

NYRA BOARD MULLS WAYS TO LURE 'PHAROAH' By T.D. Thornton

With the only business voted upon at Wednesday's New York Racing Association Reorganization Board of Directors meeting being rubber-stamp unanimous approvals certifying the slate of NYRA officers and the roster of peace officers, the talk among board members touched on topics related to bolstering big days on the circuit and whether or not Triple Crown winner American Pharoah (Pioneerof the Nile) could be incentivized to compete in the GI Travers S. at Saratoga Race Course.

"We are trying our best," said NYRA chief executive officer and president Chris Kay. "I think it was a total of

conversations to try to make it happen. It's a very complicated and competitive landscape at the moment."

"We talked about the

GII Jim Dandy S., but the Travers looks like the one that is the greatest interest to them, as well as the GI Haskell [Invitational S. at Monmouth Park]," Kay said. "So those two would fit in nicely...We are working diligently on that."

NYRA ex-officio member Rick Violette Jr., who separately serves as the president of the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, said that in terms of dangling more cash to American Pharoah's connections, he recognizes that NYRA is "limited by some of the things we can't do that private racetracks can do."

But Violette said he has already floated the idea to NYRA Senior Vice President of Racing Operations Martin Panza about raising the purse of the Aug. 29 Travers from \$1.25 million to \$2 million.

Violette said he believed the horsemen would be "willing to bump it up...with the caveat that [the \$750,000 Travers overpayment] gets paid right back to purses [based on an immediate handle revenue reconciliation]. And then after that \$750,000, we're back to the same splits. Because [the horsemen] can't take all the risk."

"It's interesting mathematics," Violette continued. "I'm sure we could work around it. But everybody has to have some skin in the game if we're going to bump this up." Cont. p3

NYRA Board Mulls Ways to Lure 'Pharoah' cont. from p1

Separate from the Travers conversation, Kay spoke at length about what he termed as NYRA's successful implementation of turning big race days like the GI Belmont S. into "must-see" events.

But NYRA special advisor John Hendrickson cautioned that the stacking of so many of the racing association's resources on single, big-event days could have the unintended consequence of watering down an entire race meet like Saratoga.

"I think it's fantastic. I think they're great," Hendrickson said of the "must-see" days.

"But we have to remember that [at] Saratoga, every day [used to be] a must-see day. So I hope we're not diluting the rest of the calendar as we're going forward."

In ongoing backstretch upgrades, Kay reported that NYRA is in the midst of a four-year, \$28.8 million dormitory upgrade project at NYRA properties that will be completed by 2017.

NYRA board member Michael Dubb said he knows a \$28 million-plus investment sounds like a big commitment, but he implored the board to expedite the backstretch improvements and to do even more for NYRA's hands-on horse workers.

"Doing five [dormitory] cottages at Saratoga sounds like a lot, but there's hundreds of cottages at Saratoga, and the conditions are not good," Dubb said. "The people on the backside deserve better."

In personnel moves on the NYRA board, Wednesday's meeting was the first chaired by Michael Del Giudice, who was appointed to replace Anthony Bonomo earlier this month. Bonomo took a leave of absence just before the Belmont S. after his company was revealed to have allegedly provided a "no-show" job to the son of the former New York State senate majority leader.

In addition, Andrew Rosen, a longtime New York-based horse owner, was chosen to fill the spot vacated by the April resignation of Charles Wait. The NYRA board is still awaiting an appointee to fill the spot vacated by Barry Ostrager, who also recently resigned.



Op/ed by Bill Casner



I first walked on the backside of Sunland Park Racetrack when I was 15 years old in 1963 and fell under the spell of horse racing. My dream was to be a racehorse trainer. For the next 16 years, the racetrack was my only vocation. I would go to tracks all over the country, live in tack rooms, gallop horses in the morning

and get jobs in the afternoon. I worked as an assistant trainer, assistant starter, made charts for the DRF, and drove a tractor on the track maintenance crew. I could live cheap, save my money and only took enough time away from it to get my college degree. I worked for a variety of trainers both big and small. I trained my first winner when I was 18 and spent the last six years training a small stable of horses through the Midwest. I met my wife when she was a mutuel clerk at a track in Nebraska. She cleaned thousands of stalls, walked many hots and nursed our babies in the tack room between sets. I was entrenched in the unique world of the backside--I was a racetracker and I have seen the good, bad and the ugly. I was at the zenith of our game witnessing huge crowds during mid-week and I watched many of the greats run--Secretariat, Buckpasser, and Dr. Fager. I also saw horses hopped, ringers, races fixed, and slow horses put down for insurance. I once saw a trainer boldly hang a needle in his horse in the saddling paddock.

We have overcome many of our sins on the road to redemption. I may be naive, but I believe that the days are over for ringers, insurance fraud, and for the most part, race fixing. But performance-enhancing drugs are the one sin that remains and the level of its sophistication has grown exponentially. In an earlier time, drugs like etorphine (elephant juice), fentanyl (Sublimaze), Ritalin, apomorhine, amphetamine, nitroglycerin, acepromazine, and cobra venom were used until a test was developed for them. They were all produced and manufactured by pharmaceutical companies and were on the radar. In the mid 70's, I trained at Oaklawn Park and watched Dan Lasater win race after race on his way to national championships and three Eclipse Awards. I have heard that Sublimaze is the drug he was rumored to have been using. He was later convicted and served time for distribution of cocaine. We can name other Eclipse Award-winning owners (and nominees) who have "likely" benefitted from PED's with huge win percentages, only to have their trainers subsequently fall off the map.

