# King George VI & Queen Elizabeth AND YOU'RE

One that has yet to score at the top level is Khalid Abdullah's Sea Moon (GB) (Beat Hollow {GB}), but he

appears more than ready to make a major impact based on his previous record. Since the Juddmonte colorbearer was so impressive when scoring by wide margins in two of this country's finest Group 2 contests in last year's Great Voltigeur and the Hardwicke at Royal Ascot last time June 23, trainer Sir Michael Stoute is carrying an air of belief, which in itself is significant. "It's a very competitive renewal, that's for sure, but he's got a shot," commented the current joint-record holder with five wins to his Racing Post photo name from 1981 to 2010. "Historically, it's been a race that's run up a lot of

champions and a lot of excitement and I love it. He's come through the Hardwicke well, and that was probably his best performance to date. I'd like to think if I can get him at the same pitch, he could be competitive off that."

The saga of St Nicholas Abbey (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) is by now well told, and while his tag as the "comeback kid" may be a touch dramatic, it is true that connections felt they had lost him for a while after a failed tilt at the 2000 Guineas in 2010. Whether the superiority of his form going left-handed to this way is down to circumstance remains to be seen, but more importantly, his most dashing displays have come on a faster surface. Twelve months ago here, he was still far from his current peak and looked disadvantaged by a moderate early tempo on similarly slow ground. In the event, he lost no ground on Nathaniel (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) from the start of the sprint in early stretch to the line and unlike then, the four-time Group 1 winner meets that rival on level weights now that the over-generous 12-pound weight-for-age allowance is not a factor. He was utterly dominant last time when taking the June 2 G1 Coronation Cup for the second consecutive year, and jockey Joseph O'Brien knows him well now. "He won well the last time and seems in good form," he said. "Hopefully the ground will dry out--it wouldn't be ideal if it was too soft--and we'll go a nice, even gallop and may the best horse win. Nathaniel seems to have improved from three to four, but so has my horse." Cont. p4

### King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. cont.

Nathaniel bids to become only the third to win back-to-back renewals of this race and the first to complete the Eclipse-King George double in the same season since Opera House (GB) (Sadler's Wells) in 1993. Such a demanding task is made even more so by the timing of this year's race, which is closer than normal to the Sandown feature due to the Olympics.

"It's only a two-week gap and I can't emphasize how tough that is for a horse," trainer John Gosden stressed. "He had a hard race at Sandown, but he has eaten well, he looks well and has been scoping great, and you need to have a go at these top races. We always felt that whatever he did last year, he was going to do better this year. It all points towards that now. As the season progresses, I think he will get better."

Germany has yet to win this race, and Gestut Burg Eberstein and Teruya Yoshida's **Danedream (Ger)** (Lomitas {GB}) also has to end a 29-year drought for the fairer sex, but the manner of her success in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp in October makes her a player. She will have to at least reproduce that effort, as her two 4-year-old efforts when winning the G2 Grosser Preis der Badischen Unternehmer at Baden-Baden May 20 and when last of four in the June 24 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud will not suffice here. However, trainer Peter Schiergen is willing to forgive the latest run.

"There weren't many runners and it was a slow pace, so she didn't like that and can do better," he offered. "She has won on good ground, on soft and heavy, so that's not a problem and I'm hoping that she is placed."

Japan have tried four times here to no avail and Sunday Racing's consistent Deep Brillante has the substantial weight-for-age advantage in his favor. While his May 27 G1 Tokyo Yushun heroics came on firm ground, the owners' Racing Manager Keita Tanaka is not expecting this easy surface to pose a major issue.

"He won the G3 Hai Nisai S. in November last year on very heavy ground and the Japanese Derby in the fastest time in the race's history, so he can handle both, and conditions don't really matter to him," Tanaka said of the colt, who lost no weight on his travels earlier this month. "He is nice and fit and relaxed, having had a very good time in Newmarket. The Japanese 3-year-olds are quite competitive and he is one of the best ones among them, so it will be interesting to see how he gets on against these horses."

