William Haggas. Initially reflecting on the defeat, Haggas told *Racing Post*, "It may have been the ground, because Dancing Rain is such a fluid mover. We've beaten them before, but on the day she didn't do enough. I wasn't disappointed, though." Looking ahead, the trainer added, "She seems fine and left Ireland this morning. She has a Yorkshire Oaks entry, and we'll reflect this week before coming to a decision."

For Zenyatta's Breeder, A Grade I as Owner...

Maverick Productions' Eric Kronfeld can say he bred one of the greatest Thoroughbreds of all time in

Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}). But the native New Yorker's exploits in racing didn't begin with the supermare, and, as was proved over the weekend, didn't end with her retirement. On Saturday, Kronfeld was back in the spotlight, this time as an owner, when his 3-year-old filly **Nereid** (Rock Hard Ten) dead-heated with Cambina (Ire) (Hawk Wing) in the GI American Oaks. Trained by John Shirreffs, Nereid, a \$190,000 KEESEP yearling,

was making just the fourth start of her career and her third on turf, a surface on which she's unbeaten.

She was also giving Kronfeld his first Grade I win in 31 years. In what he called "ancient history, but factual," Kronfeld also campaigned the top filly Mrs. Penny (Great Nephew {GB}), champion 2-year-old in England in 1979, and champion 3-year-old in England and Ireland. Mrs. Penny's wins included the 1980 renewal of the G1 Prix de Diane and two other Group 1s.

Kronfeld, who celebrated his 70th birthday July 4, is a sharp-witted, straight-talking investment banker who's been involved with movie, record and TV production--hence the Maverick Productions banner-and who formerly practiced law in New York City. Business interests took him to England in the 1970s, where he bought his first Thoroughbred, and Mrs. Penny came soon after. For the next 25 years, he maintained a presence in the industry, but didn't come close to matching the success of Mrs. Penny...until he started breeding out of the Kris S. mare Vertigineux. The homebred, a winner of two of seven starts, was part of the modest-sized broodmare band that Kronfeld kept at Don Robinson's Winter Quarter Farm in Kentucky. The big mare's first foal was the stakes winner Where's Bailey (Aljabr), and her second was the top-notch Balance (Thunder Gulch), whom he sold to Amerman Racing as a yearling for \$260,000.

"Where's Bailey, as described by Don Robinson, was as ugly and ungainly an animal as ever could be," said Kronfeld. "He said to put her in a sale with no reserve, and whatever I got for her was going to be too much. I think I got \$4,000 for her. So we decided to go for a much smaller, compact sire, but where the blood still matched, and went to Thunder Gulch. And Vertigineux produced a perfectly beautiful animal in Balance."

Balance went on to win three Grade Is and earn over \$1 million, but it was her year-younger sister Zenyatta, sold as a yearling for just \$60,000 to Jerry and Ann Moss, who would change the landscape of racing. Dubbed the Queen of Racing, she won 13 Grade I races and four championships, including Horse of the Year honors in 2010.

And through it all, Kronfeld never saw her race in person. "I'm an irrevocably superstitious fool," Kronfeld laughed yesterday. "Jerry Moss is an old friend of mine-

-we go back 40-plus years in the music business--and after she won her second race, he called and said she was going to run in a stakes race. He said, 'I really think she's special. Why don't you come out?' And I said, 'Nah, if she loses for any reason, it's going to be my fault.' Forget logic or reality. He said he thought I was

wrong, and I told him I wasn't trying to defend it, but I just couldn't do it."

Over the next three seasons, pressure mounted on Kronfeld to see Zenyatta race in person, and as last year's GI Breeders' Cup Classic approached, things reached fever pitch. "By then, the Breeders' Cup itself was all over me, as was Jerry, as were a number of my friends, including Don Robinson," said Kronfeld.

As it turned out, it's probably a good thing Kronfeld didn't attend, as Zenyatta fell a heart-breaking head short in her 20th and final start. "There would have been no question it was my fault," he said of the mare's sole loss.


Zenyatta is now safely tucked away at Lane's End farm, in foal to Bernardini, and spends her time in a large paddock with buddy Tasty Temptation (Medaglia d'Oro), a MSW of over \$560,000. In a testament to her appeal, the folks at Lane's End still receive dozens of calls a week from fans looking to meet Zenyatta in person. Asked how it feels to have bred such a revered runner, Kronfeld said, "Other than the fact that it's good for my ego? It's hard to put into perspective. As a breeder, your involvement is so limited. All you literally do is say, 'I've decided to mate my mare with this stallion.' Don Robinson thought I was insane [going to Street Cry], and a lot of other people thought I was under-matching the mare, but I really thought Street Cry could be a sire. So it validated my choice. When I came back to Bernardini, I got the same chorus of grief, because it was Bernardini's second crop. But I said, 'Hey, it's my dollar, I'll take the chance. I think I'm right.' So when a horse is successful in mating you have chosen, with others not in favor of it, it verifies your own intellectual capabilities, so that much is fun."