Times change, but people don't. The trainer's mentality is that if it is not on the illegal list and won't test, it is okay to use. Today, the selection and availability of designer drugs produced in clandestine labs is unlimited. Computer models have given the underground chemist the ability to modify a known drug, whether anabolic, narcotic or stimulant, tweaking the molecule and making small doses even more powerful, and guess what--it doesn't test because it hasn't been identified and there is no organized effort to develop the test.

Balco THG, and dermomorphin (frog juice) are known examples. The only reason they were caught was that someone turned in syringes with residue. I did a search on some drug blogs and found you could order frog juice off the net back in 2004. Currently, there is a multitude of stimulants based on synthetic cathionoes that are 10 times more powerful than cocaine. You can bet your last dollar that they are being used somewhere because there are NO TESTS for them.

One drug that has decades of continuous use is EPO. There is no doubt that it has been used at the highest level. There has never been a horse to test positive for it post-race because everyone knows that it can only be detected in the first 24 to 36 hours after administration (requiring a sophisticated expensive test) and it is always given days or even weeks out. The only way it will ever be caught is with Out-of-Competition Testing, which is virtually non-existent in North American horse racing.

The American Thoroughbred industry is at the proverbial crossroads. The choice is ours: which direction will we choose? One path maintains the status quo with 38 dysfunctional jurisdictions that are underfunded, politically appointed, and lack the expertise to challenge the cheaters. The other road offers the choice of appointing a USADA-type organization having the mission, funding and expertise to meet that challenge. The pending House bill that will be introduced by Rep. Paul Tonko (NY) offers the opportunity to have that ultimate drug organization. *Cont. p5*

There will certainly be those that fear and oppose this path. For those that cite philosophical opposition (and I was one of them at one time) to any Federal involvement in our business--they already are. The Feds have granted us a monopoly on interstate gambling with the Interstate Horse Racing Act. Another example: race-fixing in the 60's and 70's nearly destroyed our industry until the Feds started prosecuting jockeys and trainers under the RICO laws. Without Federal help, we would have lost our industry.

Without having a central professional organization that is dedicated to creating gold standards for testing with the authority to conduct out-of-competition testing and administer punishment, we will continue to have those trainers who will seek an edge and we will continue our slide into irrelevance. Whether we want to accept it or not, the public views horse racing as druginfested with impotent testing.

Are we fed up enough? Are we brave enough to take that leap towards full redemption? God, I can only hope so.

We'll get him home and give him a thorough check over, run a few more tests. He's won a Breeders' Cup so we

know he's not just an early 2-year-old, we'll give him time and figure out a plan." Telescope was also favorite to win the G2 Hardwicke S. for the second year in a row but dropped out tamely to be a well beaten sixth to stablemate **Snow Sky (GB)** (Nayef). Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's Harry Herbert is willing to chalk down the performance as a once off and said, "Telescope is absolutely fine," he said. "The fast ground combined with the slow tempo was not for him. He ran the worst race of his life which was incredibly disappointing but both Ryan Moore and Sir Michael Stoute have said we have just got to put a line through it." Telescope could still be in the mix for the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. next month or possibly the G2 Prince Of Wales's S. at Newmarket July 9.

surprisingly a trip to Flemington is being strongly considered with his highly progressive stablemate. Before that though Dunlop is eyeing another valuable prize closer to home. "We are considering the G2 Goodwood Cup. It's a very valuable race. Of course, he'll have a penalty and discussions amongst the partnership are very much involved about going to the Melbourne Cup," reported Dunlop. The Newmarket trainer added, "He's not a flamboyant worker, but the difference is he has a turn of foot. As you saw in the Ascot Gold Cup he really quickened up the straight. He's won at a mile and a half so he's not that slow. He's also got a wonderful temperament which would stand him in great stead for a long journey to Australia."

The result of next month's G1 Darley July Cup at Newmarket can often have a bearing on who is crowned champion European sprinter, and at this stage, 30 horses stand their ground for the July Course showpiece, including impressive G1 Commonwealth



Cup winner **Muhaarar (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}). His Ascot win would suggest he is probably the best 3-year-old sprinter in Europe at the moment and his trainer Charlie Hills is very much looking forward to the next test July 11 which will see him taking on his elders for the first time.

"Muhaarar lost very little weight after the Commonwealth Cup, no more than five kilos, and hasn't left an oat since, so the plan is for him to run in the July




GREAT SOUTHERN SALE CONCLUDES

The four-day Inglis Great Southern Sale came to a conclusion on Wednesday and in fact rounded off an excellent season of Inglis' sales in 2015, where 3500 Thoroughbreds were sold at an outstanding overall clearance of 84%. Inglis National Bloodstock Diector Jonathan D'Arcy paid tribute to their clients who contributed to a successful year saying, "The team at Inglis is delighted that we could achieve such fantastic results for our vendors, and we would like to thank them for the opportunity to sell numerous yearlings, weanlings, broodmares and racing stock this sales season." Wednesdays final session was devoted to vearlings, unbroken stock and racehorses and at the close of play 597 horses had been sold through the Oaklands ring since Sunday, grossing A\$8,535,300, a 72% increase on last year's figure.

"It was very satisfying to finish the sales season on such a buoyant note," said Inglis Victorian Director Peter Heagney, before adding, "From the weanlings and broodmares right through to the racing stock, there was good competition and the sale finished with excellent results in all sections.