### SEVEN FACE THE OAKS TEST

Testing conditions similar to those witnessed on The Curragh's Derby card will be the order of the day again tomorrow, where the Kildare venue plays host to the G1 Darley Irish Oaks. Just seven fillies take part, which is the smallest field since Alexandrova (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) recorded the first of a trio of wins for Aidan O'Brien in 2006 and like that performer, Was (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) will bid to become the latest to complete the Epsom-Curragh Classic double. Ballydoyle put forward the blinkered Twirl (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and outsider **Devotion (Ire)** (Dylan Thomas {Ire}) to aid the cause of their stable companion in becoming the 14th to follow up Epsom glory here. Of the last 20 winners of this race, 13 had run at Epsom, so the portents are strong, but jockey Joseph O'Brien is hoping the conditions do not prove the undoing of his mount. "The ground might not be ideal, but it's the Oaks, so we'll take our chance and see what happens," he said. "She's still a lightly raced filly, and hopefully she'll run a good race."

The form of the June 1 Oaks is also represented by the runner-up Shirocco Star (GB) (Shirocco {Ger}) who carries the colors of Helena Springfield--which is the ownership title of Meon Valley Stud homebreds--worn by the high-class racemare and producer Colorspin (Fr) (High Top {Ire}) when she won this in 1986. Beaten just a neck by Was there, Shirocco Star finished six-lengths third behind Princess Highway (Street Cry) in Royal Ascot's G2 Ribblesdale S. 20 days later, but may have suffered from over-aggressive tactics on that occasion. "She seems fine, and it's quite rightly a very competitive race," trainer Hughie Morrison told PA Sport. "We've been beaten by a couple of them before, so we know it's going to be difficult, but she's been second in one Oaks and we wanted to have a go at another. We don't know how she'll handle conditions. She might hate it and if she does, we'll have learned our lesson."

Trainer Todd Pletcher gave In Lingerie plenty of time to recover from her mishap at the start of the Black-Eyed Susan. "She kind of grabbed herself when she left the gate, and we just needed to make sure that healed up properly," said Pletcher. Questing steps up following an optional-claiming score at Belmont June 24. The Godolphin colorbearer earned a 105 Beyer Speed Figure that day in what was only her second start on dirt; in her lone other such appearance, she was fifth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. She obviously ran huge on the dirt...for us the other day, so we're entering," said trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "It's a big step up from an allowance to a Grade I. It looks like a short, quality field. It'd be great if we could hit the board. She's a very nice filly." The filly that was second at 3-5 to Questing, Book Review (Giant's Causeway), came back to take the fourth race on Saratoga's opening day card.







The Fleur de Lis was the first win of 2012 for Royal Delta, who capped her Eclipse Award-winning campaign with a comprehensive score in the 2011 Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic. Prior to her troubled trip in the G1 Dubai World Cup at Meydan Mar. 31, the \$8.5-million KEENOV topper spotted **Awesome Maria** (Maria's Mon) an insurmountable advantage in the GIII Sabin S. at Gulfstream Feb. 25.

That grey added a 1-10 victory in the GIII Rampart H. at the same track Mar. 31, but faltered as the 3-5 chalk in the GI Ogden Phipps H. at Belmont on Memorial Day. "She gives me the impression she's at the top of her game," trainer Todd Pletcher told *Daily Racing Form*. "It's still a tough challenge, but she's doing well."

The lightly raced **Cash for Clunkers** (Tiznow) did her best to wire the Ogden Phipps, ultimately settling for

second by 3/4 of a length to It's Tricky (Mineshaft). Trainer Rick Violette Jr. is eager to see how his charge fits this spot. "Pedigreewise, she is supposed to be able to get a mile and a quarter, it is a great race and I am dying to try it," said Violette. "She is training very very well, so we are looking forward to the race.

"Cash for Clunkers does not have to be on the lead," the popular horseman added. "She is kind of a free-galloping filly, but if somebody wants to go faster than us early, that is fine. We can let them go or we can lead the way as well. But I think the mile-and-a-quarter around two turns is a better race for her. I think this race is very, very much within her scope."