That aforementioned Bernardini breeding produced Zenyatta's now 2-year-old half-sister Eblouissante, whom Kronfeld retained after selling Vertigineux to Coolmore interests (the mare produced Henrythenavigator fillies in 2010 and 2011). Eblouissante--A-Blue-Eh-Sant, coaches Kronfeld, meaning 'dazzling' in French--is in training with Shirreffs, and recently recorded her third official work, an easy four-furlong move in :52.30. *Cont. p4*

Why Go Anywhere Else?



Kronfeld said there are no plans for a start anytime soon. "It's way too early, but she looks magnificent," he said. "Obviously, I spent time with her at the barn on Friday and Saturday. She's an incredible physical specimen. She's Zenyatta Vol. II, except that she's a little bigger, and she doesn't have the white blaze. She's a large lady, but she's perfectly proportioned. John's taking his time, as he should. We have absolutely no target date as to when she'll run, and I don't care. When she's ready, she'll go."

Eblouissante is part of Kronfeld's resurgence in racing as an owner, and his racing stable now includes three 2-year-olds, three 3-year-olds and a pair of 4-year-olds. His ramping up, he says, actually has little to do with Zenyatta's success.

"The majority of my business had taken me to Asia six times a year, in addition to Europe and around the States, and when you do that much traveling, it's hard to be able to go see your horses race," he explained. "And I've never believed in involvement in horse racing by proxy. If you can't see them run, then what the heck's the fun in it?"

One of his 3-year-olds is, of course, Nereid, named after a sea nymph in Greek mythology. Kronfeld acquired her out of the 2009 Keeneland September sale. "Tom Goffs, who is one of the principal partners in Blandford Bloodstock, is a very good friend of mine, and we went down to Keeneland and I wanted to buy a Rock Hard Ten," explained Kronfeld. "Tom said he'd do a shortlist and see what was on the grounds. I told him I wasn't going to tell him my favorite based on pedigree, because the horse might have three legs, but I wanted to see if the horse impressed him physically and vetted as a potential athlete. And that was the filly who became Nereid."

Asked if it was the presence of Kris S. in her pedigree--the stallion is Rock Hard Ten's sire and Zenyatta's damsire, that attracted him to Nereid, Kronfeld responded, "Go back one more generation--Roberto. I think Roberto is absolutely an

underappreciated supersire. He does nothing but throw winners."

Nereid joined the Shirreffs barn in May of her 2-yearold year, and though the mild-mannered trainer wasn't


effusive, he indicated he was impressed with the filly. Nereid debuted at 6 1/2 furlongs over Hollywood Park's main track Oct. 15 and closed from last to be second to eventual MGISW Zazu (Tapit). "John told me up front we wouldn't win," said Kronfeld. "Six and a half furlongs was just not

going to be her trip. But she ran extremely well behind Zazu, and I said, 'OK, John, what next?'" *Cont. p5*

The typically cautious Shirreffs surprised him by saying he wanted to run in the GI Hollywood Starlet. "John said he thought she had Grade I ability, which is something, because John doesn't give away ice in the wintertime," said Kronfeld. "But she had a niggling little injury--she pulled a muscle in her hindquarters--so we missed the Starlet."

A case of hives over the winter set her back another two weeks, but in February, Shirreffs announced a new plan. "He said that he was going to point her to the GI Kentucky Oaks," said Kronfeld. "But then she came up with another two-week-off injury, and I thought, 'Oh well, it's going to be one of those talking horses.'"

Nereid finally made it back to the races May 7, breaking her maiden in her route and turf debut at Hollywood, then made it two straight in a grassy NW1X June 2. This time, Shirreffs's Grade I aims wouldn't be derailed. "He said he wanted to go to the American Oaks, and I said, 'OK, you're the boss.' It wasn't that I was so confident in the filly, I was confident in John. He will not run a horse in a race to stroke an owner's ego. If he doesn't think a horse can be competitive in a given race, he won't enter. The choice to go in the race was absolutely John's."

Now that Nereid is a Grade I winner--the first at the highest level for her young sire--all options are on the table. "It's early days," said Kronfeld. "She came out of

the race well. I got an email from John that said she ate up, but was a bit tired. But assuming everything goes well, I would think the GI Del Mar Oaks [Aug. 20]." A race on the same day--the 1 1/4-mile GI Alabama S. on dirt at Saratoga--is also a possible target, though Kronfeld said Shirreffs always has the final call. "I'm happy to do whatever John wants to do," he said.