### READY FOR ACCLAMATION

Acclamation (Unusual Heat) will make his second start of the year in today's GI Eddie Read at Del Mar. The 2011 Eclipse Award winner romped home in last year's rendition of the contest and looks to win similarly today. In his last outing, the GI Charles Whittingham H. at Hollywood June 9, the bay went wire-to-wire, with Slim Shadey (GB) (Val Royal {Fr}) finishing second. "He scared a bunch of 'em off. Small field? It is what it is, I can't do anything about that," said Acclamation's trainer Donald Warren. "Sometimes races with small fields can get messed up. There can be an unrealistic pace or somebody does something crazy to make you have to change your plan. It always looks easier when there only four or five horses in a race, but it isn't. I'd just as soon run against an eight- or nine-horse field." Slim Shadey may regress here, coming off a poor performance in the GI United Nations S. at Monmouth just two weeks ago. Casino Host (Dynaformer), previously trained by Chad Brown, started the season with wins in a Gulfstream allowance Feb. 4 and the GII Mervin Muniz Memorial H. at the Fair Grounds Apr. 1 followed by a fourth in the GII Dixie S. at Pimlico May 19. Making his first start for trainer Ron Ellis and coming off a difficult trip in the Colonial Turf Cup last time out June 16, he looks to be an interesting prospect, and may improve greatly here.

His most recent effort was a wire-to-wire 6 3/4-length win in the June 13 Oliver S. at Indiana Downs, and his patented front-running style could suit him well in a field that lacks any other distinguished speed horses. He steps up to 1 1/4 miles for the first time. Team Valor International's Lucky Chappy (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) makes his first start since an unplaced effort in the Mar. 31 G2 UAE Derby in Dubai. The Graham Motion charge prepped for that effort with narrow loses in the Kitten's Joy S. Jan. 21 and the GIII El Camino Real Derby Feb. 18. Lucky Chappy is winless in America, but owns two victories in Italy as a 2-year-old.

Christophe Clement's **Easy Crossing** (English Channel) won over 1 1/8 miles on the Gulfstream Park turf on Mar. 31, and his pedigree suggests he should relish the added distance. The only horse in the field to have raced over this distance on the turf is 30-1 shot **Coach Royal** (Lemon Drop Kid), who broke his maiden in those conditions on June 27. Although it took the John Terranova charge 12 starts to break his maiden, he has been very consistent this year, and could be an interesting play at long odds.

### MAKING THE GRADE

Today's GIII Virginia Oaks features a field of seven 3-year-old fillies who are all looking for their first stakes win. William Punk and Philip Dileo's Zultanite (El Corredor) is the 6-5 morning-line favorite on the merit of two recent near misses in graded company. The David Donk charge finished third, beaten a neck, in the May 28 GII Sands Point S. at Belmont, and followed that effort with a second-place finish, beaten 1 1/2 lengths, in Monmouth Park's GIII Boiling Springs S. June 23. Donk had considered next week's GII Lake George S. at Saratoga a possible target for Zultanite, but opted for this spot instead. "I've really been pleased with her progress this summer," Donk told Daily Racing Form. "She's an improving filly, real scopey, a two-turn horse for sure. We could've gone in the Lake George, but this came up a good spot for us since obviously she'll be one of the choices. We'd love to get a graded victory for her." The Kenny McPeek-trained Volcat (After Market) also warrants respect coming off a sharp allowance score over this distance on the Churchill Downs turf June 22. She went wire-to-wire on that occasion, and could benefit from a similar trip in a field that lacks a clear pacesetter. Graham Motion brings the lightly raced George Strawbridge homebred Ski Holiday (Harlan's Holiday), who showed improvement in her most recent start to break her maiden over the Parx turf.

### THE MILE MISSION

Today's G2 Summer Mile at Ascot takes on extra significance with the presence of The Queen's Carlton House (Street Cry {Ire}), who tries this trip after just missing out on the limelight over middle distances so far. His form at 10 furlongs is rock-solid, with wins in last year's G2 Dante S. at York and the G3 Brigadier Gerard S. at Sandown on his 4-year-old return preceding a second to So You Think (NZ) (High Chaparral (Ire) in the June 20 G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot. With Frankel (GB) (Galileo (Ire)) set to step up to that trip after Glorious Goodwood, the way is open for a new force in this category, and The Queen's Racing Manager John Warren is aware of the possibilities. "Ryan Moore is very optimistic this mile will suit him very well, and both he and Sir Michael Stoute have always felt this horse has tremendous speed, so it's very exciting if he can be brought back to a mile--it would open up a few more avenues for him," he explained. "We're still on a learning mission, and anything between a mile to a mile and a quarter is obviously going to suit well, so there would be some nice things to look forward to if he was a genuine miler. There is the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois [at Deauville Aug. 12], then the [Sept. 16] G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp and the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. [at Ascot Oct. 20], so he's got lots of options open to him. In his two races so far this year, he has been somewhat free-going, and the pace over a mile will suit him all the better to help him settle into that rhythm. When he won his maiden by half the track at Newbury as a two-year-old, that was on very soft ground so we're not particularly bothered about the ground." If the experiment fails, then one who could capitalise is Kennet Valley Thoroughbreds' fast-improver Tullius (Ire) (Le Vie dei Colori {GB}). He comes into this on the back of wins in the May 14 Listed Royal Windsor S. and Listed Ganton S. at York June 16.

Pacific Ocean began his career on the Polytracks of the Midwest for owners Gary and Mary West and trainer Wayne Catalano. After capturing his first three starts last spring, the chestnut was second in the GIII Hanshin Cup, and was benched following a seventh in the Bold Venture S. at Woodbine 12 months ago. He resurfaced Nov. 26 for Dennis Narlinger's JMJ Racing Stable and trainer Mike Mitchell in the GIII Vernon O. Underwood H. at Hollywood Park and responded with a rousing win that earned him a 108 Beyer Speed Figure. However, Pacific Ocean soon found himself eastward bound and was ensconced in Rick Dutrow's shedrow. After setting a torrid pace in the GII True North H. at Belmont June 9, he tired to finish sixth, but things were much more to his liking this time. The 5-year-old got away with a:23.19 opening quarter, which spelled doom for late-running chalk Jackson Bend (Hear No Evil). Crossbow came up the head Pacific Ocean approaching the stretch, but the gelding responded gamely and forged clear under a hand ride. "In his last race, he had a bad post, there was a lot of speed, he was in a bad spot," said winning trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. "Today was different. He had everything going his way. He was sitting on a race. He ran big." Dutrow added, "He's not the easiest horse in the world to handle." As for Jackson Bend, trainer Nick Zito was philosophical. "We couldn't get the trip. Rosie was trying to get inside, but couldn't get there. That's what he wants to do--run inside. It's frustrating because he was running in the end."

### Union Rags Retired (cont. from p1)

When reached by telephone Friday afternoon, trainer Michael Matz indicated that he had been aware that discussions were in the works, but that he had not yet been informed of the colt's retirement.

Bred by Wyeth from a female family developed by her parents' Hickory Tree Farm, Union Rags sold as a yearling for \$145,000 at FTSAUG to IEAH Stables. That operation sent him to Eddie Woods, who prepared him for the Fasig-Tipton Florida Sale in March 2011. Wyeth apparently had seller's remorse, and stepped up to reacquire him for \$390,000.

Union Rags was an impressive debut winner at Delaware last July, and confirmed those expectations with eye-catching victories in the GI Champagne S. and GII Saratoga Special S. He missed out on championship honors by a head in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile.

After drawing off in the GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 26, the blaze-faced bay was a troubled third in the GI Florida Derby, and encountered many woes on his way to finishing seventh in the GI Kentucky Derby. However, he lived up to his early potential by rallying up the rail in the GI Belmont S. June 9 in what would be his career finale.

Union Rags heads to the breeding shed with a record of 8-5-1-1 and earnings of \$1,798,000. His granddam was the good grass mare Terpsichorist (Nijinsky II), winner of three graded events, and he hails from the family of 1993 Belmont S. hero Colonial Affair (Pleasant Colony).

### ASIAN RACING CONFERENCE: DAY 3 By Michele MacDonald

Pari-mutuel totalizator specialists from around the world have been urged to form a global association to work in tandem with racing organizations to speed widespread commingling of wagering on the sport.

"The common pool is a vital issue for the development of racing around the world," said Louis Romanet, chairman of the International Federation of



Horseracing Authorities, during a closing session of the 34<sup>th</sup> Asian Racing Conference in Istanbul, Turkey, on July 34h ASIAN RACING CONFERENCE 20. "We need to study how we can get together and make the best offer to the punter,"

Romanet added, noting that large betting pools encourage more wagering and higher returns to both bettors and racing organizations.