"Her pedigree is now set; she's a Grade I winner, and we can do what we want. If I was going to be a pig about things, I'd say, 'John, let's go for the Alabama.' It was only her fourth race and she went a mile and a quarter, and she had to make all, which she does not want to do. But Saratoga's a particularly deep track and we'd have to ship cross country, and John might just say no."

If Nereid doesn't make the Alabama, Kronfeld can at least make plans to watch Allumeuse (Rockport Harbor) run at the Spa. Another of his 3-year-olds, the \$130,000 KEESEP yearling began her career with three unplaced efforts in France, but recently returned to the States and ran a strong second in special weight company on Kronfeld's birthday, July 4. "She got off a plane and ran in a mile maiden race on the weeds at Belmont, and tried to make all but was caught on the wire," Kronfeld said of the Christophe Clement-trained miss. *Cont. p6*

"The ground wasn't what we'd have liked it to be; Christophe sent me an email and said that if the ground was firm, she'd have galloped. So she has ability. Is she a group horse? I don't think so; but she'll win a race."

Kronfeld has two other runners with Clement. "I never believe in putting all my eggs in one basket, for two reasons: one, if there's a bug around the barn, all your horses gets sick; and two, I'm based in New York, so it's easier for me to see them run if they're here," Kronfeld explained. "So I have three with Christophe Clement here, and one with Ian Wilkes and Carl Nafzger in Kentucky."

Now with two Grade I winners as an owner and two--Balance and Zenyatta--as a breeder, Kronfeld can likely look forward to many more successful years in the business. And with Eblouissante in the barn, who knows what chapters remain unwritten? "I can guarantee you that, when she sets foot on the track, it will be the most anticipated maiden race in a long time," he said. *-Lucas Marquardt*



Each of the Group 1 races in Europe last week acted as a reminder of the excellence of former French stallion Linamix. This winner of the 1990 Poule d'Essai des Poulains was responsible for Slickly, sire of the rather unexpected G1 Grand Prix de Paris winner Meandre on Thursday. Then, three days later, the thrilling finish to the G1 Irish Oaks saw victory go to the G1 1000 Guineas winner Blue Bunting, who is out of a Linamix mare.

Linamix's fertility deserted him in his late teens and he had only one foal in 2008 and 13 in 2007. Those 13 include Rajsaman, who became no less than Linamix's 42nd group winner when he defeated the high-class Byword in the G2 Prix du Muguet in May. That total of 42 group winners is impressive enough, but all the more so when looked at as a percentage of Linamix's total output. For a sizeable part of his career he depended largely on his owner Jean-Luc Lagardere for support, and he was never overused. Equineline credits him with a total of 869 foals, so his 42 group winners equate to nearly 5% of his output. Very few stallions are able to boast such a high percentage. *Cont. p8*

Tel: 859-87 www.coolmore.com I have always thought that Linamix benefited from having a pedigree which was largely an outcross for many mares. Although a member of the Northern Dancer male line, the great Windfields stallion was back in the fifth generation of his progeny's pedigrees.

I once interviewed Lagardere's ally Eric Puerari for an article in *Thoroughbred Owner & Breeder*.

"Although Linamix wasn't everyone's idea of a top-class stallion in the making, he had a fantastic action, which he usually passes on, perfect balance and he was a fighter, with incredible heart," Puerari recalled.

"He was quite lean, not muscular, and I often think he has inherited many good genes from Mendez's broodmare sire Caro, rather than Mendez's grandsire Lyphard. Linamix is a scopey horse, with a good slope to his shoulder and a deep girth, but he doesn't have so much bone and he was rather weak in his back and loins."

When I asked Puerari what type of mare he and Lagardere were looking for when they bought potential mates for Linamix at Keeneland, he said:

"We looked for mares which were well-made, strong and muscular, which weren't too big."

This helps explain why Linamix had as many as eight group winners out of American-bred mares from the Mr. Prospector line. The best of these were the triple Group 1 winner Cherry Mix, runner-up in the 2004 Arc, and Slickly, the four-time Group 1 winner responsible for Meandre.

Slickly's broodmare sire, Conquistador Cielo, demonstrated his considerable versatility when he landed the GI Belmont S. just days after he had landed the GI Metropolitan H. over a mile. Slickly was also very versatile, although he will probably be best remembered as a highly effective front-running miler. Before being sold by Lagardere to Godolphin, he had won the G2 Prix Noailles over 1 3/8 miles and the Grand Prix de Paris in its days over a mile and a quarter. After he had recorded another two group victories at around a mile and a quarter for his new owners, Godolphin realised that he still retained plenty of speed and were rewarded with three Group 1 wins over a mile. Arguably his best performance was his three-length victory over Banks Hill in the 2001 Prix du Moulin.

Slickly is proving to be Linamix's most successful stallion son, but that isn't saying a great deal. Meandre is Slickly's third group winner and first Group 1 winner from 261 foals aged three or over. Until Meandre came along, it had looked a pretty safe bet that Linamix's main legacy was going to be through his broodmare daughters, rather than his stallion sons. The dual Classic winner Blue Bunting is one of seven European Group 1 winners with dams by Linamix, others being her fellow 1000 Guineas winner Natagora, the Poule d'Essai des Poulains winner Clodovil, the Prix d'Ispahan winners Valixir and Sageburg and the Prix Marcel Boussac heroine Rosanara. Meandre is also their second winner of the Grand Prix de Paris, following Montmartre three years ago.



Meandre, who was bred by his owners, the Rothschild family, wasn't expensive to produce, as Slickly's fee in 2007 was \$8,000. Meandre's dam Penne, who was second in a pair of middle-distance listed races, was bred by the late Baron Guy de Rothschild, who died in 2007 at the age of 98.

The Baron owned numerous important horses, such as



Exbury, Diatome, Luthier and Vieux Manoir. Meandre's broodmare sire, Sevres Rose, wasn't one of them--this son of Caerleon never made it to the races--but he descended from some of the Baron's best winners and was given his chance at stud.

Slickly harasdulogis.com Sevres Rose's dam, Indian Rose, had won the Prix Vermeille for Baron

Guy, and she was a half-sister to Le Nain Jaune, who supplied the Baron with one of his four victories in the Grand Prix de Paris during the days when it was contested over nearly two miles. Their dam Lady Berry also stayed very well, as she showed in winning the G1 Prix Royal-Oak. Sevres Rose had previously been best known as the sire of Viane Rose, a mile-and-a-quarter Group 3 winner. **Cont. p9**



Meandre's second dam Une Pensee was also bred by Baron Guy, as was her sire, the high-class French miler Kenmare. However, this is essentially a Boussac family--and a very good one at that. Meandre's fifth dam is the famous Apollonia. This astonishing Djebel mare was the top-ranked French juvenile of 1955, when she defeated the colts in both the Prix Morny and Grand Criterium, and she went on to be an easy winner of both the Poule d'Essai des Pouliches and Prix de Diane.

Apollonia's dam Corejada also became a Classic winner after a fine 2-year-old season, and she numbered the Cheveley Park S., Poule d'Essai des Pouliches and Irish Oaks among her victories. As Corejada was out of the celebrated Tourzima, Apollonia was inbred 2x3 to Tourbillon, the foundation of Boussac's success. Darshaan also came from the Tourzima female line.

Meandre is rather unusual for a modern European-bred colt, in that he has no inbreeding in the first five generations, but he has three distant lines of Nearctic, two of them via Northern Dancer.

He is also rather unusual in another respect, as it took him seven attempts to lose his maiden certificate. However, he has made considerable progress since being allowed to use his stamina over distances beyond a mile and a quarter. The very fast pace set by Seville in the Grand Prix de Paris probably played to Meandre's strengths, and it is going to be fascinating to see whether he proves capable of confirming the form with the likes of Reliable Man and Treasure Beach later in the year.

RCI COMMITTEE TO DISCUSS FUROSEMIDE

POLICY The Association of Racing Commissioners International's Drug Testing Standards and Practices Committee will hold a special meeting next week to discuss the association's policy on the raceday use of Furosemide. Proposals that the drug's use be phased out prompted an international summit last month at Belmont Park, but next week's meeting in Saratoga will provide a more open discussion. "Although the summit was helpful, there was limited opportunity for regulators to ask questions of participants," explained RCI President Ed Martin. "It was the consensus of those present that a follow-up meeting was necessary. The central question for regulators is the extent to which the removal of this medication on those days a horse actually races would pose any significant equine health risk." The committee will hear from Tom David, DVM, chair of the RCI Regulatory Veterinarian Committee and Scott Palmer, DVM, Chair of the AAEP's Racing Committee. Testimony will also be presented by N. Edward Robinson, DVM, from the Center for Integrative Toxicology at the Veterinary Medical Center at Michigan State University. "The committee is also interested in the views of horsemen's organizations as to how a transition to a new furosemide policy should be implemented if it is determined that a change is warranted," Martin added. The DTSP Committee will meet at 10 a.m. July 26 at the Holiday Inn in Saratoga Springs.