A specific strategy is expected to be announced during the October meeting of the IFHA in Paris after preliminary efforts are led by IFHA Vice Chairmen; Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges, Hong Kong Jockey Club chief executive officer; Brian Kavanagh, Horse Racing Ireland chief executive, and James Gagliano, Jockey Club chief executive.

The HKJC and France's Pari-Mutuel Urbain are expected to spearhead formation of the new group and

subsequent efforts, said Romanet, since both organizations are "well advanced" in commingling technology and execution.

While Hong Kong tax rates currently preclude commingling on a wide scale, the HKJC is working with the government to revise the law and could be ready to begin full common pooling with major international racing organizations in September 2013, said Bill Nader, HKJC executive director,

Hong Kong racing features the world's largest pools, with about US\$14 million wagered per race, as well as average field size of 12.7 runners per race, making for an extremely attractive wagering product. If those pools open to other associations, turnover will multiply for all.

"We're making progress," Nader said. "The walls are coming down all over the world."

In addition to the Hong Kong and French organizations, representatives of the remaining three racing nations that join with those two in generating approximately two-thirds of worldwide turnover on racing also will be involved in the new efforts—the United States, Australia and Japan-Romanet said. He indicated that all three tote companies that operate in the U.S. could be involved.

Japan is the world's largest source of pari-mutuel wagering, with an annual total of about \$31.2 billion,

Romanet said, or about 28% of the global total. Restrictive Japanese laws will not allow that market to open for common pools in the near future.

The move for international unification of the betting and racing sectors to address commingling followed earlier calls for a global marketing effort for racing and for global alliances of major racing jurisdictions, as well as for the U.S. to join the rest of the world in barring raceday medication use.

To make betting on racing easier and more attractive to a worldwide audience, no matter where the racing is being conducted, there must be more harmonization of rules and procedures, Romanet said.

"The more we distribute our races around the world, the more important harmonization is," he stressed. The Jockey Club of Turkey passed the official Asian Racing Federation flag to Hong Kong Jockey Club executives during elaborate closing ceremonies of the 34th Asian Racing Conference at the fabled Ciragan Palace in Istanbul, Turkey, on July 20.

### Conference Closes...

On a night featuring Turkish musicians and dancers performing at the palace steps overlooking the Bosphorus and the bridge that links Europe and Asia, conference attendees celebrated what federation Chairman Dr. Koji Sato of Japan described as the generation of many ideas for racing's future around the world.

"I believe this conference has been really successful," declared Jockey Club of Turkey President Omer Girgin before participating in the passing of the flag. Hong Kong will host the 35th Asian Racing Conference in May 2014.

"All of us from Hong Kong are extremely honored to accept the Asian Racing Federation flag," said HKJC Chairman Brian Stevenson. "This is a very valuable forum. Most aptly, it provides a platform from which we can take Asian racing to the rest of the world."

The strength of the 22 members of the Asian Racing Federation is reflected by the fact that those jurisdictions, led by Japan and Hong Kong, account for about 60% of total world wagering on horse racing.

About 1,000 delegates from 38 countries attended the Asian Racing Conference in Turkey, with a highlight being the closing ceremonies at the Ciragan Palace, built in the mid 1860s by Sultan Abdulaziz at a cost aid to be four million gold coins.

While major racing nations took much of the spotlight during the Asian Racing Conference, other countries also had a chance to update the world on their progress.

Turkey, which hosted the conference in Istanbul, delivered a variety of statistics, all of which showed that racing and wagering there are robust despite the global economic crisis and the country's very high tax rate on bets. Turkey has risen to be the eighth largest nation in the world by pari-mutuel revenues, according to data compiled from the 2010 season, ranking ahead of the United Kingdom and behind only Japan, France, the United States, Hong Kong, Australia, Italy and Sweden.

The number of registered foals in Turkey grew by

41.1% over the last eight years to 2,690 in 2011, said Erdal Sumaytaoglu, deputy undersecretary of Turkey's Ministry of Food, Agriculture and Livestock, which oversees racing and breeding of Thoroughbred and purebred Arabian racehorses. Since 2002, the number of

race days has grown by more than 50% to 568 scheduled for this year, and prizemoney is up 80%.

Conference attendees also learned from other reports that:

- -- Racing in India is challenged by differing laws and regulations by region and some very high tax rates, said Vivek Jain, chairman of the Royal Western India Turf Club, which conducts racing in Mumbai and Pune. "There are many positives, but for every positive I would say there are two negatives," he reported, adding that the levels of prizemoney are "woefully short," limiting racehorse ownership to the very rich.
- -- Organized racing in Mongolia could begin within the next year, according to Guy Sargent, vice chairman of the Asian Racing Federation, who has been working to help develop the sport in that country. A grandstand is currently under construction at a track near the capital city of Ulan Bator and the plan is for a race to be held at that track in September, he said.
- -- Indonesia is seeking investors to help build an infrastructure for racing in that country, said Frits Mantiri, chairman of the Indonesian Thoroughbred Association. With a population of more than 248 million, Indonesia could become a large market for racing and wagering, he said.
- -- Officials in Macau are seeking more simulcast products while also requesting that other jurisdictions take their racing for simulcasting, said Thomas Li, executive director of the Macau Jockey Club.

"Our vision is to be the hub of simulcasting," he related, adding that the MJC faces stiff competition from the region's relatively new casino business, which has quickly grown to be five times larger than Las Vegas.

# RACETRACK ROUND-UP

### **Summer Front Skipping Virginia Derby**

Waterford Stable's Summer Front (War Front) has been scratched from today's GII Virginia Derby at Colonial Downs and will instead run in tomorrow's \$100,000 Duluth S. over a mile on the turf at Saratoga. trainer Christophe Clement confirmed. Clement cited forecasted thunderstorms in New Kent, Virginia, as a deciding factor for keeping Summer Front in New York. "The combination of stretching him [from one mile to 1 1/4 miles] and the weather was slightly overwhelming," said Clement. "The owner wanted to make a decision yesterday about what place to go. We decided to send the horse to Saratoga [from Belmont] in order to run him here Sunday." Summer Front is coming off a win in the June 16 GIII Hill Prince S. at Belmont. "If he runs well [on Sunday], we'll have some other races where he could run this summer," said Clement.

### Born to Whip It Up

Christopher Tsui's G1 Irish Derby runner-up Born To Sea (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) will make his next start in the 10-furlong G2 Royal Whip S. at The Curragh Aug. 12, according to trainer John Oxx. Off the board in the G1 2000 and G1 Irish 2000 Guineas, the regally bred O "TDN Rising Star" O ran fourth in the June 19 G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot before giving Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) a fright back at The Curragh last time. "Born To Sea is improving every time he goes out," Oxx told PA Sport. "He's running a better race, and we just have to fiddle around and find the right distance. We'll run him next over a mile and a quarter in the Royal Whip at the Curragh." Stablemate Akeed Mofeed (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), who ran fourth in the Irish Derby on seasonal return June 30, will likely point to the one-mile Listed Platinum S. at Cork one week earlier. "Akeed Mofeed is in good shape," the trainer added. "The [Irish] Derby didn't tell us much because he blew up, as we thought he might do, but at least he had a race and we got him back on the track. He ran well and we'll probably run him in the [Aug. 5] Platinum S. at Cork."

This wasn't my favorite Saratoga opening Saturday card, to be honest. I didn't have many strong opinions, so I'll fall back on a stats-based play--Holden On seems to offer a positive expectation based on both trainer and pedigree data. While conditioner Chad Brown has been in a bit of a slump with his first timers recently (one for his last 24 according to DRF Formulator), he has excellent numbers with his 2-year-old newcomers at the Spa. Brown has won at an exceptional 30% (11-for-37) clip with a gaudy \$3.56 ROI since 2009 with juvenile firsters here. Holden On's sire Dehere, champion juvenile way back in 1993, is perhaps the best debut broodmare sire on the planet and a very solid debut sire as well. His debut ROI has been over \$2.50 with recent North American crops, and his numbers were even better before he was exported to Japan in the early 2000s. Holden On was a \$62,000 OBSAUG yearling to \$165,000 OBSMAR 2-year-old pinhook for Becky Thomas's Sequel Bloodstock after working an eighth in a solid-enough :10 1/5. Play: \$20 Win. Gets an advantageous inside draw with not too much early speed entered, and also receives a major rider upgrade from seven-pound apprentice Wilmer Garcia to Edgar Prado.
